FOREWORD

1

This edition of the College Register has been printed to mark the 175th anniversary of the 7 October 1844 Colonial Government Land Grant for the purpose of the foundation of the Wesleyan Native Institution, the first Wesleyan / Methodist educational establishment in Aotearoa / New Zealand. This edition records the subsequent journey to new locations, with various name changes, to the current Paerata Wesley College location. For part of this journey the College was the central secondary school to which a number of Wesleyan / Methodist primary schools contributed. The Methodist Charitable and Education Trusts Act 1911 drew all the educational properties and endowments under the one entity, the Wesley College Trust Board. This consolidation allowed for the purchase of the Paerata property and the 1922 relocation to the current site. The terms of the 1911 Act set in place the first markers for the development of the Special Character Clause which was required at the time the College became an Integrated School in 1976: the first to take up the offer made by the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975, becoming a model on which further private schools have subsequently integrated into the State Education system. The emerging residential subdivision Paerata Rise on the former farm brings with it thoughts of relocating the College from its current site. At that point a new chapter in this continuing story will be begin.

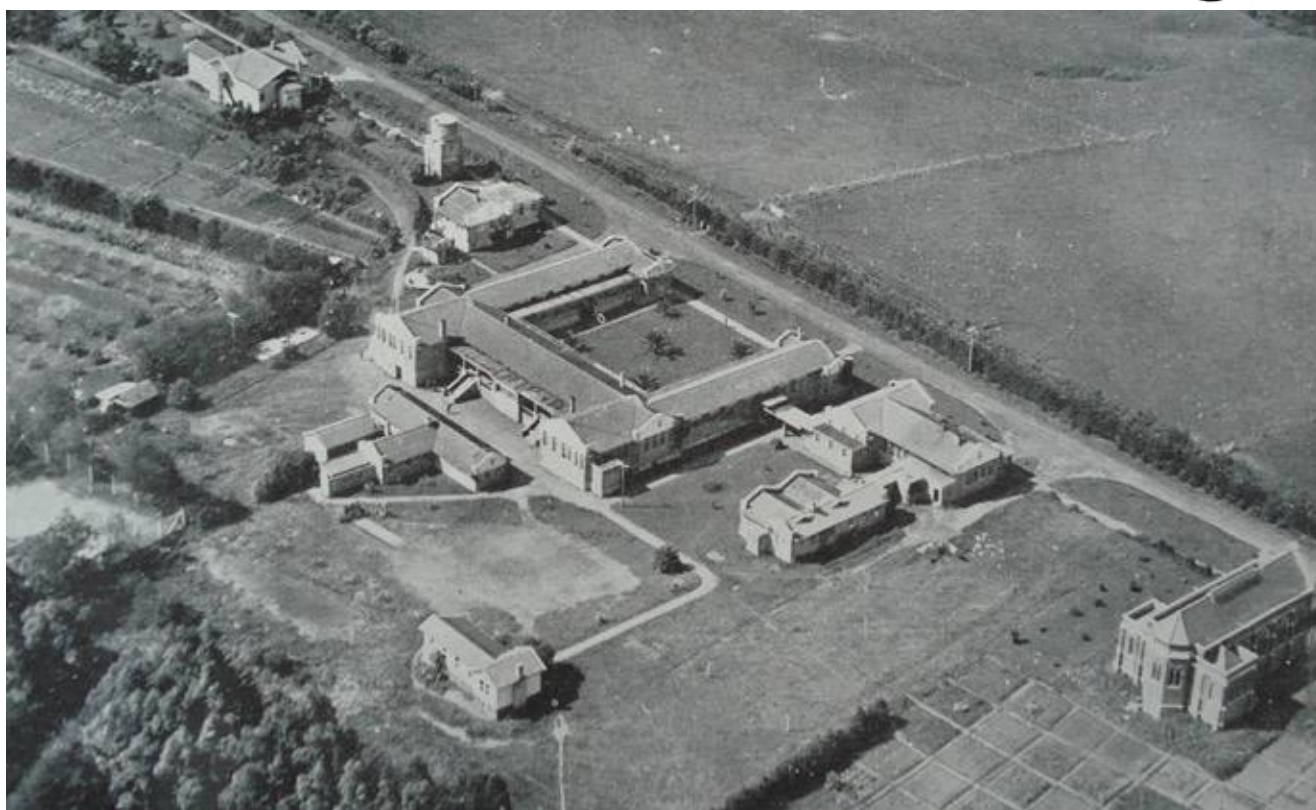
This 3rd printed edition is based on the February 1974 edition, edited by retired teacher H.A.H. Insull, and the August 1994 edition, edited by Principal John McDougall, the information in which has been supplemented from May 2016 by an electronic version, facilitated by Trust Board General-Secretary Chris Johnston, that was placed on the Internet. Much of the early historical section draws on Church Historian and Trust Board member Rev Eric Hames' work 'Wesley College, a Centenary Survey, 1844 – 1944.' The Annual Collegian is the source of much of the commentary after 1925, and therefore reflects the writing styles of a number of contributors as these sections have been compiled.

The story of the Wesley College Preparatory School was given scant mention in the first two editions. This edition contains the recollections of two Prep School pupils who finished their secondary schooling at Paerata, and a register of those who attended there from 1941 – 1951. This is a significant chapter in a larger story.

The preparation of this edition has identified a number of factual errors and misspelling of names. Where these are known, corrections have been made. It has also become evident that the names by which some pupils were formally known changed during their College years. Where deemed appropriate both names have been noted. While every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this edition, it will contain errors and omissions. Readers are invited to advise errors and propose additions and clarifications. A continuing online Register will be updated from time to time as the story of the sole remaining Wesleyan / Methodist school evolves. It is a matter of pride that based on an 1844 foundation date the College is able to lay claim to being the oldest secondary school in New Zealand.

The Special Character Clause 2010

THE parties [the Crown and the Wesley College Trust Board] hereto accept and agree that Wesley College was originally established to provide education with a special character and that at the date hereof it provides education with the special character described in this clause. Wesley College is a multi-ethnic school that has a direct affiliation with the Methodist Church of New Zealand – Te Haahi Weteriana o Aotearoa. The Methodist Church of New Zealand – Te Haahi Weteriana o Aotearoa is a Treaty-based Church that expresses its governance in a bi-cultural, power-sharing partnership between Te Taha Maori and Taiwi.

This has historical and contemporary relevance that is expressed within the College as:

- Treasuring our Christian and Methodist heritage and learning to express it relevantly. This includes religious observances.
- Openness to the future and to new insights, experiences and people.
- Support for values that respect the integrity of persons and communities.
- Consideration of the needs of others, especially the economically marginalised.
- Use of language and images that are inclusive and which express equality.
- Provision of safe environments in which students can learn to live and work together in harmony.
- Opposition to cultures of violence and to systems of domination and exclusion.
- Processes for dealing with conflict, harassment, abuse and violation.

Wesley College seeks to provide a broad-based education with special attention to numeracy, literacy and other key competencies. This emphasis on a broad-based education is expressed in the College motto: Fide, Litteris, Labore – Faith, Letters (learning) and Labour (hard work). Wesley College has a special obligation to provide education for students of Maori and Pacific Islands descent and students whose family and personal circumstances require special care. Wesley College caters primarily for students boarding at the Proprietor's hostel with which it has a close association. It is acknowledged by the parties hereto that the Proprietor's hostel at present provides for residential accommodation with a special character that is an essential component of the special character of the school.



SECTION I

Historical

1844-1848

THE BEGINNING AT GRAFTON ROAD

On 17 March 1844 only four years after the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi, the Rev. Walter Lawry arrived in Auckland from England to take up his commission as General Superintendent of the Wesleyan Missionary activities in New Zealand. He was quick to see the need for a school or seminary for the education and training of Maori missionary ministers and teachers and it is he who may be regarded as the founder of Wesley College. Two months after his arrival, on 14 May he called a public meeting in Auckland with a view to “feeling the pulse of the colonists”. This was well attended by several Europeans including missionaries whose names today are revered: the Rev. John Hobbs, the Rev. James Buller, the Rev. John Whiteley, the Rev. James Wallis, the Rev. Thomas Buddle, as well as by a good number of representatives from a gathering of Maori who had assembled at Remuera to welcome the new Governor, Captain Robert Fitzroy, RN, and to discuss Maori problems with the Government.

THE REV. WALTER LAWRY

Mr. Lawry's proposals at the public meeting were cordially received. The meeting resolved to establish a Wesleyan



Native Institution to “instruct a selected number of natives in English, that they might become more efficient teachers of their countrymen in matters of religion and civilization.” A committee and officers were appointed and a subscription list was opened to meet the cost of erecting buildings, the sum of £46-15s-0d being promised on the spot. The meeting also resolved that the Government be approached for a suitable piece of land and a proportion of the funds arising from native reserves set aside by the Government.

Afterwards, the request was duly made to the Government to provide a section for the school, and on 7 October 1844, a grant of 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres in perpetuity was made. This is the area now fronting Grafton Road between Park Road and Carlton Gore Road.³ The first students began to arrive while the buildings were still in the course of erection - a chapel, a school-room with two wings for bedrooms, dining room and other conveniences, intended to accommodate sixteen students.

Early in 1845 the school was formally opened by Governor Fitzroy. As originally planned, land had thus been provided by the Government (which, by the way, later also made similar grants of land to the Roman Catholic Church for the establishment of an orphanage at Takapuna and to the Anglican Church for the establishment in Parnell what became

known as St. Stephen's School). The cost of the buildings (£120) was paid for by the public subscription, and the salaries of the teachers and the cost of maintaining the students were to be met by a grant of £200 made by the Wesleyan Missionary Committee.

The first Principal was the 33-year-old Rev. Thomas Buddle a minister of strong character. His appointment was very much against Mr. Buddle's own wishes for his missionary work in the Waikato was genuinely appreciated by

the Maori people there, and he was reluctant to abandon it. At the time, however, he was undoubtedly the best man available to be put in charge of the new school.

Mr. Buddle confined his own work in the classroom to the teaching of the Bible and of Theology, while a young assistant teacher, Rev. H.H. Lawry, son of the General Superintendent, taught English, Writing and Arithmetic. At first there were only ten students, but the number soon grew to 20. They came from as far afield as Hokianga and Kawhia, and were young men rather than boys, and some of them were married. All were selected because of the promise they showed as leaders. Lessons were given in the mornings and in the evenings, while the afternoons were devoted to the garden, to various improvements to the property such as building huts for the married students and to the fetching of food from Maori villages to supplement the produce of the gardens. On Sundays the students were busy conducting services among the Maori people in and around Auckland.

The provision of sufficient firewood and food was always a problem and the Rev. H.H. Lawry frequently led parties to the Three Kings area over three miles away, to cut firewood and to lug it back to the school, and to clear land for the planting of crops. It soon became clear that the area at Grafton Road, even with its gardens, was not large enough. On 1st April 1845, Governor Fitzroy came to the rescue with a further grant of 192 acres at Three Kings, large enough for a farm, on the same terms as the first grant, i.e. "for the general purposes of the Wesleyan Native Institution".

Governor Robert Fitzroy's term of office ended in November 1845 but the new Governor, Captain George Grey, (Knighted in 1848) soon became a frequent visitor to the school. It was he who inaugurated the policy of the admission of younger pupils to the school, when in 1847 at his request, two boys were admitted. One was the grandson of Tamati Waka Nene, the celebrated Ngapuhi chief, and this pupil was supported from Grey's private purse. The other was a son of Te Awaitaia (William Naylor), the Whaingaroa chief. The admission of these younger pupils marked the beginning of a new policy that eventually led to the development of Wesley College as a school for primary and secondary education and the establishment of a separate Methodist Trinity Theological College for older students. It is perhaps worthy of mention that in 1948, Grey selected Tamati Waka Nene and Te Puni (a Wellington Chieftain) as his esquires to stand on either side of him and to support him on the occasion of his investiture as a KCB.

THE MOVE TO THREE KINGS

For practical reasons, it was necessary that the school should as much as possible live off the land, and the move to the property at Three Kings, a farm of nearly 200 acres well away from the distractions of the town, was a move to a site more suitable than the suburban allotment at Grafton Road. This transfer had the full support of the new Governor, Sir George Grey, who on 5 April 1848, laid the foundation stone of the new building with the General Superintendent conducting the devotional part of the service. "Afterwards, our natives served up a Maori repast of potatoes, pumpkins, corn, melons, etc. grown on the spot", recorded Mr. Buddle.

The school now became generally known as The Three Kings Wesleyan Native Institution for the property took its name from a group of small volcanic cones which were a feature of the locality. Two of these cones have since been nearly obliterated by scoria quarries, but the Great King, which was part of the College property, was set aside by the Trust Board as a Reserve and vested in the Crown and it will thus be preserved to the neighbourhood for all time. The land was fertile and stony, and in the early days it carried some attractive bush.

It is clear from an Educational Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council in 1847 that the Governor wished to introduce a wider and more general system of education than that envisaged by his predecessor, as a necessary step towards the full cooperation of Maori and European in the civilised life of the community. However, neither the funds nor the teachers were available for the establishment of anything like a public school system as we understand it today: and following the British Government's instructions given to Governor Hobson, at the outset Grey decided to continue to help the Churches by making grants of land and money. In addition to religious education and instruction in the English language, schools were open to government inspection and examination, and to provide industrial training as well as the necessary arable land and room for expansion.

Buildings of scoria stones roughly cemented together were constructed and it appears from entries in the District Accounts that the builder was a Mr. Henry White, who had erected the High Street Wesleyan Chapel a few years earlier. The school moved to the new buildings under Mr. Buddle's care early in 1849.

In 1850 an area of very poor land at Waikowai on the coast of the Manukau harbour was granted to the Institution as a fishing ground for the natives and further grants of land at Mt. Albert and Dominion Road were also made. All grants were made in terms of the British Government's Memorandum and provided that Maori and half-caste children and the children of inhabitants of the islands in the Pacific Ocean as well as orphans or destitute children or European parents, were to be eligible for admission to the school. In 1859, on the initiative of the Maori themselves, areas at Aotea and Kawhia were added to the Trust.

In April 1849, the new Principal, the Rev. Alexander Reid and his wife arrived from England. He was a trained teacher, a Scot who knew something of the principles and practice of agriculture. Under his leadership, the school roll grew rapidly to 150 pupils in 1821, by which time Mr. Buddle records "They have fenced in during the year 106 acres of land and now have under crop – potatoes, 30 acres; wheat 25; maize 12; pasturage, 14. Several of the elder boys can plough and harrow, ditch and fence, and others are learning carpentry under the superintendence of an experienced tradesman (this was Mr. Alfred Boon from Burslem, England who has accompanied the Rev. Walter Lawry on his voyage to New Zealand). They have erected new buildings. The girls make and mend and wash the clothes for the boys and themselves, under Mrs. Reid's superintendence. She is a most devoted woman. I wish her health were equal to her zeal. I am sure if you could just go over this Institution you would be delighted beyond measure and its fame spreads."

Two years later in 1853, the Rev. Robert Young, an eminent minister of the British conference, then on an official tour of the colonies visited the Institution. He says that beside the school proper dormitories and master's house, there was another building with six bedrooms and a store. There were also eleven raupo cottages for the use of students. Some of them were married and lived in these, both husband and wife being students.

Mr. Young found the total enrolment to be 131. The maintenance was provided for by grants from the Government and the Missionary Society, the annual cost of each pupil being estimated at £5 i.e. beyond the food grown on the farm.

A public school examination was held, of which Mr. Young comments enthusiastically, and he expresses his admiration of the neat appearance of the students, their attention, and the propriety of their behaviour at the



table. The Institution was of course, now under Government Inspection and as an endorsement, Mr. Young approvingly quoted a few sentences from the official inspection report. Of the children, Mr. Young said: "They formed an assemblage of lovely and happy children such as I had not seen before in any school."

About the middle of the decade however, a change came over the school which reflected the altered tempo of the Maori people. The unfortunate land disputes, which culminated in the Taranaki war of 1860, caused the Maori people to feel that they had been duped and robbed by the white man and whole tribes became suspicious, even of their friends. Missionary influences began to wane, the Maori people began to lose confidence in the school and even within the Three Kings itself, boys and girls became insolent and insubordinate. Control became difficult, the roll number dropped sharply and Mrs. Reid who laboured beyond her strength for years had a severe breakdown. In 1858, Mr. Reid removed to Waipa Mission Station and the Maori girls were sent home.

The Rev. Thomas Buddle endeavoured from Manukau to give oversight for a year after which Mr. George Stannard took control for three years. In 1862, the Rev. H.H. Lawry combined the Governorship of the school with his work among the Manukau Maori. As a supernumerary, Rev. James Wallis took charge for the closing year. During this period, the teaching was in the hands of Messrs. J. Skinner, W. Collis and W. Arthur successively.

"In the Waikato, Government attempts to suppress the King Movement there in 1864, resulted in further strife, and with this, the Church's educational work in almost every district collapsed for the time being" writes the Rev. G.I. Launson in "Te Hahi Weteriana" (p.170). "In Auckland the authorities gave an ultimatum to the Maori around the Franklin area and southward, either to sign an oath of allegiance or to get out. The result was that most quietly 'got out', and joined their fellow tribesmen beyond the Mangatawhiri River." At Three Kings as the number of Maori pupils began to decline, in an effort to keep the doors open, destitute European children were accepted under the arrangement with the Auckland Provincial Council. But the times were bad and the Authorities would not pay enough to support the children. Finally in 1869 the orphans were returned to the receiving officer and the Three Kings Wesleyan Native Institution closed its doors.

1876 – 1923 WESLEY COLLEGE, THREE KINGS

After a break of seven years, the institution reopened in 1876 under the name of Wesley College, Three Kings. The name Wesley College was a legacy from a school in Queen Street and since the names of that school and of Prince Albert College still occasionally arise in conversation, at this point it might not be irrelevant to comment briefly on each.

Wesley College in upper Queen Street was opened in 1850 and its Principal was the Rev. Joseph H. Fletcher. It was not owned nor opened by the Methodist Church, but was a proprietary boarding school owned and erected by shareholders (who were missionaries in the Islands) expressly for the education of their own children. At first the school was for both boys and girls and a few day pupils were also accepted. In 1852, the roll numbered 70 children. In 1855, Mr. Fletcher resigned through ill-health, and he was succeeded first by his younger brother, the Rev. W. Fletcher, BA, and then in 1857 by Mr. John Fletcher, another brother who conducted it for about 12 years. At the end of this time several of the original proprietors had returned to England and in other cases, the families had grown up. As a result they decided to donate the College and its grounds to the Connexion, with the stipulation that they should be used for "a Wesleyan seminary, or failing that for the promotion of a College or Colleges in New Zealand in connection with the Wesleyan Methodist Church". The original owners had received no interest on their shares and now in 1869 they gave up the Principal. Sometime after Mr. John Fletcher's retirement, the property was released to the Auckland Education Board.

The revenue received was carefully husbanded by the Trustees, and when in 1876 it was decided to reopen the Three Kings College for Maori students but with a special branch for the training of European students for the ministry. The Trustees of Wesley College Queen Street contributed to the cost and subsequently made further grants for maintenance and improvements.

Prince Albert College was opened for boys on 12 February 1895 with 36 scholars, three of whom were boarders. The school was opened by the Trustees of Wesley College, Queen Street, at the request of Conference and in honour of the Prince Consort, the name was changed to Prince Albert College. The headmaster was Mr. Thomas Jackson, MA (London). The numbers increased rapidly and in February 1896 a brick building of two storeys was opened for girls with 38 scholars. Miss. McKerron, MA was appointed as the Principal lady teacher but the whole was under the supervision of Mr. Jackson. In 1898 there were 116 pupils at each school. When the Government of the day introduced a scheme of free places in secondary schools in 1903, the roll numbers began to diminish and at the end of 1906, the two schools closed.

Wesley College, Three Kings, reopened in 1876 with the Rev. Thomas Buddle once again as Principal. There were three European students for the ministry (Messrs. S. Lawry, T.Fee and J.N. Buttle) and five young Maori. Mr. Buddle was in charge for the next six years until his retirement from active work and he was followed for the next three years by the Rev. W.J. Watkin. The Rev. Alexander Reid then took charge and remained until his death in 1891 after which the Rev. Dr William Morley and the Rev. W.I. Williams each held the position for a short period. The Rev. E.W. Hames writes "Conditions were far from ideal, judged by modern standards; but the Rev. Alexander Reid could write in 1890 that 27 ministers, more than a third of the active Church at that date, had been students at Three Kings and that the College was a potent factor in New Zealand Methodism." By 1891, the number of students had increased to 22 and their ages varied greatly.

No girls were admitted. In 1895, Prince Albert College began its short career on the site of the old Wesley College in Queen Street, Auckland; the European students were moved there from Three Kings.

In 1895, the Rev. J. H Simmonds came into residence as Principal at Three Kings. He found the prospect depressing. Decay and disorder met the eye in every direction. Buildings, fences, implements and stock were all past their best and conditions made it impossible to take in a large numbers of boarders.



In his first report to the Board, Mr. Simmonds stated: "The first thing to be aimed at is to get the institution out of debt, the second is to put it in thoroughly good order, the third is to bring to it and educate scholastically and industrially, the most capable and promising youths that can be induced to accept its benefit." To these objects, Mr. Simmonds devoted himself during the remainder of his working life.

For several years, progress was very slow. The decline of the total Maori population was not arrested until the turn of the century, and an apathetic attitude prevailed both within and outside the Church. The roll number was a mere 17 in 1893 and still only 24 in 1900. Nevertheless, during the first decade of the century, the roll gradually increased and steadily maintained at about 30 boys, the maximum number that could be accommodated under existing conditions. The teaching was mainly of primary school standard, though there were always a few more advanced pupils. In about 1903 a scheme was inaugurated for providing new buildings but it seems not to have been followed with any enthusiasm. Gradually there grew the realisation that Three Kings was no longer the ideal site for a demonstration farm. With the expansion and growth of the city of Auckland, the estate was acquiring a potential for building lots. "Here at last", writes the Rev. E.W. Hames "was an opportunity to escape from a situation rapidly becoming less than creditable to the Church and of embarking on a bold and worthy scheme of expansion for the College".

Accordingly, with the consent of Conference, a Bill was promoted in the House of Representatives which became law under the title of "The Methodist Charitable and Educational Trust Act 1911". This Act provided for the establishment of the Wesley Training College Trust Board to take over the functions of the Native Education Trust and the Wesley College Executive Committee and contained provision not only for Maori but for the children of indigent Europeans as well as deserving children from the Pacific Islands. In 1914, an Amending Act gave the Trust Board the power to sell properties held under the Trust and to use the proceeds of the sale in improvements to other land held on the same trusts. With the passing of this Act, the Board purchased the present site at Paerata with a view to transferring the College from Three Kings; but because of the Great War, building could not be commenced until early 1922.

Within eight months, the first stage was completed at the new site with the erection of a dining block, a residence, dormitory block and other facilities, and the pupils and teachers moved in on the 28 August 1922. "After more than 70 years of chequered fortune, the old wooden College at Three Kings was pulled down and the home farm was leased", continued Mr. Hames. "Serviceable timber and iron from the buildings were taken to Paerata and used for the erection of farm sheds. The only building that remained in occupation at Three Kings was the Principal's house and a few years later (April 1934) this was destroyed by fire. Today nothing remains to assist recollection except the trees which have been left to beautify the housing estate and the grassy slopes of the Great King."

1924 – 1942

WESLEY TRAINING COLLEGE, PAERATA

Until 1922, there were no trees at all on the site of the farm and school, but in this year, the Rev. J. H. Simmonds and the few boys at Three Kings planted a shelter-belt of Eucalyptus along the Paerata Road frontage northwards from Mr. Jamieson's farm boundary. (When these trees had reached maturity, they became unsightly and their branches were continually breaking telephone lines and so in 1970, they were removed.) At the same time, the erection of the first 'L' shaped section of the dormitory block nearest the present dining room was commenced. Near the front doorway is this inscription:

Fide, Litteris, Labore, Laus Deo.

In 1923, preparations at the Paerata site continued, fencing went ahead on the farm; a dining-kitchen block and a residence were completed. Towards the end of the second term, the Rev. J. H. Simmonds went to Australia for a short period to assist the Board in the finding of a new Principal. In the third term at Three Kings, the few boys at the little school assisted in the transfer of chattels to the new site, and at the end of the year, with the appointment made of the 31-year-old Mr. Roy C. Clark as his successor, the Rev. J. H. Simmonds retired.

Glimpses of the strenuous and devoted work of the new Principal, Mr. R. C. Clark, MA, DipEd, can be caught especially in the "Through the Years" section of the register. His first task was to build up the school roll numbers and to maintain them, to secure enough boys to provide a community of interests and to make the school and the farm a viable economic unit. At the same time, he has also to recruit teachers in a period when little or no assistance could be expected from the Government. As the school grew, he had to see that adequate buildings were secured. He was in full charge of the farm. School fees charged were minimal and while he succeeded in making it possible for the farm to provide fresh vegetables, fruit, honey, milk and meat, he was also able to raise production in excess of the school's own needs so that there was surplus for sale and a small but steady income to supplement the money available for the payment of wages and salaries and the provision of teaching facilities. He was a lover of trees and firmly believed in the educational values of practical work on the farm, and was thus able to use the farm as an integral part of schooling.

Mr. Clark's working day was a long one. He rose at 5:30am and usually commenced the day with a ride on horseback over the 680 acre farm (which at first included property well beyond the present railway line). Besides the work of planning the farm and school activities and seeing that his plans were implemented, he taught in the classrooms. His super-vision during term time continued until late at night for seven days of each week.

Most strenuous and worrying were the days of the economic depression when the number of boys at the school declined, income from the sale of farm products decreased, the school's finances were straitened and all expenditure had thus to be pruned restricted and budgeted for. Although he never lost his faith that the school could surmount these difficulties, forty years after both Mr. and Mrs. Clark described the memory of these trying years as "a veritable nightmare".

Finally, with the outbreak of World War II, there came the knock-out blow, when the Army took over the College buildings and the school was dispersed. All Mr. and Mrs. Clark's efforts to build a great school with character and individuality of its own appeared to have been in vain. Disappointed, though not entirely defeated, Mr. and Mrs. Clark opened a small Preparatory School at Panmure; but when late in 1943, the Defence authorities intimated their intention to vacate the College buildings Mr. Clark indicated to the Board that he would not begin again at Paerata and a new Principal, Mr. E.M. Marshall, BA, DipEd, was appointed.



1942-1944 BRIDGING THE GAP

There was a full school in 1941 and the teaching staff comprised Mr. R.C. Clark, MA, DipEd (Principal), assisted by Messrs. E.M. Marshall, BA; E.A. Crane, MA; I.D. Foote, BSc; H.T. Waring; and R.M. Dunn. The Chaplain was the Rev. W.G. Slade, MA; and the Matrons were Miss. A.M. Cliff and Miss. G. Hemus. Employed on the farm were Mr. H.J. Barber (manager) assisted by Messrs. Grayson, A.J. Stevens, scholastically in horticulture, and on the sports field. The school prefects were A. Tubou (Senior), C. Hayward, R. Bawden and I. Corkill; while the games Captains were C. Hayward (cricket) and A. Rogers (football).

After the hostilities had opened with Japan, however, on 12 December 1941, the army moved in and took over the College buildings (including the Principal's residence), and Mr. and Mrs. Clark and family moved to Wellington Park at Panmure, which (as the result of Mr. M. Harding's bequest) had then come into the hands of the Board of Governors. On 7 February 1942, with 80 boys on the roll. Mr. Clark continued to reside at the Preparatory School at Mt. Wellington, while supervising the College and the farm as Principal; while Mr. E.M Marshall carried on as headmaster of the secondary school at Paerata.

In April, with an influx of boys from St. Stephen's School (taken over by the Auckland Hospital Board), the total roll reached 107. In this year, the school had to work under considerable difficulties. Supplies were difficult to obtain, the domestic staffing position was acute, the war situation was serious and no one knew from day to day what further demands might be made on the College for buildings and the use of other facilities.

In August 1942, the Defence authorities intimated that they should take over the buildings once more and also an area of the land for the establishment of the camp. Consequently, at the end of the Second Term, the College, except for a remnant, closed down. The boys were sent to schools throughout the North Island to Fielding, Te Aute and sundry District High Schools. Yet fifteen boys stayed on under the control of the headmaster, Mr. E. M Marshall, assisted by Mr. I. S. Miller (farm overseer) and Miss. G. Hemus (matron). The College was again occupied, first by an N.Z. Hospital Unit of 200 nurses and 600 men.

So it was that in the Third Term, 1942, the main College was closed and the fifteen boys left became a "Sole Charge" secondary school under Mr. Marshall. The classroom used was the Science laboratory adjoining the present woodwork room. There were two boys in Form 5A, three in 5B, one in 5C, two in 4A, two in 4B and five in Form 3.

The fifth formers sat for external examinations in December and did very well. All boys had to do extra work on both farm and grounds. Where previously there has been over 100 boys available for lawns, paths, hedges, classrooms, dormitories, dairy, calves, pigs and poultry and orchard, there were now a mere handful. "But the work was done and done well," writes Mr. Marshall. The 'brick house on the corner was made into dormitories and locker rooms, each bedroom named after a Maori canoe, each Rangatira being responsible for its cleanliness and the good behaviour of the crew."

"New Zealand soldiers straight from Fiji were the next to arrive, and we had a happy time with them", continues Mr. Marshall. Then there arrived an American unit of some 120 nurses and 600 men. "They came from U.S.A in the late afternoon, straight off the boat. We have seldom heard such appreciation of flowers, green grass and trees. The newcomers were most pleasant and interested. Chaplain Cary gave cordial invitations to us to join in their services, and when Christmas came, everyone attended the Christmas Eve celebrations, first in the Chapel and then in the dining room".

"Our own 'breaking-up' was sad for with this ceremony, Wesley College closed down completely."

Mr. I.S Miller, the farm overseer who had done so valiantly as House Master and as 'outside' instructor carried on with the farm. The rest of us were disbanded". Meantime, in August, Mr. Clark had begun a Preparatory School at Panmure, and this continued to flourish. Then late in 1943, the authorities intimated that they wished to vacate the College buildings, although they would retain the camp.

The Board of Governors therefore decided to reopen the College and as Mr. R. C. Clark indicated that he would not remain in charge at Paerata, a new Principal, Mr. E. M. Marshall, was appointed.



Accordingly, on 5 February 1944, the College reopened with 27 boys and by April, the number had increased to 53. A new staff was selected and an excellent new beginning was made. "This year, 1944, was of special significance because it was our Centennial Year. We have entered on a new century with high hope", wrote Mr. Marshall.

1944-1964

"RECOLLECTIONS"

(Kindly contributed by the Rev. E. M. Marshall)

The second century since the founding of the College began inauspiciously with no celebrations, no fan-fare or trumpets and with little publicity except for the excellent 'Centenary Survey' prepared by the Rev. E. W. Hames. As the new Principal, I proceeded to get things going as best I could in War-time, but with few students, very few staff and with no equipment to speak of, and with the buildings and grounds in a poor state after military occupation. We still has 1300 troops camped on the property. We were now a Forms I to VI school and the Principal was no longer to be a Farm Manager as well as Headmaster. He was to be his own Bursar for a number of years yet.

Everyone worked with a will. With such stalwarts as Miss. A.M. Cliff (Matron), Mr. N.O.D. Alexander (Farm) and a keen team of teachers, we did not take so long to have things organised. We began with 53 boys (Basin Webster as Head Prefect), and the next year with 90. "Ted" Wadham was with us as Handyman for 25 years' unobtrusive but reliable help in his quiet way. "Snow" Knott returned to the College after a spell in the Army, and what a contribution he made during his 40 and more years of service, not only as Grounds Overseer, but as general friend and counsellor.

GROWTH: The total number of boys gradually increased to 115 in 1947. Building restrictions prevented the Board from putting up more classrooms until 1949, but a new science laboratory and an excellent woodwork room lifted our morale considerably. Increases in roll meant enlarging the dining room, modernising the kitchen, improving the water-supply (hot and cold), bringing ablutions up-to-date, better locker-rooms, laundry storage and sorting facilities, improved quarters for single staff, more dormitories, extra recreation rooms, bigger sports fields, larger gardens, more vehicles and more poultry.

Wages and salaries went up, and so did the fees, and the spiral have continued ever since. The Board was always willing to consider plans for improvement.

While all this was going on, the farm was given a new cow-shed, new tractors, and other modern equipment. Part of the farm was sold; some of the new plantations were removed and new houses were erected. The swimming-bath, which we erected in 1944 for £100 or so, served our purpose well, it needed a filtration plant, and thanks to the revived Old Boys' Association, it got one. The Old Boys' Association had also erected a striking entrance gateway to the College.

The Chapel, at first, used an old Harmonium organ for the singing. Then came the gift of a small pipe organ from the Mission Bay Methodist Church; and finally, the lovely pipe-organ was purchased from the Collegiate Trinity College Church, Grafton Road.

GROUNDS AND GARDENS: Mr. and Mrs. Clark were great garden and tree lovers. We Marshalls tried to carry on their good work. Mrs. Marshall seeing to the beautifying of the grounds around the Principal's House, Mr. Smythe caring for the long lines of rose gardens and he and Mr. Knott, the shrubs., native trees, lawns, lines of citrus, edges and hedges.

MUSIC: The development of the College musical talent was one of our ambitions, and to Mr. Claude Laurie, we owe much. We had a choir of 90 voices, and were able to select some 60 for concert trips, the taking of Church Services in numerous places and singing at special functions. Chapel singing was an inspiration. Some boys (and the Marshall girls and boy) were trained to play the pipe organ.

Patricia Marshall being official organist for 15 years.

She also followed Mr. Laurie in charge of the choir, and the programme broadened for scope over the years. The erection of the Hall in 1956 was a major step forward in the development of cultural activities in the College.

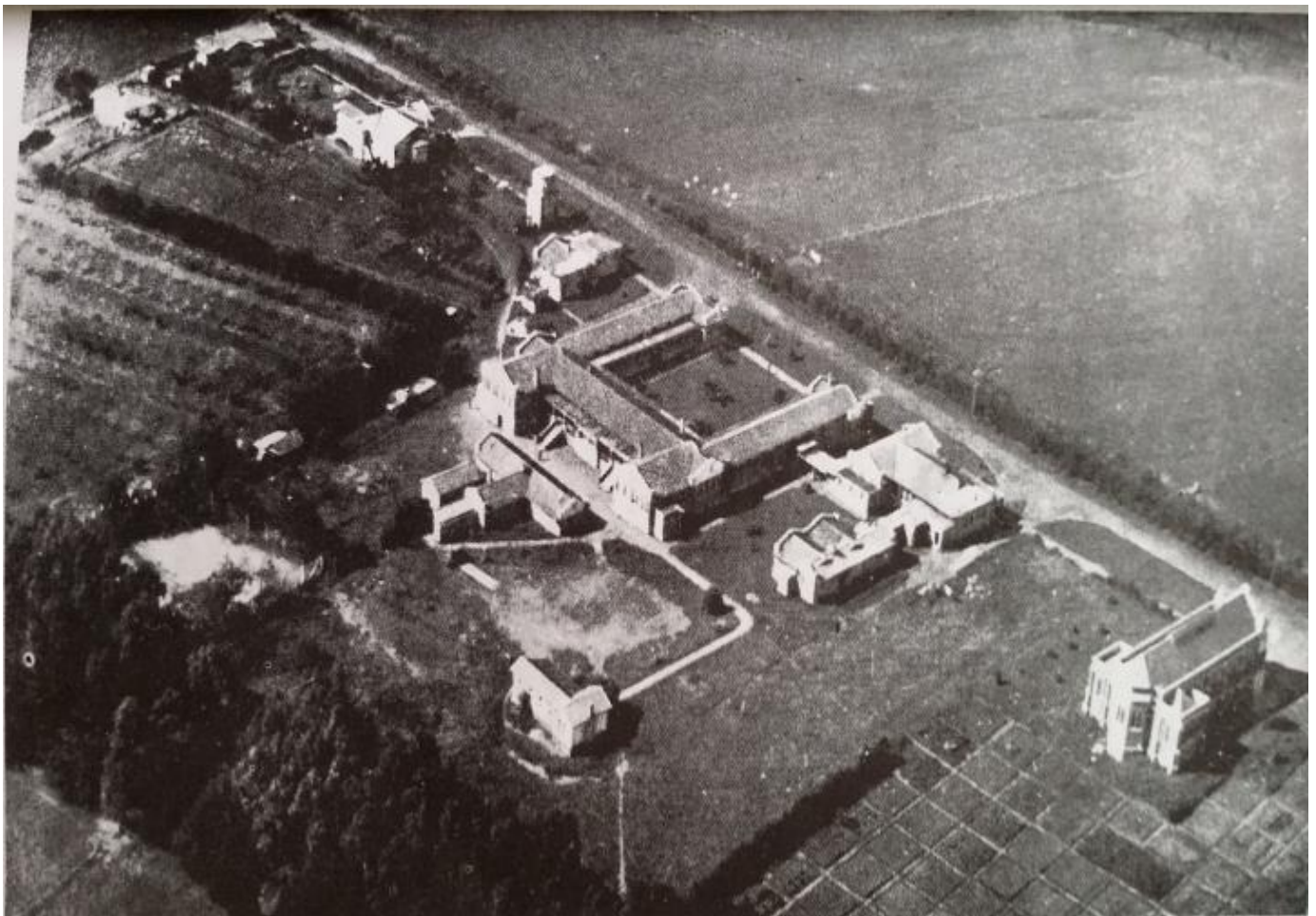
UNFORGETTABLE PEOPLE: It would be invidious of me to try to list boys, staff, families who could well find a place



on the College Roll of Honour. During the 21 years we had our problems and difficulties, plenty of them. We got through very largely because of those who has a positive and constructive approach to life, and carried it over into College life. We do have some staff who stood by in times of stress, people who were prepared and glad to do much more than duty and even loyalty required. We remember with affection those fine Island and Maori young men who lived with us and left to be leaders among their own people.

I had the good fortune to serve under the College Committee Chairmanship of three exceptional men, and the Deputy Chairmanship of two: Mr. Justice Sir Joseph Stanton, Mr. James Tyler, Mr. J. Stuart Caghey, Mr. W. Burley, Mr. Ken Dellow and Mr. Eric Salmon. I have also been appreciative of the first Secretary, Mr. Leonard Knight, and for many years, Mr. Brian Minogue. Unforgettable people, all of them.

“BY BELL, BOOK OR CANDLE”: BELLS played a significant part in our life.

Some 27 of them were rung each day and almost the first task for the new boys was to learn what they all meant. I am glad we never got around to replacing the old bell with a klaxon or siren as was suggested from time to time. To me, it was a symbol of orderliness, time-tabling, organisation, planning and in addition, it was appropriate in times of celebration, such as the time of three Vice-Regal visits during this period, landmarks in our history, those visits of Lord Freyburg, Sir Willoughby Norrie and Sir Bernard Fergusson. There were many other visitors of note - Queen Salote of Tonga, Dr Sangster, the Ambassador from Burma and others.

The Chapel bell had its own special tone and could be heard even by the residents of Paerata on occasions. It let them know that they were welcome to come and share in worship with us, and quite often, they did.

BOOKS: stand for reading for pleasure and reading for profit; writing for the record and writing as a creative art. We did our best with a Library but I always thought there was much more to Library sessions in a school than putting a mass of books before a mass of boys and telling them to go to it.



CANDLES: No, we did not burn any in our Chapel as part of the ritual, but candles do stand for worship, aspiration, the offering one makes to God. I was ordained into the Methodist Ministry in 1948, as I believed that the Headmaster could also well be Chaplain of the College. For this reason, I had deliberately left the State Educational System; for the candle is a symbol of that part of the educational programme that is closed to State Schools but is our privilege to keep open in the Church school. On a monument erected to Gaw Honf of Formosa are found the words: "A candle, in consuming itself, giveth light". I believe that Wesley College, throughout its long history, has done just this, spending and being spent, in the spreading of light amongst young men of New Zealand and the South Pacific. One of its lesser lights went out in 1964, but another one was lit and so it has been all along!

1965-1967

Mr. C.A. Neate, MA, DipTchg began as Principal with a staff meeting one week ahead of the reopening of the school after the holidays. This energetic and dedicated approach to his work continued right through the years at Wesley College. Without altering the basic organisation evolved by his predecessor Mr. Marshall, Mr. Neate introduced many new ideas which have been already adopted in many state secondary schools. Throughout, he was loyally supported by his Vice-Principal, Mr. E. Te R. Tauroa, and by well-qualified staff, and the College soon adapted itself to new and clearly-defined routines.

With an increased roll, now 226 boys, Mr. Neate at once advised the Board of Governors of the need for an additional science laboratory, additional classrooms, a larger library and another staff residence, and these in due course, were provided. The concrete floors of two classrooms in the old brick building nearest the dormitory block were carpeted, and electric wall-heaters were installed in the Harding Hall lounge, which was also largely refurnished and Mr. A. J. Kidd, a member of the Board, lay down and fenced the present tennis courts. The library received substantial gifts of books and money. Photographs of former Principals, prefects and sports team were put up in the dining room and on the walls of the classroom corridors.

The curriculum was slightly adapted to meet special requirements of the public examination system and new schemes of work were introduced. In the classrooms, Mr. Neate insisted that the first object of schooling was thorough teaching and the attainment of the highest standards in each form. He encouraged teachers to attend refresher courses during the holidays and use the most up-to-date teaching methods. He inculcated a fine spirit of scholarship throughout the school from the lowest classes upwards and, in due course, this was reflected in the achievement of excellent results in the different public examinations, including the first success in the University Junior Scholarship and Bursary examinations.

The sports field near Paerata Road was enlarged and after much clearing up in the lower sports field area had been completed, these fields were kept fully used. Mr. M. Snook continued as farm manager and his residence was shifted in to the College environs. A programme of tree-felling, re-fencing and roading commenced and the dairy herd was increased.

Mr. Neate took a personal interest in each of the sports teams at weekends and his enthusiasm and genuine pleasure in the achievements of individual boys spurred everybody to be the best of which they were capable. A feature of this period was the introduction of classes in Life Saving in which he was one of the Royal Life Saving Society's qualified examiners; another with the help of Mrs. McLean's organising of girls from Pukekohe High School, was the introduction of frequent and much enjoyed socials and dances.

Mr. Neate was just as keen to promote the spiritual welfare of the boys. He took particular interest in affairs centering around the Chapel and regularly took many Chapel services himself each week. The appointment of a full-time (Teacher) Chaplain, the Rev. Ian H. McKenzie was the result of this earnest desire.

For Wesley College, the period with Mr. Neate as Principal was a stimulating and rewarding experience. At the time of his appointment to become Principal of Pukekohe High School, the College shared his mixed feelings. With the admiration of staff and pupils, he regretfully left an efficient and organised school, still on the up-grade. All connected with the College shared his regret at his departure, while realising that his abilities and energy were indeed worthy of a larger place.

1968 – 1973

Over these years, when Mr. E. Te R. Tauroa, BAgSc was Principal, the roll continued to show a general upward trend



and the number of Maori and overseas pupils also increased. Four new staff residences were erected during this time as well as covered way between the classroom blocks and an assembly hall.

Four dominant factors in Mr. Tauroa's character determined his direction of the College during his period – his deeply religious convictions, his Maoridom, his practical interest in all matters agricultural and his experiences in outdoor activities, particularly in rugby football. Consistently, he made it clear that he wished Maori, European and overseas students alike to strive for the highest academic attainments of which they were capable; and in fact, the high standards set by his predecessors in former years were maintained. Though often frustrated by the dearth of trained teachers qualified in the work of Maori education, his earnest desire to do more for the Maori students was reflected in the reintroduction of the Maori language and of Maori studies into the curriculum. In addition, with a view of giving all students the opportunity to find their own answers to the moral and other attitudes of New Zealand's changing society, a new subject, "Liberal Studies", was introduced to the curriculum.

His concern with the worth of people as individuals was a reflection partly of his Maori heritage, and partly of his belief that "the ultimate answer of everything is through Christian living". In him there was no division between the secular and the religious. Indeed he believed that the religious embraced and included all things secular; and this philosophy evident every day, made a profound impression not only on the staff and pupils but also upon others with whom he came into contact.

His interest in agriculture was also closely related to his appreciation of God in nature. He delighted in the beauty of flowers and in the usefulness of the school farm and while he ruthlessly removed any unsightly trees which have passed their maturity, he grassed many waste areas and planted many trees and shrubs. The grassed area between Harding Hall and the other dormitory and classroom blocks in what was hitherto a dreary, gravel quadrangle will long remain as memorial to Mr. Tauroa's concern for the maintenance of the beautiful environment of the College.

The farm was another of his cares. With the drop in wool prices in 1967, the carrying of sheep became uneconomic. They were disposed of, a modern herringbone cowshed was erected and milk production thereafter increased dramatically.

Mr. Tauroa's joy in the performances of all boys at sports was infectious. All respected him for his own attainments on the rugby fields and for his knowledge and ability as coach. Especially on Monday mornings, the reading of the team-Captains' healthy uninhibited reports on each and every game, punctuated by Mr. Tauroa's own lively interpolations, became a feature of morning assemblies that few will forget.

Throughout his time as Principal at Wesley College, Mr. Tauroa wisely left such matters as the timetable and the day-to-day management of the school affairs to his able vice-Principal, Mr. J. I. Horsman, whose loyalty, tact and meticulous attention to detail were invaluable. Equally invaluable was the support of Mrs. Tauroa, who assisted in school matters whenever required – as an occasional part-time teacher of the Maori language to the management of the school canteen.

The period 1968 -1973 will indeed remain a highlight in the history of Wesley College.

1974 – 1988

THE DENTON – MCDUGALL ERA

The most remarkable development period in the school's history was characterised by:

- a) A 50% increase in the roll number with a pronounced increase in the number of Maori and Pacific Island students (with long waiting lists).
- b) The reintroduction of girls with a corresponding notable improvement in the academic and social standards of the College.
- c) A multi-million dollar building programme.
- d) Integration into the State Education System.

In 1973, the roll number had dropped to 211 students of whom only 21 were Maori.

Mr. McDougall made a concerted effort to return to the suggested criteria developed in 1938 of 30% Maori and



10% Pacific Islanders. This percentage was achieved in 1978, while the final roll in 1988 registered 330 students of whom 96 were Maori and 50 were Pacific Islanders.

In 1979, Mr. McDougall won a coveted Woolf Fisher Scholarship for 4 months study in Great Britain, Europe and the United States of America. He and Mrs. McDougall concentrated on boys' schools which had introduced girls to their senior levels (78% in Great Britain) and he subsequently recommended to the Board that Wesley follow suit. Some girls had been present at the school from 1844 to 1880 but only boys had been enrolled for the next 100 years. Twenty-three girls were introduced into Form 6 and Form 7 in 1985 of whom 20 boarded in the Te Paea Hall complex made possible by a bequest from the Methodist Church family of Clothier.

The academic standards of the school lifted and in 1988, twenty 7th form students gained University Bursary passes. The Social family life of the College improved with enduring friendship formed and Wesley became a true multiracial coeducational Christian boarding school.

The dedicated stewardship of early Boards' wise investment and the generosity of many benefactors gave Mr. Denton and the Trust Board a firm foundation to undertake an ambitious building programme in the late 1970s and 1980s. The first aims were to provide improved classroom facilities and non-barrack style dormitories for all students. To this end, a new senior boys' dormitory with cubicles and study facilities was opened in 1979, appropriately named Caughey Hall. Te Paea Hall with motel type units was provided for girls in 1986. The remaining boys' dormitory, Harding Hall was gutted and refurbished into two unit cubicles in 1988. The Chapel was remodeled and refurnished in 1974 with the addition of an upstairs gallery. A new Technical block was opened in 1978 and all classrooms upgraded from 1977 to 1979. The Hames Music and Computer suite was completed in 1980 and the McDougall library in 1988.

In the early 1970s, both political parties investigated the integration of private schools into the state system as a means of easing the financial burden on parents paying fees for tuition as well as boarding and to provide equal professional opportunities for teaching staff. In 1975, Wesley College was invited to be the first private school to follow this path and after 3 years of delicate negotiation, Wesley became the first private school in New Zealand



to become part of the state system, while still retaining the special character of the College. Subsequently, over 300 primary and secondary schools have followed the Wesley model agreement, which was one of the greatest changes in the history of education in New Zealand. The financial relief for parents and students was immense, while it allowed the Trust Board to concentrate its resources on upgrading the boarding facilities of the College and on providing additional assistance for students in social need.

Many changes in staff, curricula, method of assessment, period times, new subjects introduced and modern teaching methods were devised – these are detailed in the yearly summaries.

A wide range of new sports were introduced, building on the established traditional games so that all students had the option of enjoying outdoor activities. The sporting success of the students was unparalleled by any other school of similar size. Christian cultural, social and leisure pursuits were developed to a high degree offering all pupils the opportunity of a well-balanced education in preparation of adult life.

Mr. Denton, Mr. McDougall, Board members, staff and students should look back with pride and satisfaction on the distinguished 15 year period in the history of Wesley College.

1989 – 1994 NEW BEGINNINGS

On Saturday 6 August 1988, Mr. G.V. Cowley, MSc(Hons), DipTchg, along with three other candidates, was interviewed and subsequently appointed the same day to the Principalship of Wesley College, effective 1 February 1989.

Mr. Cowley came to Wesley College with a background of 22 years' teaching experience – the last 11 of which were spent as Principal of Te Kuiti High School (6 ½ years) and the Rutherford High School (4 ½ years) – accompanied by his wife, Jennifer, who was a trained pipe-organist and two of their four children.

At the time of Mr. Cowley's appointment to Wesley College, Mr. T.G.M. Spooner, MA(Hons), DipTchg, was Chairman of the Board of Governors, a position he relinquished with the new Board of Trustees elections in 1989 when Mr. E.J.Beavis, BA, DipEd, DipTchg, was elected to the Chairmanship.

Mr. H.M. Denton, OBE, JSM, FCIT, FNZITT, stood down from the Chairmanship of the Trust Board in 1990 and was succeeded by Mr. J.H. McCoskrie, BCom, LLB, ACA, ACIS.

Mr. Cowley's appointment to Wesley coincided with a period of substantial educational change – perhaps the most rapid and significant within the history of New Zealand education with the introduction of "Tomorrow's Schools" and the enactment of the Education Act 1989 – an Act to reform the administration of education.

Under Mr. Cowley's leadership, the College roll increased substantially with the maximum roll allowed under the Integration Agreement increasing from 330 to 380. In 1993 with the readmission of Form 1 students, Wesley again reverted to a Form 1 to 7 College. In 1994, girls were introduced at Form 5 level, having previously only been enrolled in Form 6 and 7.

The Trust Board staffing to oversee the running of the College Hostels was substantially increased with the appointment of two Night Supervisors and increased funding was provided for Matrons, and in 1994 a full-time Hostel Manager was appointed.

On the College teaching staff, a woman was appointed for the first time as a member of the 'Top Three Senior Management Team' and another woman was appointed as the College's first Guidance Counsellor. In 1992, the College's first musical production was staged and has now become an annual event, while the Commerce Department became strongly involved in the Young Enterprise Scheme which was founded more than a decade earlier by a national Trust. In 1993, the College linked in with Manukau Polytechnic Institute for College staff to teach NCB courses so that seventh form Commerce students had the opportunity to gain papers in this tertiary qualification in addition to their normal school qualifications.

With the ability to manage the school finances arising from the devolution of responsibility from the then



Department of Education to the school Board of Governors, the Principal had the opportunity to put the school on a strong financial footing and this allowed for significant expenditure on plant and equipment for the benefit of students and teachers.

In 1993, the Board of Governors provided the “Watson Common Room” for day students while the Trust Board continued with its programme of renovating existing College buildings and provided additional buildings such as a new classroom for Form 1 and 2 students and a new kiln room.

Sadly, the College has been without the services of a full-time Chaplain for 8 of the last 16 school terms (i.e. from February 1989 to May 1994) – a situation which we hope will be shortly rectified as we look to the Methodist Church of Aotearoa / New Zealand for a connexional appointment.

During 1989 – 1994 the College regularly sent a staff member, usually during the May holidays, to liaise with the parents of students in various Pacific Islands. Professional leadership training courses for College Prefects were also commenced during this period.

Sadly, in 1994, the eucalyptus trees fronting State Highway 22 had to be felled as they were progressively dying and the replacement planting of native and other trees is now being actioned.

On 8 December 1993, the builders arrived to commence the erection of the Recreation Centre – the Trust Board project to commemorate the Wesley College sesquicentennial.

1994 – 2019

Due to a substantial bequest from Mr. T L Hames, the Board was able to heavily invest in the buildings on site during this period with a new Kitchen / dining room and three new dormitory blocks. Originally called Units A and B (both opened in 2003) and C; and later renamed Te Whare Maia, Te Whare Taina and Te Whare Pakeke.

The school was enhanced by students from the Pacific Islands, Tuvalu, Solomon Islands, Papua New Guinea and Fiji who were sponsored to Wesley College by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT).

2001 Thorndyke Law was the first female to be appointed to the position of Senior Prefect.

Mr. Ian Faulkner, MA (Hons), DipTchg, JP, the second former student to be appointed as Principal, commenced in February 2003. He was previously Principal of Reporoa College [1990 – 2002]. Prior to this Mr. Faulkner had held teaching and administrative positions at Opononi Area School [Deputy Principal 1986 – 1990] and Mangere College [Teacher, Dean and HOD 1972 – 1986].

At time of his appointment the College Board was restructuring the Boarding hostels from Teacher on Duty and Dormitory Prefect supervision to the appointment of resident House Parents to each dormitory. The Education [Hostels] Regulations 2005 introduced Hostel Licensing requirements to boarding establishments. The effect of these regulations was to increase the level of supervision for boarders and to set in place minimum standards for boarding staff proficiencies; as well as to prescribe minimum space requirements per boarder in hostels.

Rev. Faulkner had a particular focus on the Special Character and the implementation of Restorative Practices. These were hallmarks of Rev. Faulkner’s tenure.

Rev. Faulkner was ordained Presbyterian at the Centenary New Zealand Methodist Wellington Conference in 2012; and retired at the conclusion of the 2014 school year.

Mr Steven Hargreaves, BMS(Hons), DipTchg, who was previously the Deputy Principal of MacLeans College, took up the role of Principal from the beginning of 2015.

After three years in the role Mr Hargreaves returned to MacLeans College as Principal in 2018.

Dr Brian Evans, previously Principal of Kelston Boys’ High School, was appointed Principal from the beginning of



2018.

My recollections of life at Wesley Preparatory School during 1941 to 1943⁴

When the College buildings and farm were taken over for military purposes in August 1941 the Preparatory School was opened in the Harding Estate house⁵ on the slopes of Mount Wellington with Mr R.C. Clark as Principal and Head Teacher.

The roll, of about 12 boys, if my memory is correct, was comprised of primary school pupils from the Pacific Islands or those who could not be cared for by their New Zealand families. The school was run along similar lines to a small country school with several class levels and was taught by Mr Clark and I believe a lady teacher whose name I cannot recall. Mr Clark was still in charge of the Paerata facilities. Most of the roll were primary school boys but I recall two of secondary level. School was run along the normal course of 9am to 3pm, or thereabouts, and a short prep period in the early evening. I recall a short Church service on Sunday followed by a letter writing session.

The very large two storied house provided accommodation for the boys, the Clark family, and a small domestic staff. There was a space for bathroom and a recreation area. The schoolroom was at a slightly higher level and was reached up a short concrete staircase. Mrs Clark acted as Matron and controlled the domestic side of the school, such as meals, laundry, health etc.

There was a 'work roster' to cover such activities as sweeping the drive.

The surrounding area was somewhat mixed land use. Immediately in front, that is East, was the railway station (Mt Wellington, I think), the American Army base (Camp Bunn) and beyond that an area of market gardens, and in the distance we could see Point England. To the left, that is North, was a rocky and scrubby area that is today Stonefields and the Netball Centre. The only building of note in this area was the Knox Home. To the South, and in the distance, was the little settlement of Panmure with a Hotel, a shop or two and some houses.

Among activities, other than schoolwork there were long walks to Point England and around the few roads in the area. These walks were lead by the two secondary age boys. Of course the frequent scaling of the Mountain itself were accomplished on many occasions. Some American servicemen taught us the elementary skills of American Football and on a few occasions gifted us some candy.

In general my memories are of a happy time at Mt Wellington, but I must admit my recollections are somewhat vague and indistinct. Please remember that at this stage I was only 7 to 9 years old, with parents in Fiji, and a younger brother to lookout for⁶. I returned to Paerata in 1944 to complete my schooling, leaving at the end of 1949.

**WESLEY PREPARATORY SCHOOL
THIRD TERM, 1949**

My recollections of life at Wesley Preparatory School during 1947 to 1950

Warwick Harris

Unfortunately, Wesley Preparatory School did not have an annual school magazine like that of the Wesley College Collegian. I have written this to fill some of the gaps in the short history of the school. My brother Danie, now deceased, enrolled at the preparatory school in 1943 and at the College in 1947.

The notes I write are intended to build on those of Ian Wiseman shown above. Much of the physical environment of Wesley Preparatory School that he describes remained as they were in the years from 1947 to 1950 when I was a pupil there.

Before going to Wesley Prep I had spent my first year at the rural school at Taupaki, north of Auckland. There was no school uniform and we were barefooted and well-adjusted to running to and from school without shoes along gravel roads. I mention this as one my first recollections of Prep School is having to dress in a uniform and the difficulty I had in putting on shoes particularly tying up shoe laces.

By 1947 the school roll had grown to 30 primary school boys who were there for a variety of reason. Mr R.C. Clark resigned at the end of that year and was replaced by Mr W.E.V. Lowe who came from a career in the navy. It could be said that as Principal he "ran a tight ship" and our attendance at the school was well organized. This was balanced by the care and interest his wife and female domestic staff gave to the boys. This care was very important for the boys, who separated from home environments and often homesick after school holidays, benefitted from the mothering care they gave. There was a young female teacher (name not recalled) in my first years at the school and Mr A.B. Carter was there as a teacher in later years.



The large house, described by Ian Wiseman, which I know as Harding House, was full to capacity, including dormitories for thirty boys, accommodation for Mr and Mrs Lowe, the school office, kitchen, dining room, and bathrooms and likely a laundry at the back of the house. We were well fed, and well-groomed and dressed, as attested by the school photo of 1949 and an earlier year not dated. Behind the house along a path skirting the slope of Mt Wellington there was a cottage that accommodated domestic staff, but I do not recall any of them being accommodated in the main house.

Ian Wiseman describes the classroom being upslope from the house. If I recall correctly, I think by the time I was there, there were two classrooms, one an old small narrow classroom in behind a long water reservoir capped by a corrugated iron roof (providing water pressure for the house?) and a more modern classroom higher up the slope.

By the time I was at the school the American servicemen had all returned home but the landscape around the School, as described by Ian Wiseman, remained rural. There was a long drive way up to Harding House bordered by walls built of volcanic rock and trees to make an avenue. This ended in a circular turnaround, and at the right as you viewed the front of the house, there was an area for parking cars, and if I remember correctly, a garage and/or a shed for tools and a workshop.

On the upslope from the driveway there was lawn and ornamental trees and shrubs and these merged into a small area of bush and also an area covered by scrub. It is the wattle scrub that I especially remember as on one occasion, after an altercation with Mrs Lowe, I hid myself in an area of the wattle scrub. After I calmed down I picked a bunch of wattle flowers and took it to her as an apology and a peace offering. She accepted the flowers graciously but said she could not take them inside because of the superstition that taking wattle inside was a harbinger of bad luck!

Continuing above the fenced off area of the garden were the grazed slopes of Maungarei/Mt Wellington, the largest and youngest of Auckland volcanic scoria cones. Food storage pits and levelled terrace house sites of former occupation by Maori as a Pa were conspicuous. Maungarei has three small craters, and spreading northwards from the mountain were lava fields. From the House we had full view of active quarrying by "Steam Shovels" by Winstones and of the area now covered by houses of the Stonefields housing development and industrial buildings. In our free time we were able to roam the Mountain and the lava fields as natural playgrounds and likely gained knowledge of geology and natural history from these excursions.

To the right just before entering the end of the driveway there was access down slope to a flatter basin area at the bottom. This was used an area for overwintering by one of the circuses that travelled New Zealand at the time. If I remember correctly this was Sole Brother's Circus. We enjoyed interacting with the circus staff looking after the animals, and I particularly remember the elephants. I do not remember there being lions there. Likely they were kept in a more secure location away from the temptation of consuming small boys!

During the time at the school a small hall with a stage was built half way down the slope. One of the boys had a sledge with room for a passenger, so sliding down the slope and hauling the sledge back up hill again was an enjoyable pastime.

The school lacked a flat area large enough for a sportsground. I do remember playing cricket with the required bats, pads, ball, and wickets. I retain a memory of Mac Herewini, who in later life was an All Black, showing remarkably agile ability as wicket keeper. Another memory is of a boy who had a remarkable ability to avoid being tackled by any of the boys on the field, but had not learnt the objective of dotting down the ball at a specified end of the playing field.

The small number of pupils limited interaction with other schools. I remember visits to Dilworths and Monte Cecelia for sport and cultural activities and being sent to Kings School to sit a scholarship exam for assisted entrance to Kings College. Not being keen to go to that College I made sure that I avoided the possibility by my response to the interview and the exam.

It did not help when Kings School boys also taking the exam subjected me to ridicule and subjected me to their



amusement when I put mayonnaise on the pudding offered at lunchtime instead of custard. It happened to be my first encounter with salad dressing!

A regular event was going to Sunday School at Remuera Methodist Church. I can not recall how we got to and from there except from time to time we were taken home by parishioners for Sunday lunch and then brought back to school by them. We were given money for the collection at the Sunday School. I well remember singing "Dropping, dropping pennies, every one for Jesus, he shall have them all" at collection time.

Two special excursions I remember that were organized by the Lowes were school visits to Motutapu Island on a small naval vessel (with a gun mounted on its bow) and to a Solent Flying boat at the TEAL base at Mechanics Bay, Auckland Harbour.

I am certain that Mr and Mrs Lowe strove to improve the School and its standards. Two of the very few material mementoes that survive from my time at Wesley Preparatory School are an indication of this. One is the silver teaspoons given to boys at the end of their time at the school. These carry the shield with the three crowns but are without the scroll "Fide Litteris Labore". The other is the commendation on the book that I was given at the School prize giving at the end of 1948. The book was Daniel Defoe's Robinson Crusoe, and gives the signature of Mr Lowe and his BA qualification.

It would have been a great disappointment to the Lowes when the School was closed at the end of 1951 on the basis that it was not financially viable. An increase of the numbers on the roll, and an improvement of the facilities to support this increase probably requiring a move to a different location, would have been needed to establish financial viability. As indicated by information listed by the NZ Navy Museum at Torpedo Bay Auckland (see below). Mr Lowe returned to the navy and later went to Wellington to a position in the navy there.

Lieutenant W.E.V. Lowe was the Education Officer at *Ngapona* in the 1950s that was credited by the NZ Naval Board for success of the CNR scheme at *Ngapona*.

I suggest that it would be appropriate to include in the Wesley Register of Principals:

Mr W E V Lowe , BA, (Wesley Preparatory School 1947-1951).

Also, the teacher Mr A. B. Carter and others whose names can be found.

Also, Mrs Lowe to be included in the listing of Matrons.

With more than 70 years on since I started at Wesley Preparatory School much of my time there is forgotten or events not remembered. It would be good if others remain from that time also record their memories of the school and make corrections to what I have written.

SECTION III

The Wesley Training College Trust Board

BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND STAFF

The Wesley Training College Trust Board was instituted by Act of Parliament in 1911, and was formed to take over the functions of the former Native Education Trust and the Wesley College Executive Committee. Its function is to administer the affairs of the Trust under the general control and supervision of the Conference.

Right through the years from 1845 to the present day, the College has remained true to the original concepts of the purpose of the institution, i.e. to provide the best possible schooling for Maori and Island pupils to provide instruction in the tenets of the Christian religion as an integral part of this schooling and to assist in the preparation of pupils who may later seek ordination to the Ministry.

Over the years, the College has had to adjust itself to various winds of change from both the secular and the religious quarters, but has succeeded in doing so without being unfaithful to the original aims and without losing autonomy in the management of internal affairs. The most notable adjustments in recent years were made at the time of the move from Three Kings to Paerata.

At this time, it was decided to follow the policy of providing for European as well as for Maori and Island students. It was felt that coeducation of the Maori and European in the ratio of roughly one to two would result in benefits for both and would help to prepare the Maori pupil in a more realistic environment for later adult life in a community where Europeans far outnumbered the Maori people. In addition to enable the school to extend its advantages while still remaining economically viable, it was decided to charge moderate fees to all who can afford to pay them. These two changes in policy are in accordance with the provisions of the Trust and their administrative expression rests with the judgement of the Board and of Conference.

The following is a list of all who have served on the Board of Governors since the school was transferred from Three Kings to Paerata seventy years ago.

Worthy of especial mention, are the fine record of service given by three generations of the Caughey and Winstone families: first, Mr. Andrew C. Caughey (1892 – 1929): then three of his six sons, Mr. Hugh P. R. Caughey (1922-1928), J. Marsden Caughey (1929), and Mr. J. Stuart Caughey (1934-1981), and now continued by the present members, Mr. Brian K. Caughey who joined the Board in 1966 (son of Mr. Hugh P. R. Caughey). The Winstone family have likewise served for three generation. Mr. Geo. Winstone Snr (1830-1932) was the founder of the firm of Winstones Ltd.: Mr. Geo. Winstone Jnr (1922-1934) was one of his sons and Mr. Arthur M. Winstone (1952-add date), is a son of Mr. Geo. Winstone Jnr was Chairman of the Farm Committee (1961-1977).

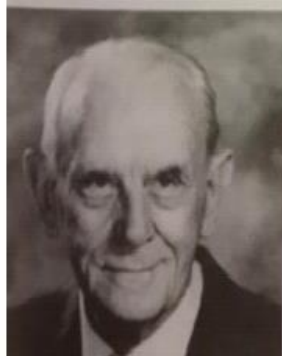

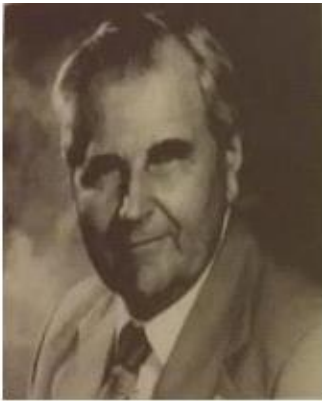

Members of the Staff

When the school had transferred from Three Kings to Paerata, Mr. R.C. Clark took over from the Rev. J.H.Simmonds in 1924, with 33 boys and two farm cadets. By the end of the school year, the roll had grown to 52 boys. Mr. N.W. Gilling and Mr. G. I. Laurenson were Mr. Clark's assistants (classified as Student Tutors); and both were studying for examinations as candidates for the Ministry. After this year, Mr. Laurenson left (he was ordained in 1931). The Rev. G I Laurenson, CBE, subsequently became general superintendent of the Methodist Home and Maori Missions (1964-1966) and of the Auckland West Circuit in 1967. He has served the College as a member of the Board of Governors for nearly thirty years. In addition, he is the author of important church histories. Because of his experience at Wesley College, Mr. Gilling decided to take up teaching as a career. Some years later, he returned to Wesley College as the Senior Assistant Master.

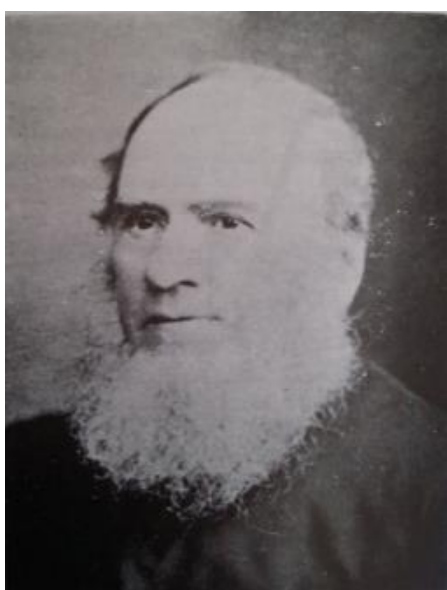

FORMER PRINCIPALS

The Rev. Thomas Buddle



The Rev. Thomas Buddle was born in Durham in 1812. He was ordained at Liverpool in 1839, and in the service of the Wesleyan Missionary Committee he arrived at Hokianga in the "Triton" in May 1840. He was first stationed at Whaingaroa (now better known as Raglan), but a few months later, following a request by Tamihana Te Rauparaha for a mission to be established near Wellington, he was assigned this task.

Unfortunately, the schooner taking him south was wrecked at Kawhia, and he had to return to Whaingaroa. After this adventure, he was directed to open a new mission at Kaihotea, a site near Te Kopua on the Waipa River. This was one of the two sites presented to the Wesleyans by Te Wherowhero, paramount chief of the Waikato Tribes, who was later to become the first Maori King.

During the four years that Mr. Buddle spent in the Waikato district, he also acquired a fluent command of the Maori language, became an expert in Maori folklore and customs, baptised several influential chiefs and many other people and started many native schools in villages in the territory

between Upper Mokau and Taupo. Mr. Buddle truly had his heart in his work. He loved and respected the Maori people and they in turn, loved and trusted him. Thus it was that when Te Wherowhero brought members of his tribes to the meeting in Remuera in 1844, he invited Mr. Buddle to be a member of the visiting party.

When the Superintendent, the Rev. Walter Lawry learned of his organising ability and of the wide esteem to which he was held, he decided that Mr. Buddle was undoubtedly the best man available to put in charge of the new school. Thus Mr. Buddle was the first Principal when the school was established at Grafton Road in 1844. In this position, he continued when the Institution was transferred to Three Kings until the arrival of his successor, the Rev. Alexander Reid in April 1849. In addition to his College duties, Mr. Buddle acted as financial secretary to the Wesleyan Missions in the South Seas. After leaving the College, he spent the next 20 year ministering to Maori and European congregations in Auckland and was Chairman of the district for some years. In 1858, while pastor of the Manukau Circuit he again superintended the school for a year when Mr. Reid had moved on to the Waipa Mission Station in the Waikato. As a result of the Maori-Pakeha Land Wars, the school closed down at the end of 1869; but when Wesley College reopened in 1876, he was again appointed Principal and served another six years until 1882. At the age of seventy years, he retired. He continued as a supernumerary minister until his death on 26 June 1963.

Rev. Thomas Buddle was a minister of strong character with a positive outlook and was a scholar with a flair for organising. He served as one of the Wesleyan representatives on Williams' Maori Bible Revision Committee and as one "intimately acquainted with the idiomatic niceties of the Waikato dialect", he assisted in revising the Rev. R. Maunsell's translation. He attended the first Australasian Wesleyan Conference in Sydney, of which he was President in 1861. In 1874, he was the President of the first New Zealand conference.

Besides his service as a pastor in the Auckland district, much against his personal inclination, he served in other

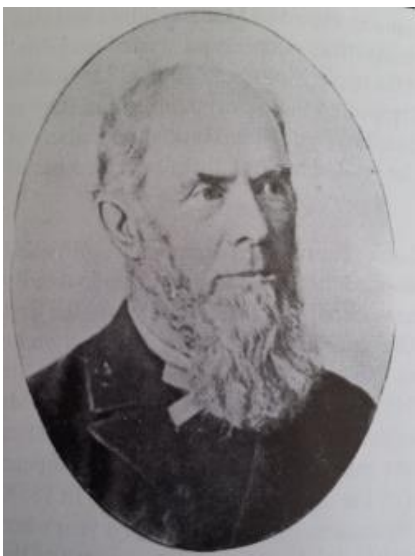


circuits, including Christchurch (1866), Wellington (1870) and Nelson (1873).

In addition, he played an important part in the Maori political movements of his time. In May 1860 with McLean Williams and Selwyn, he attended a great meeting at Ngaruawahia and took part in the discussions there. In the following year, he published a small pamphlet, "The Maori King Movement in New Zealand", setting forth his views.

Other of his publications were "The Aborigines of New Zealand" and "Christianity and Colonisation Among the Maori" (1873) in which he summed up the impact of Christianity upon Maori tribal life. He was a member of the Senate of the University of New Zealand from 1874 until 1880 and served on the Council of Auckland University College. For his work as a missionary and his service in the field of education, the memory of the Rev. Thomas Buddle will always be widely revered.

The Rev. Alexander Reid



When the move was made from Grafton Road to Three Kings, it was considered imperative that for the training of schoolmasters and preachers, one who himself was a trained teacher must be obtained. In response to an application made to the Missionary Committee in London, the Rev. Alexander Reid was appointed Principal and he and Mrs. Reid arrived in Auckland early in April 1849. "To Mr. Reid's vigour, energy, enthusiasm and eminent fitness for his task, the early success of the Institution was mainly attributable" writes Dr. Morley who knew him personally. "A Scotchman by birth, he was trained as a teacher in Glasgow and after being called and ordained to the Ministry of the Church, he was yet to end his life essentially a teacher and a teacher to the manner born. Soon acquiring the Maori language and becoming greatly interested in the welfare of the race, he inspired his pupils with a love for their work whether on the farm, in mechanical work or in the classroom. Early and late he toiled for them and with them while at the same time, taking his turn as one of the preachers in Auckland and its neighbourhood." Mrs. Reid also helped and worked with such unremitting devotion that eventually in 1858, a severe breakdown caused Mr. Reid to

resign from the school so that he could take her away from the strain. He removed to Waipa Mission Station, carrying on the work chiefly in the four chief cities of the colony. Then in 1885, he returned to his first love and at Three Kings remained once more as Principal for the next seven years until his death. "So, in 1891", records his friend Dr. Morley, "from the very spot to which he came to the colony, he was called to his reward."

The Rev. J.H. Simmonds



The Rev. Joseph Henry Simmonds was born at Spring Grove near Nelson in 1845. He was the son of Joseph Simmonds, a settler who later became a member of the Nelson Provincial Council. He was educated at Nelson and at Canterbury University College, and then for a short time, took up farming before he became a teacher. In 1869, he was ordained as a Minister of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. After two years in the Waikato, he served in Fiji from 1871 to 1873 and on his return to New Zealand, he was with the circuits in Canterbury, Wellington and Auckland districts. It was in 1889, the year in which he was stationed by Conference at Ponsonby that his most official connection with the school began when he was appointed as Secretary to the Board of Trustees.

Six years later, in April 1895, he was appointed Principal of Wesley College at Three Kings. From the beginning, he was filled with a vision of the future of the College which should be worthy of his Church.

Three steps were necessary to collect funds for new buildings, to select a more suitable site and finally, because the



foundation of our Trust rests on grants given by Governors Fitzroy and Grey to secure the sanction of Parliament.

In 1911, Parliament passed the Methodist Charitable and Endowment Trust Act which gave full powers to the Board to develop the school in new directions on the foundation of the old. In 1914, the Board purchased the present site at Paerata, but because of the Great War, building could not be commenced until early in 1922. In that year, a large sum of money was raised through an appeal made in connection with the Centenary of the Methodist Church in New Zealand and in 1923 the College was opened at its new site. When he had carried his plans so far, Mr. Simmonds decided to retire but he voluntarily carried on for another year in order that he might assist the Board in the appointment of his successor. In 1923, he travelled to Australia to interview applicants and it was on his recommendation that Mr. R. C. Clark was appointed as the new Principal.

One who knew him well recalls that Mr. Simmonds was a serious-minded man a good disciplinarian who did not smile easily. There was a streak of sternness about him." Among his pupils, he was known by the nickname of "Tika", which means upright, correct and if anything was not up to standard, they would say "That's not Tika". He was the one who first felt the need, especially for the good of the Maori boys, to broaden the scope of the school, to make it multi-racial in concept.

Mr. Simmonds was a man of wide interests. For a period, he was a member of the Council of Auckland University College and from 1896, he was a governor of the Theological Institute (in those days, theological training was conducted at the Three Kings College). He was also an authority on eucalypts and his book on the subject (recently reprinted) is still the standard work. It was he who was responsible for the idea of the plantings of the Gum trees at Wesley College in the first place. In his retirement, his love for the College never abated and the continued growth of the school and its plantations were ever a joy to him. He died in 1936 at the age of 91 years.

Mr. R. C. Clark, MA, DipEd



Mr. Roy C. Clark, MA (Melbourne), DipEd, was born at Ballarat, Victoria, Australia, in 1892. During the Great War, he served with the Divisional Signal Unit, A.I.F., from 1915 to 1919, then after two years as a lecturer in soil physics at Dookie Agricultural College, Victoria, he accepted an appointment as senior science master at Hutchins School Hobart. At the beginning of 1924, Mr. Clark was appointed Principal of Wesley College. The work he did during his 20 years at Wesley was very considerable. He built up the school roll and a curriculum that was well thought of by the Education Department's inspectors, teachers and members of the public. He was responsible for introducing modern equipment for the farm and school and for the setting-out of the school and lawns. He was always a lover of trees and with the encouragement, particularly of his predecessor, the Rev. J. H. Simmonds, he established the many fine shelter belts of eucalypts which are still today a feature of the College. During the time when the school's financial position was difficult, he converted the school's 681 acres of second-class land into a well established and productive farm with a pedigree Fresian herd, a Jersey herd, a stud sheep flock and pedigree pigs.

Energetic by nature, he found time also to give service in church work and to such bodies at the A and P Society, the Primary Production Council and the Farmers' Union. He was an omnivorous reader, a skilled debater, and a most effective preacher, always ready to initiate a discussion. He was dogmatic, capable and clever in debate, but never allowed a previous discussion to influence a subsequent question. Boys of the school remember him as a good organiser and firm disciplinarian, a lover of animals and of little children.

The disbanding of the College during its occupation by the Army was a bitter disappointment to Mr. Clark, but it was he who initiated the idea of the Preparatory School at Mt Wellington where he served as Principal until 1947.

Mrs. Clark was throughout a great help to her husband, not only as a wife but also whenever needed as a teacher. In 1944, Mr. A. Best who was Chairman of the Farm Committee wrote "Mr. Clark possessed great ability and his gifts are many, but his greatest asset is in his wife, Mrs. Clark, who without detriment to her gracious femininity is one of



the best examples I know of the justness of a woman's claim to equality with men." After many years at Mt. Wellington, Mr. Clark retired. Mr. and Mrs. Clark had four children, three sons and a daughter all born at Wesley College and each of the three boys attended Wesley College. Alexander (1938-44) was killed in an aeroplane accident during World War II. Bernard (1940-46) and David (1935-1945) were both married and living in Auckland, where their children are a joy, especially to their grandparents. The only daughter, Margaret, is living in Canada.

The Rev. E.M. Marshall BA, DipEd



Mr. E. M. Marshall, BA, DipEd, Principal from 1944 to 1964, the youngest son of the late Rev. G. T. Marshall, for many years an honoured minister of the Methodist Church of New Zealand, first came to Wesley College in January 1941 as Mr. R. C. Clark's first assistant. At the end of November in that year, he suffered a severe illness. "When I came to, I found that Japan had attacked Pearl Harbour, that the College had been taken over by the N.Z. Army and that slit trenches had been dug all over the place," said Mr. Marshall many years later. "Mr. and Mrs. R.C. Clark were residing at the Preparatory School at Mt. Wellington and so in 1942, I acted as headmaster after the army had gone, then later in 1942, the Americans took over and all the pupils except 15 boys, were dispersed. I remained at the College with my family, being responsible for these boys until the end of that year. "

In 1943, when the Americans handed back the buildings, Mr. Clark felt unequal to the strain of building up the College again and it was then, that the Board appointed Mr. Marshall to the post of Principal from the beginning of 1944. Mr. Marshall was at that time, 39 years of age. He was a trained teacher with experience in other secondary schools. The energy and ability with which he successfully rebuilt the College are evident from his "Recollections", recorded earlier in this Register. In 1948, he was ordained in the Ministry of the Methodist Church and from that time, was the College Chaplain as well as the Principal. In 1957, when the school was once more well established, he was elected Rotary International's District Governor of the Auckland Province and in the course of his travels, visited many churches and schools in the United States and the United Kingdom as well as in New Zealand. His aim throughout had been to reestablish not only the College itself but also its reputation as one of the leading Church schools of the Dominion. By his sincerity, by his selfless attention to detail, by his ability as an administrator, Mr. Marshall guided the College through a most difficult period. When the time came for retirement, Mr. and Mrs. Marshall and their family left the College sadly, high in the esteem of all connected with it.

Mr C.A. Neate MA, DipTchg



Mr. Clive A. Neate, MA, DipTchg, was Principal of Wesley College from February 1965 to December 1967. Born in 1926, he was possessed of a magnificent physique he was a player and a coach in many outside activities, including Rugby, Tennis, swimming and Life-Saving. After service in several High Schools, he was appointed an assistant master at Pukekohe High School in 1959. Two years later from 1961 to 1963, he was in Sarawak as an Educational Adviser to 64 schools under the Colombo Plan, and on his return to New Zealand, he was appointed deputy-Principal at Pukekohe High School.

On his arrival at Wesley College, his dynamic direction and leadership made itself felt immediately.

His energy, his thoroughness in administration as well as in organisation his genuine interest in the welfare and well-being of all members of the school and in the progress and achievements of each boy both in the classrooms and on the playing fields, and his delight in the school's success when teams and individual boys "acquitted themselves worthily", all these were infectious.

His habit of firm and instant decision gave confidence to parents, staff and boys alike. His approachability, understanding and his unselfishness and devoted service to the school has left an abiding impression, long after his



departure to the post of Principal of Pukekohe High School. With the cooperation of the Board of Governors, he made many improvements, and many tangible things remain to remind pupils of his headmastership to mention only one or two; the tennis courts, the second science laboratory, the spacious library and the newest classroom block. The College was deeply sorry to lose him.

Mr Edward Te R. Tauroa BAgSc, DipEd, DipTchg



Mr. E. TeR. Tauroa, BAgSc, DipEd, DipTchg, was for a time a pupil at Wesley College (in 1941), and he is the first Old Boy to have been appointed its Principal. His father, the Rev. Matarae Tauroa had also attended the College when it was located at Three Kings and his brother, the Rev. Lane Tauroa, BA was also a student. The Tauroa family has thus had links with Wesley College over a long period.

In 1965, when Mr. C. A. Neate was the Principal, Mr. Tauroa came back to the school as its first vice-Principal and three years later, in 1968 he was appointed Principal in succession to Mr. Neate. He capably filled this position for the next six strenuous years until at the beginning of 1974 he became Principal of the newly established Tuakau College.

After graduating at Massey University of Palmerston North in 1951, Mr. Tauroa taught at secondary schools in Taranaki and Northland and besides being active in many sports, he particularly devoted his ongoing devotion to the many calls made upon him and his energy. His enthusiastic leadership made it felt in all the classrooms as well as in the sports fields and besides maintaining the general upward trend in the total roll numbers, he succeeded in developing a body of healthy "all-round" students. Under his headmastership standards maintained high levels for Maori, Pakeha and overseas students alike, in academic as well as other fields.

A valued preacher in the Methodist Church, Mr. Tauroa regarded Wesley College as a trust, and as a practical expression of a Christian philosophy of education. By his own example and precept, he taught that the ideals of Christian life are relevant to the changing times and changing needs, to be reflected as providing joy and happiness and supplying every need. His influence has indeed left a profound impression.

Mrs. Tauroa took an active part in teaching when her help was needed, and gave valuable assistance also in administrative work and in many other ways. Her gentle, modest friendliness was an inspiration to all. Mr. and Mrs. Tauroa successfully led Wesley College through a period of great challenge. They left with the heart-felt good wishes of all.

Mr John McDougall ED, BAgSc, Dip Tchg



The new Principal was Mr. John McDougall. Before his appointment to Wesley College, he was Deputy-Principal of Rosehill College, Papakura. He was formerly Principal of Queen Victoria School Fiji, after several years as Head of Science at Takapuna Grammar School.

On taking up his appointment, Mr. McDougall introduced urgent measures to restore the balance of the roll to that suggested in a 1930s Board document on appropriate percentages of 30% Maori, 10% Pacific Islanders and 60% Europeans. He convinced the Trust Board to subsidise the fees for all Maori students so that some of the terms of the original land grants could be satisfied. By 1977, the roll was once again full with the suggested racial balance of students and by 1980, there was a waiting list of over 100 hopeful entrants.

Mr. McDougall's reputation for success with Pacific Island students followed him from Fiji with a consequent increase in enrolment. And he was further delighted in later years when the sons



and daughters of some of his Queen Victoria Old Boys began boarding at Wesley. When Mr. and Mrs. McDougall were sponsored by the Trust Board to tour the Pacific Islands in 1988, they experienced great satisfaction in seeing the success of Wesley Past Students where, particularly in Tonga and the Solomon Islands, they held many important posts in Government.

In 1973, both political parties made overtures to the New Zealand private schools to consider joining the State system. The socioeconomic background of many of the Wesley students convinced Mr. McDougall that there would be many financial advantages for this College with greater opportunities for the students and teachers while removing the financial burden of tuition fees from parents. The Wesley College Trust Board entered into two years of negotiations and with Mr. McDougall's insistence that the special character of the school would not be altered, an historic agreement was reached.

Wesley's efforts and outstanding legal arrangements became the blue-print for over 300 private schools who subsequently joined the state system. During this period, Mr. McDougall spent a considerable amount of his time addressing other private schools, particularly the Catholics on the merits of Integration.

In the late 1970s, Mr. McDougall prepared a paper on the "Philosophy of Education at Wesley College" which was accepted by the Trust Board and the newly elected Board of Governors as the guidelines for the future development of the College. In 1979, Mr. McDougall received the prestigious award of the Woolf Fisher Fellowship which allowed he and Mrs. McDougall to travel to the United States of America, Great Britain and Europe studying education. They elected to visit boys' boarding schools who had taken girls into their senior forms. They came back convinced that education at a secondary boarding school could not adequately prepare students in a single sex environment for later life. Supported by the Methodist Church they encouraged the Boards to move towards introducing girls into the senior school and this was realised in 1985. Further studies by the McDougalls in Australia in 1984 produced the design for the motel style girls' hostel which at its time was considered an outstanding arrangement for boarders.

Mr. McDougall was always concerned for the individual needs of his students and to this end, he asked the Trust Board to move away from the barrack style dormitories to more personal cubicle style bed and study designs. This was accomplished with the construction of Caughey and Denton Halls and the redesign of Harding Hall.

Although academic attainments are a priority in all schools and he was delighted when 20 students gained Bursary passes in 1988, Mr. McDougall was not hidebound by single minded desires for just examination success. He kept abreast of modern educational trends but he insisted that all students also take part in sport or extra mural activities. During his Principalship, new academic subjects introduced in addition to the traditional syllabuses were Art history, Classical Studies, Senior Agricultural Science, Horticulture, Computer Awareness, Pacific Studies, Transition Education and Health Studies.

No boarder had an excuse of boredom for extra activities introduced were Maori Culture Inter-house competitions, Maori Carving, Waka racing, Yachting, Rowing, Boxing, Wrestling, Tae Kwon Do, Cooking, Netball, Soccer, Golf, Bridge, Chess and College Balls. His concern was to keep a reasonable balance between religious experience in preparation for adulthood. One area in which he derived personal pleasure was from the introduction of Soccer into a traditional Rugby school, particularly when the First XI won 5 Manukau titles in five successive years.

He considered keeping the school comparatively small and essentially boarding were fundamental to achieving the aims of its special character of a Christian, multiracial, coeducational institution with a family environment. He looked on every student as his own 'parental responsibility' and he strove to know the personal background of each of his charges, to achieve this, he and Mrs. McDougall had a full involvement in the total life of the school.

He was never 'desk bound' and his apparent endless supply of energy carried into the classrooms, milking shed, horticultural block, chapel, dormitories, hospitals, kitchen, sportsfields and staff rooms. He was even seen as a Minibus driver ferrying busloads of St Cuthberts girl's home from socials and in the holidays he took over the duties of the Herald boys.

As a break from the College routines he enjoyed his weekly attendance at Rotary meetings, he saw this as service relaxation and an important link between the College and the Pukekohe/Franklin community. He was President of the Rotary Club in 1983 and District Chairman for the Holiday Camps held for the Handicapped Children at Camp



Morley. At Wesley he continued his interest in sports administration, becoming Chairman of the Northern Region's Secondary Schools Rugby Union and foundation chairman of the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby Council, a position he held from 1977 to 1981 and he was elected a Life Member for his services to Rugby. In 1983, he represented New Zealand at the World Youth Conference on rugby held in Oxford, United Kingdom.

On Mr. McDougall's retirement from Wesley after 15 years of commitment, the then District Inspector of Secondary schools wrote to Mr. McDougall "the high esteem with which your students regard you and their school is a fine measure of the success of your leadership. Your unflagging devotion to the College has won you the respect and affection of your colleagues and students."

Who could ask for anything more?

Mr Graeme V. Cowley JP, MSc (Hons), Dip Tchg



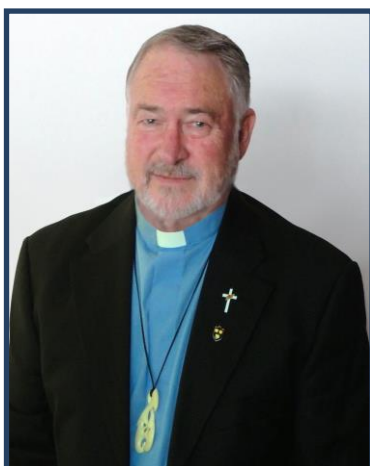
Graeme V. Cowley J.P., M.Sc., (Hons) DipTchg was appointed to Wesley College in 1989 having previously been Principal of Te Kuiti High School (1978-1984) and Principal of Rutherford High School (1984-1988).

Mr. Cowley was educated at Morrinsville College and Hamilton Boys' High. While studying for his degree at Auckland University, he attended Trinity College as a hostelman, when the Rev. Eric Hames was Principal. He gained teaching experience at Matamata College when he became Head of Science and he was subsequently Head of Science at Waimate and Tokoroa High Schools. In 1975, he was appointed Deputy Principal of Te Kuiti High School and at the time of his appointment to Principal of that school, he was one of the youngest Headmasters in New Zealand (35 years).

Mr. Cowley was Chairman of the Central North Island Principals Association and an Executive member of the Auckland Heads Association. In 1989, Mr. Cowley was appointed a Justice of the Peace. He is currently Chairman of the Manukau Principals Association and the Trust Board's representative at the Association of Proprietors of Integrated Schools.

In sports, Mr. Cowley was a Rugby referee and officiated at the New Zealand Swimming Championship as a Referee. Mrs. Jennifer Cowley, as well as supervising the school and university education of their four children, is the Wesley College organist and an administrative assistant in the College office.

Rev Ian Faulkner, JP, MA (Hons), DipTchg



Ian Faulkner, JP, MA(Hons), DipTchg, the second former student to be appointed as Principal, commenced in February 2003. He was previously Principal of Reporoa College [1990 – 2002]. Prior to this Mr. Faulkner had held teaching and administrative positions at Opononi Area School [Deputy Principal 1986 – 1990] and Mangere College [Teacher, Dean and HOD 1972 – 1986].

Mr. Faulkner trained as a teacher at the Epsom Secondary Teachers' College, and attended Auckland University part-time during this training, and while teaching, attained a Masters Degree in History in 1978. Mr. Faulkner was appointed as a Justice of the Peace in 1997.

During his student years at Wesley College Mr. Faulkner developed an interest in politics and the influence of faith on the development of just political structures. He also appreciates the place that sport plays in the lives of young people.

Mr. Faulkner was the first New Zealander to be appointed by the International Hockey Federation as an umpire to



both a World Cup (Bombay 1980) and an Olympic Games [Los Angeles 1984]. Mr. Faulkner is currently a member of the Executive of Auckland Secondary Schools' Heads Association [ASSHA], the governing body for College Sport, responsible for the management of Auckland Secondary School Sport; and a member of the Counties-Manukau Alternative Education Committee.

Mr. Faulkner's appointment coincided with the Wesley College Trust Board's decision to appoint resident House Parents to each dormitory. The Education [Hostels] Regulations 2005 introduced Hostel Licencing requirements to boarding establishments. The effect of these regulations was to increase the level of supervision for boarders and to set in place minimum standards for staff proficiencies. The expected duty of care provisions in this context led to the employment of a separate boarding staff. Full-time teaching staff could no longer be full-time boarding staff and vice-versa. After a structural review the Hostel Council was established in 2008 to provide the opportunity for the Trust Board, Board of Trustees, parents and boarders to share information in a collaborative way to promote positive outcomes in the hostels. In 2009 the Deputy Principal Boarding position to lead the boarding staff was established.

A focus on the Special Character and an implementation of restorative practices are hallmarks of Mr. Faulkner's tenure. While on sabbatical leave in 2010 Mr. Faulkner investigated Special Character Education in a Wesleyan / Methodist context, informed by his experience of Wesley College New Zealand and visits to Wesley College, Perth, Australia and Kingswood School, Bath, United Kingdom (the school established by John Wesley). The sabbatical report submitted to and published by the Ministry of Education and an earlier paper, the Methodist Ethos, have been widely circulated in the Connexion.

Mr. Faulkner was ordained Presbyterian at the Wellington Conference in 2012 and retired at the end of 2014.

Mr Steven Hargreaves, BMS (Hons), Dip Tchg Principal 2015 – 2017



Mr Steven Hargreaves came with a background of achievement to Wesley College in February 2015. After his secondary schooling at Otamatea High School, where he was Dux and Deputy Head Boy and earned both the Gold Duke of Edinburgh and Queen's Scout awards, he went to Waikato University and earned a BMS (Hons) degree in business economics. Employment with Telecom, SC Johnson and NBC TV in London preceded Teacher Training in Auckland. Steven's subsequent teaching career spanned teaching Mathematics and Economics at Otahuhu College from 1998 to 2001, and then Macleans College from 2002 to 2014, where he became a House Leader and then Deputy Principal, prior to appointment as Principal of Wesley College. Steven coached the Macleans College 1st XV for 8 of these years.

On a personal sporting level Steven was a member of the Northland NPC squad for 1993 and 1994, played fullback and winger for the Northland B team and was a member of the Northland 7's team. Steven enjoys athletics and has capped his junior achievements at a national level with Masters Athlete titles in New Zealand, Australian and Oceania competitions in sprints, long jump and javelin.

Steven married in 1994 and has two children. He returned to Macleans College as Principal in 2018.



Dr. Brian Evans, ONZM, PhD, MEd, BA, Dip Tchg
Current Principal



Dr Evans was born and raised in Wellington, where as a young person he attended and boarded at St Patricks College in Silverstream; a State Integrated Catholic Boys day and boarding school.

Dr Evans first began his career at New Plymouth Girls High School teaching from 1988-1990.

Dr Evans then travelled to the United Kingdom teaching at two urban high schools from 1990-1996. On his return from the United Kingdom, he established an education business that focused on teacher recruitment and professional development. Following eight years of intensive work developing the company, he sold the business as a highly successful enterprise.

In 2005 Dr Evans passion for teaching was never far from his mind returning to the education sector as a newly appointed Deputy Principal at De La Salle College, a Catholic school for boys in Mangere. Dr Evans also Acted as Principal during this tenure.

In 2010 Dr Evans coached the World Cup winning New Zealand Black Ferns rugby team and received an ONZM for services to rugby. He also coached the national and world championship winning Secondary Schools 1st XV rugby team's at De La Salle College and Kelston Boys High School. He is a member the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby Union board.

In 2011 Dr Evans was appointed Principal of Kelston Boys High School. He lead an ongoing and intensive review and restructure of senior management and faculty leadership teams, school processes and systems to improve teaching practice and enhance student learning. He also chaired the West Auckland Principal's group.

In 2018 Dr Evans was appointed Principal of Wesley College.

In early 2019 Dr Evans completed and graduated as a doctor of philosophy (education). His PhD research focused on "Cultural capital and how it influences educational achievement". Completing an academic research at a doctoral level provide him with a deep understanding of the New Zealand educational landscape and the major elements which impact student outcomes.

SECTION IV

Wesley College Old Boys' Association

(formed on 24 October, 1926)

Wesley College Old Students' Association

The Wesley College Old Students' Association [WCOSA] is the successor to the Wesley College Old Boys' Association that was formed in 1927, at a time when a group of Old Boys of the Paerata College could be identified: the College having completed its move from Three Kings in 1923.

The Foundation Officers of the Association were:

Patron: Rev J.H. Simmonds (Foundation Principal, Paerata)

President: Mr R.C. Clark (Principal from 1924)

Vice-Presidents: Rev Eruera Te Tuhi (enrolled 1904 at Three Kings) and Mr K.D. Henderson (enrolled 1924)

Committee: B.R. Hiskens (1923), C.H. Harding (1924), D. Raikes (1924), T.J. Stacey (1925).

Secretary-Treasurer: Mr G.T. White (1924)

In 1986 the name of the Association was changed to the Wesley College Past Students' Association. This recognised that female students had returned to Wesley College in 1985, following a 125 Year break: now recognised as Past Students. At some point following this the name was again changed to the Wesley College Old Students' Association. Two of the current WCOSA Executive have been Officers of the Association for a lengthy period. Mr J.S. Cheeseman,



first elected to the Committee in 1968, was then a teacher at the College, and Mr E. Lepper, a 1949 student and current Vice-President, was first elected in 1988.

The Old Boys' / Old Students' Association have provided the funds for a number of significant amenities over the years. The 1944 swimming pool was followed in 1953 by the In Memoriam Plaque in the Chapel, listing the names of those who 'paid the supreme sacrifice' in the Second World War, the Memorial Gates at the southern entrance to the College in 1956, the filtration plant for the swimming pool in 1962, and a complete overhaul of the Chapel organ was funded in 1967.

For many years the annual Old Students' Reunion was held on the first weekend of October. This memorialised the 7 October 1844 Colonial Government Land Grant of 6 and three quarter acres in Grafton to the Wesleyan Missionary Society for the purpose of establishing the Wesleyan Native Institution. In subsequent years the date of the reunion has varied so that it could be held while there were boarding students in residence. A change from a three term to four-term year now means that the first weekend of October falls within the school holidays. Over the years not all reunions have been held at the College. In 1949 the reunion dinner was held at Westhaven Yacht Club and in 1957 it took the form of a picnic cruise on the Waitemata Harbour.

For many years there was a keenly competed rugby match between the Old Students and current students for the Hickling Cup. There were those won by the Old Students, one of which was joyously recorded in the 1952 Collegian.

Since 1924 the record shows that the Association has enjoyed periods of strength and other times when it operated only in memory. That in some years no elections were held indicates minimal interest and that a formal annual reunion was not held; while at other times, e.g. the 1941 – 1947 War years any gathering was impossible. At present there is a dedicated group of former students and friends of the College meeting regularly that keep memories and old-student aspirations for the College alive.

As the Association marks the 175th year since the foundation of the College at Labour Weekend 2019, the Officers are:

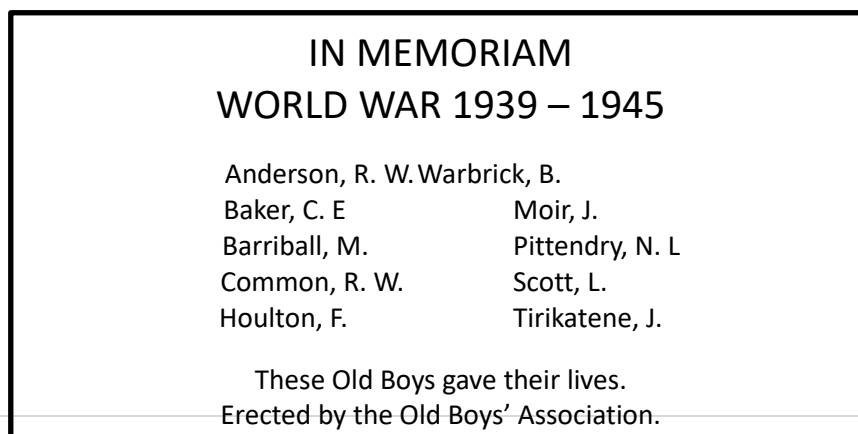

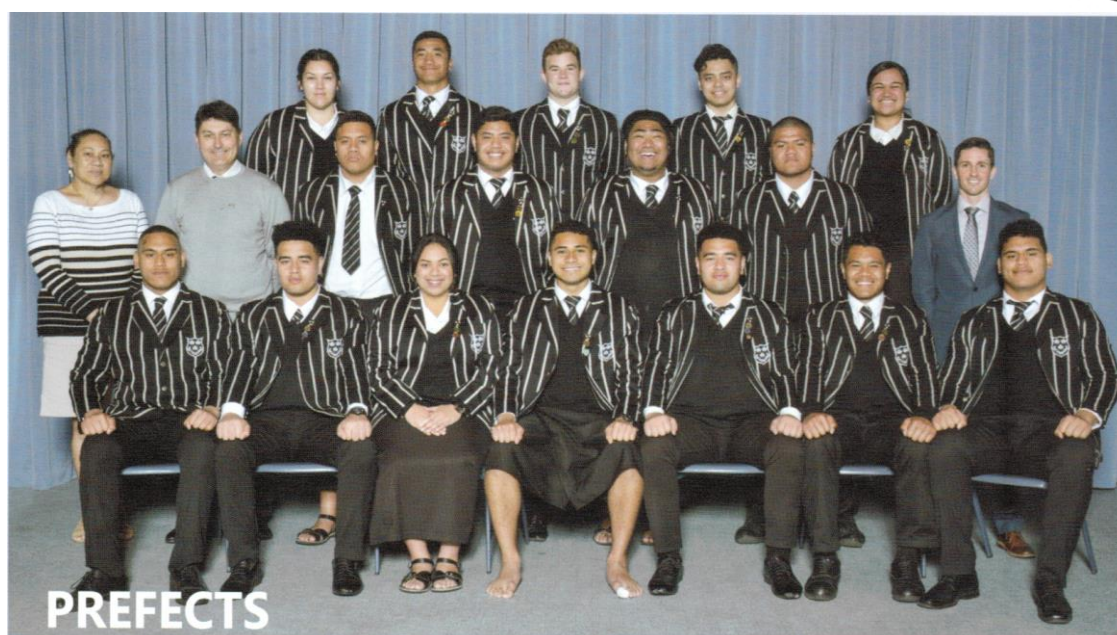

When the College transferred to Paerata from Three Kings in 1922, at first there was only one house. This was the wing nearest the present dining hall. In 1926, the other wing nearest the hospital was opened by the Minister of Education, the Honourable Sir Christopher Parr. This wing soon filled and in order to provide competition, it became feasible to start a second house (School House) in 1926. Subsequently, Winstone House was formed in 1961 and honours members of the Winstone family; and in 1964, Stanton House was established and named to commemorate the Hon. 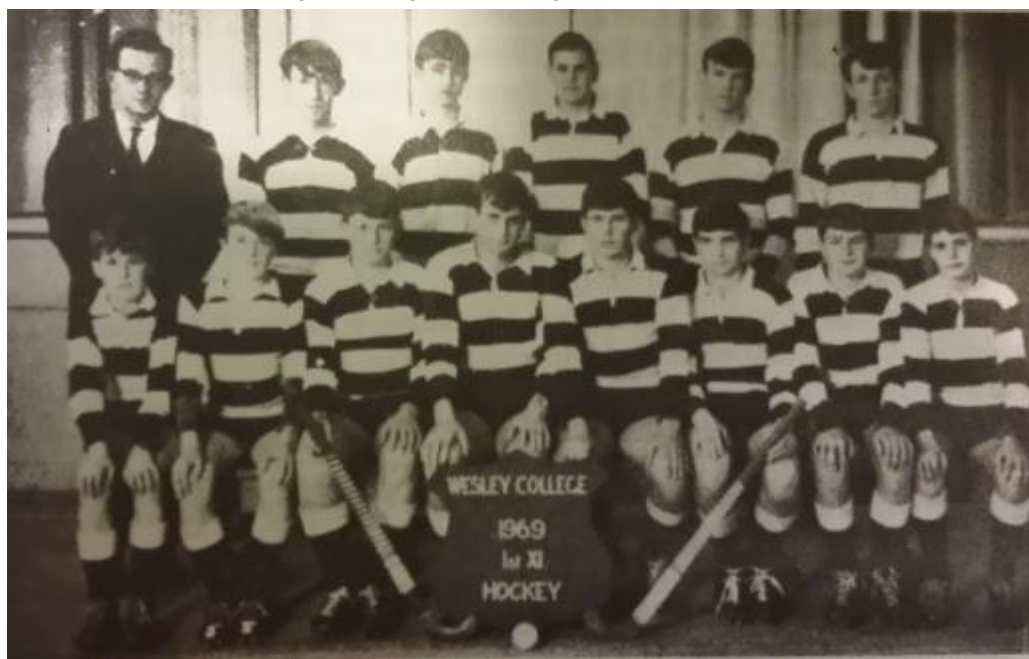

SECTION VII

Through the Years

(based mainly on extracts from the Collegian)

1924

This was the year in which Mr. R. C. Clark took over from the Rev. J. H. Simmonds. He was assisted by G. I. Laurenson and Mr. N. Gilling. Initially there were only eleven boys, but an influx of new entrants soon raised the number of 33 boys and 2 farm cadets and by the end of the year, the roll had grown to 52. At this time, all boys were quartered in the dormitory nearest the present dining room, for only half of the pre western wing of the house had been completed and the erection of the northern wing had not yet been commenced. After the first term commenced, in response to an application by the Board of Governors the College to be recognised as a Registered Secondary School, a visit was made by School Inspectors, and the Education Department granted the application. This meant in subsequent years candidates from Wesley College were eligible for the award of the Department's Certificates, Boarding Allowance and other benefits.

The Head Boy was Keith D. Henderson, who after passing the Matriculation (University Entrance) examinations, stayed on for a further two years as a pupil-teacher. Later he passed through the Teacher's Training College, and served much of his career the Maori School service in some very isolated schools. For many years he was headmaster of the Bethlehem Maori School, Tauranga, until his retirement in 1968. He married a teacher, the lady who has now become the well known authoress, Sylvia Ashton-Warner. Mr Henderson was a strong, steady man of fine character. He died in Tauranga in 1969.

1925

The first issue of 'The Collegian' was published. Mr. J. V. Burton was the editor and Mr. H. H. Hickling was his assistant. The Principal, Mr. R. C. Clark, writes in his editorial: "We are young and rejoice in Ivy-clad walls, time-honoured buildings, rolls of honour and fame these look ahead." In this year, extensions were made to the buildings for the number of pupils now totalled 75 and reference is made to the making of the Quadrangle, the "open-air" sleeping quarters (the verandahs have since been glassed in), and the beginning of a Horticulture course. Military drill cadet uniforms were taken by Sgt-Major Milne, a library of 108 books had been established and experimental garden plots had been commenced. On the farm a cow with twin calves is reported and a ewe with three lambs, the fact that the College farm is now on Town Supply and the making of a metal road to the stables. In sports, there are reports of hockey, rugby, cricket, tennis, boxing, wrestling, paper-chases and cross-country races of 8 miles over gruelling country. Prepared speeches, debates and socials seem to have been well organised.

"I am not sure who chose the school motto, but I think it was first used by the Rev. J. H. Simmonds", writes Mr. Clarke in 1973. "The crest was entirely my own idea. The three crowns indicate the Three Kings where the old school was really born. The general outline was made by the artist at the Unity Press who did all our printing in my time."

1926

In this year, the roll number reached the 100 mark and the staff comprised five full time and two part time teachers. Mrs. L. M Angrove was the Matron and Mr. J. E. Bell was the farm manager with four assistant workers. Mr. J. V. Burton, BSc., was the senior master. He stayed at the school for 12 years and eventually became Principal of Edward VII Technical College. On 17 April, the second 'L' of the brick dormitory block was officially opened by the Minister of Education, Hon. Sir James Parr. The quadrangle facing east was thus completed and a science laboratory added (now the locker room nearest to the ablutions area.) At this time, the school fee was £60 per annum for European boys and £12.10s per annum for Maori boys.



1927

The highlight was the opening of the College Memorial Hospital. The memorial tablet records:

In Memoriam
William Henry Caughey
who gave his life for others in the
Great War.
Buried at Cologne, Germany,
16th February 1919
Aged 29 years
Erected by his Aunt Marianne Smith
April, 1927.

William Henry Caughey was a grandson of Mr. Andrew C. Caughey. His father was also named William Henry and was the brother of Mr. Stuart Caughey, Mr. J. Marsden Caughey and Mr. Hugh P. R. Caughey.

It was at this time that the College adopted the wider policy encouraging the admittance of (*edit. Pacific*) Island boys to the College in accordance with the terms of the Act of 1911, and in Mr. Clarke's own words: "to help raise awareness of the Island people through the College, of the Church's concern for their welfare: to train students who would later return as an influence for good in their own communities; and by internationalising the College to some extent to help New Zealand students to a deeper appreciation of and respect for the individualities of the Island peoples". This policy has been continued ever since and occasionally has been extended to the acceptance of boys from Singapore and Malaysia.

1928

Mr. A. E. Lock, BSc, joined the staff and stayed for five years. Some years later he became Principal of Rongotai Boy's College, Wellington. He was an amateur astronomer of some repute. The 1st XV did well this year and played two strenuous games with St. Stephens winning the first 6-3 and losing the return match, 8-6. The senior hockey XI went through the season undefeated, though it only just managed to win the final exciting game with Waiuku High School. In tennis, swimming and boxing there was keen competition and in the athletic sports, several records were made. The N.C.Os in the Cadet Company were: Company Sergeant-Major, M.D.T. Walters; Colour- Sergeants, E.J. Bycroft and J. Williams; Corporals, N.C. Moon, J.O. Anderson, P. Tipoli, Lance-Corporals, also B.D. Gina, J. Tukua, J. Beever, J.C. Allum. The Old Boys Association held its first reunion dinner at the College on Monday night, 22 October 1928. There were 26 members present and many toasts were honoured. A happy and successful evening was brought to a close with the singing of "Auld Lang Syne."

1929

Another generous gift by Mrs. Marianne Caughey Smith, the beautiful W. H. Smith Memorial Chapel was consecrated by the President of Conference on 23 February, 1929 and ever since, has remained in daily use as the centre of the College's religious life.

At the end of this year, J. Beever gained the Higher Leaving Certificate: J. C. Allum, R. Harris, and R. Ihaka passed the Matriculation (University Entrance) examination; H. G. Hutt, R. F. Boyce, L. M. Scott, A. W. Shepherd S. M. Pritchard, F. G. Cutler and R. P. Henry gained passes in the Public Service Entrance examinations.

1930

For the first time, the First Cricket XI won the Taylor Shield in the Pukekohe Senior Competition. Prior to Easter, a Passion Play, "Via Crucis", written by Mr. O. E. Burton, was presented in the Chapel to a packed congregation and towards the end of the third term, a Nativity Play, also written and produced by Mr. Burton, deeply impressed the crowded Chapel by its theme and its interpretation by the various players. On November 6th, a Life Saving Squad under M. B. Knott, gave a display of land drill. This was the first exhibition of its kind at the College. For the first time also, a College orchestra was formed and rendered selections at concerts and social functions.



The members were: R. F. Boyce (piano); L. Scott, J. F. Breingan, J. Suckling (violins); R. Kaho, J. Key (concerts). A striking feature of this year's farm operation was the marked increase in the number of stock: 80 dairy cows, 160 cattle, 1000 Romneycross ewes, 140 stud Southdown ewes and 30 Reyland ewes, 26 breeding sows, over 80 boars and young pigs. In addition, poultry sales exceeded those of previous years. 300 tons of ensilage were made and 150 tons of hay. The price of butterfat this year dropped to 9d. per lb. and wool fell to 5d., low prices which severely tried the optimism of all.



VISIT OF LORD BLEDISLOE, 1933

1931

A feature of chapel services this year was the rendering of solos at different services by Mrs. O.E. Burton, Mr. A.C. Orr, Mr. J.V. Burton and Mr. M. Walters. Among the highlight this year were an Easter Bible Class Camp at Brown's Island which 16 boys attended; the presentation by Mr. R. A. Scott of Auckland of the School Honours Board; a lantern lecture by Mr. R. Falla of the Auckland Museum on "The Douglas Mawson Antarctic Expedition". Instead of weekly cadet parades as formerly held, full-day parades were held monthly throughout 1931. On W. Swanson's retirement at the end of the first term. G. S. Stevenson was promoted to Sergeant and the Corporals were R. Rogers, J. Rogers, W. Muriwai and L. Carachan. The 1st XV lost only two games in each case by one point only and came runner-up in the competitions. J. Rogers, J. Carnachan, R. White, R. Kaho and F. Rogers each gained rugby representative honours. In December, assisted by the orchestra, the College choir for the first time in the school's history rendered a Cantata, "The Nativity of Christ" (Caleb Simper). A large congregation was present including visitors from as far afield as Auckland.

1932

The prevailing world-wide economic depression created great difficulties for the College. The roll number dropped by nearly half to boys and while income from the farm also fell markedly, little reduction was possible in overhead expenses necessary to keep the school running as an efficient unit. Nevertheless, all the usual activities continued as normally as possible on the farm and within the school with sustained vigour and there is little indication in the Collegian of the great strain through which the whole institution was passing.



1933

For the first time the annual athletic sports were held on the newly leveled sports field near Paerata Road and this straw is a small indication of improvement after the gloomy preceding year. The roll number recovered slightly to 61 boys. The Church made a great effort to help and the increased roll was the result of a new Scholarship scheme. Better butter prices and an excellent wool sale further improved the position. "We look forward to the future with confidence", reported the Principal, Mr. R. C. Clark. Towards the end of the year, on 24 October, the school was deeply grieved to learn of the death of Richard (Dick) Kaho.

He had entered the College during the last term in 1927 and he remained here until August. Two months later he dies in Auckland Hospital. News of his death indeed came as a tremendous shock for his exemplary and short, young life had made an indelible impression on all of his school mates. Of quiet and unassuming character, he had a personality which made him a true leader. "He was the best cricketer we ever had" and was captain of the 1st XI for six years in succession. In addition, he had held office as a School Prefect for four years and had always taken a full part in all school activities. Not the least part of his make-up was his real faith in Jesus Christ. Memories of him and of his influence are still very precious to all who knew him.

1934

At the close of this year, Mr. C. M Croft, Trade Commissioner for Canada, presented the prizes as follows: Dux, H. Rogers; Senior Prefect's Prize, R. Common; Form Prizes: I. Clark (Form 1), J. Oien (Form 2), T. Becroft (Form 3), L. Bennett (Form 3B), L. Baxter (Form 4D), D. Metherell (Form 4B), H. Rogers (Form 5). Cadets: R. Common. Scripture Prize, J.Oien. Maori War Memorial Prizes for Agriculture: L. Cook, H. Rickit, W. Edwards. Athletics: J.Labarre (junior), and H. Rogers (senior). Shooting: J.Oien (Lees Cup) and F. Storey (Lady Godley Cup). Tennis: J. Oien (junior) and L. Cook (senior). Cricket: A.C. Vosailagi (Stembridge Club). Prepared Speech: C. Baker and J. Hayman (junior). Bronze Medals: F. Storey (100yds senior), L. Cook (220 senior), G. Boyle (880yds senior), D. Metherell (120yds hurdles); D.Rogers (shotput); A. C. Vosailagi (throwing cricket ball and high jump). Silver Medals: L. Baxter (1 mile and Senior Cross Country); L. Bennett Junior Cross Country and 880yds); M. Robertson Junior High Jump (120yds hurdles, Broad Jump, Hop-step and jump.) Winstone Cup: School House. (R. I. Elliott, captain).

1935

After six years at the College, Mr. O. E. Burton left early in the first term to join the Methodist Ministry. Cricket and rugby teams did well. In football, the 1st XV played three games with each of the local secondary schools and the results were: v Pukekohe High School: won 16-3, drew 3-3, lost 6-8: v. St Stephen's School: won 11-0; won 32-8; won 14-3. Six boys were selected to represent the Franklin Secondary Schools to play Sacred Heart College: D. Rogers, L. Bennett, W. Edwards, D. Metherell, J. Joseph and R, Elliott. A highlight of the year was the performance of "Grand Circus" produced by Miss. Granger and Mr. Lidgard, a realistic affair including performing elephants, dogs, fleas and clowns.

1936

The school was deeply moved to learn of the death of Jimmie Joseph after a short illness in the Waikato Hospital. Before he left the College to join the railways at Te Kuiti he had been a prefect and a fine athlete and had also represented the College in cricket, football and tennis.

Mr. C. D. Barker, the music master, left and Mr. C. Laurie commenced his long period of service until 1960. An unusual incident occurred when Mr. Knott's cottage took fire while he was at milking. Seven new records were made in the annual Athletic Sports and two were equaled.

1937

Various changes in the staff took place this year with the departure of two masters, Mr. W. C. A. Aldis and Mr. J. V. Burton (who had been at Wesley College for almost 12 years), Miss. Gainher (assistant matron), Mr. M. Dunn (secretary) and Mr. G. A. Blake (farm manager). In May, Mr. M. D. T. Walters represented the Northern Maori and the Wesley College Old Boys) at the Coronation of King George VI and two oak trees were planted before the assembled pupils near the sports field, one by J. Oien. A house was erected for the new farm manager, Mr. H. J. Barber.



1938

That the worst of the economic depressions was over was reflected on the increasing roll number which in 1932 had dropped to only 54 boys. The roll this year comprised 82 boys as follows: Form IV, 17; Form III, 27; Forms I and II, 13; Standards 3 and 4, 10 boys; cadets, 3. After a period of inactivity since 1931, in June the Old Boys Association held a well attended reunion. At the dinner, a happy spirit prevailed and reminiscences of the Rev. E. Te Tuhi (1904) and Mr. F. Ormsby (1921) reminded those present of the College's origin at Three Kings. In this year, the Chaplain, the Rev. H.H. Jeffreys left and in his place, the school welcomed the Rev. E. G. Slade, MA.

1939

Innovations this year were a Bible Class of 30 members conducted by J. Oien assisted by L. Buckingham (secretary) and A. Phillips (organist), an Horticultural Society with A. W. Vosailagi as Chairman, and a Dramatic Club formed by Mr. P. A. Hickling. The dramatic club was the most popular and produced several plays, the three major performances and the casts being: "The Dear Departed" (J.Tirikalene, B. Warbrick, A. Eustace, R. Mikkelson, D. Asher); "The Old Bull" (L. Buckingham, R. Varnell, S. Andrews, D. Clark, J. Oien); "The Great Cham's Diamond" (C. Phillips, L. Buckingham, A. Eustace, C. Hayward, F. Hulton). The first XV won the Franklin Junior competition and the second cricket XI went through the year undefeated, The Athletics Sports saw the introduction of an Intermediate Grade for boys 14 to 16 years of age. In the third term, excitement was caused when a moving picture was taken to be shown at New Zealand's Centennial Exhibition in Wellington next year under the title of "A Day in the Life of Wesley College". The film was later also shown at the Methodist Conference, a valuable record indeed.

1940

Of the Board of Governors this year, Mr. J. Stuart Caughey, the Rev. G. I. Laurenson, the Rev. Dr H. Ranston and the Rev. A. J. Seamer are the only members still serving in 1974. Of the farm employees under Mr. H. J. Barber, in 1940, Mr. F. H. Hartridge (who arrived in 1938 for the test dairy and garden) is now the only member of the team still at the College in 1974. After 13 years, Mr. P. A. Hickling resigned to go to West Christchurch High School and his position was filled by the appointment of Mr. E. M. Marshall, BA, DipEd. During the third term, the College was honoured by visits by the Minister of Education, the Hon. H. G. R. Nason and later by the Director of Education, Dr C. E. Beeby. Another highlight was a talk, illustrated by slides by the Rev. G. I. Laurenson, Superintendent of Home and Maori Missions. A model aeroplane club organised by Mr. P. A. Hickling was popular this year, The "Collegian" records the names of Old Boys serving in the armed forces, either in training or overseas, including several members of the Maori Battalion.

1941

There was a full school in 1941 and some good work was done scholastically, in horticulture and on the sports field. Shortly, after the opening of the war with Japan, the military authorities took over the College buildings and the Principal's house and the College closed. Mr. and Mrs. Clark moved to Wellington Park, Panmure which had recently come into the hands of the Board. The "Collegian" was not published in this year.

1942

The military personnel vacated the premises on 7 February and the College reopened ten days later with 80 boys. Mr. Clark continued to reside at Mt. Wellington supervising the College and the farm as Principal while Mr. E. M. Marshall carried on as headmaster of the school. In April, there was an influx of boys from St. Stephen's College and the roll increased to 107. The school later had to vacate the buildings again in August, and there came in first a New Zealand Hospital Unit, followed later by an American Unit of 200 nurses and 600 men. Fifteen boys stayed on under E. M. Marshall's care and their home was in the corner brick residence at present occupied by Mr. R. J. Sealby, the Maintenance Manager. The Principal's residence was still occupied by Army personnel and Mr. and Mrs. Marshall lived in the house next to the brick house, now the residence of Mr. and Mrs. J. Cheeseman (1973).

1943

Except for the Wesley Preparatory School, the College closed down completely and there were no students at all at Paerata. Last year's arrangements with the Army continued throughout the year. Later in the year however, they vacated all the College buildings though they continued to retain their camps in various other parts of the farm.



The Board of Governors then decided to reopen the College in 1944 and when Mr. R. C. Clark intimated that he did not wish to remain in charge at Paerata, Mr. E. M. Marshall was appointed.

1944

When the school reopened in February, 27 boys answered roll call. There were approximately 1300 American soldiers in camp on the farm at the time. By April the school roll had increased to 53 boys, A new staff of teachers had to be recruited, Mr. N.W. Gilling, BA, Mr. J. W. Bennett, MA, and Mr. R. C. Lamb, B. A., Rev. A. J. Dailgish (Chaplain); and Mr. N. O. D. Alexander, Dip. C. Ag.C. (Farm Manager).

Mr. Lamb is in 1974, the Librarian in charge of the Christchurch Public Library. All organised games and other activities recommenced: football, cricket, tennis, athletics, sports, educational excursions and debating. At the end of the year, "The Collegian" made a brave reappearance (the last issue was in December 1940).

1945

The school reopened with a roll of 92 boys. After the novelty of starting again had worn off, this was a year of consolidation. V. E. Day (May 8) and V-J Day (August 15) marked the end of World War II. The 1st cricket XI won all games and the local competition; and in addition, a game with Otahuhu High School resulted in an outright win by an inning and 139 runs. The Captain G. Palelei made a century in the first hour of the game- his final score was 160 (retired). The "Collegian" records the names of four Old Boys who had been decorated: Leslie Scott, D.S.O; Trevor Dill, D.F.M; Julius, S. Oien, A.F.C; W. Swanson, M.C. and Bar. It also records the names of 22 Old Boys still overseas and of 5 still serving in the armed forces within New Zealand.

1946

In this year, the Education Department introduced a new curriculum for secondary schools with a "core" of basic subjects and other optional subjects for a new School Certificate examination. An epidemic of influenza came and went suddenly at the end of the second term. It laid low most of the boys and the week in which it lasted was a difficult one for everybody. A decided increase to the school roll gave rugby football an added impetus and G. Palelei won a place in the Pukekohe Seniors and in the South Auckland Rep. Team. Another highlight this year was the Maori Club. Under the care of one of the masters, Mr. M. Winiata, the club extended its activities to include a choir, a glee club, a Samoan and Tongan section, and Maori plays. It also entertained many civic organisations and churches with first-class concerts.

1947

In this year, a Scout Troop and a Young Farmers' Club were established. The choir under Mr. C. Laurie, presented several concerts, one for the first time in the Concert Chamber of the Auckland Town Hall. This year also a Divinity Course was started, primarily to prepare Maori boys for entrance to Trinity College as students for the Methodist Ministry. Writing in the "Collegian", S.T.F (Finau) reports that in the Kingdom of Tonga, many Old Boys had taken their place in Government and in Church affairs. The Maori Club, still strong, said farewell to its leader, Koro Dewes with these words as he went away to sit for his University Entrance Examination: "We hope that his ideals for his people will never dim, but that he will serve them in the future as well as he has served the Club and the College." (Note: K.M. Dewes, MA, in 1974 a senior lecturer at Victoria University of Wellington is certainly fulfilling this hope-Editor.)

1948

All schools were closed from 1st February until 20th April this year because a polio-myelitis epidemic was sweeping the country. Mr. R. C. A Clark, MA, retired from the headmastership of the preparatory school at Mt. Wellington and Mr. W.E.V. Lowe, BA, was appointed to succeed him. In 1951, on the retirement of Mr. Lowe, the school closed down. It has since been leased to the Education Department as a Boarding School for children with special needs. This year the College was alive with all the usual activities and had now fully recovered from the setback of the 1942-1943 years.

1949

With the erection of two large blocks of buildings (providing four new classrooms, a science laboratory, woodwork room and draughting room), former classrooms were altered for an additional dormitory and a boys' common room. This provided extra accommodation for more boys and the roll increased from last year's 104 to 131 this year (87 European, 28 Maori and 16 Islanders). In this year, for the first time a special Bursar's Office was opened (under the Principal's residence). The site was not ideal but was better than no office at all.

On 28 April, the College was visited by H. E. the Governor-General, Sir Bernard Freyberg, V.C. He was met by a Boy



Scout Guard of honour and a rousing Maori haka.

He inspected the grounds and buildings, spoke to the boys and staff and before leaving, planted an Ake Ake tree amongst the native trees along the front drive. He departed to the cheers of the boys who all lined the road. This year, the Old Boys' Association held the reunion dinner at Westhaven in Auckland and visited the College the next day. The function was a great success.

1950

To mark the foundation of the College, and the establishment of the Native Institution at Grafton Road in 1844, the practice was commenced of holding an annual Commemorative Service on the third Sunday in October of each year. An address was given by the Rev. E. W. Hames and in the next few subsequent years by the Rev. G. I. Laurenson (1951), the Rev. E. Te Tuhi (1952), the Rev. A. H. Scrivin (1953) and the Rev. F. Copeland (1954). Senior students of the Divinity class (14 members) in preparation for the local Preacher's Examination this year took turns in taking evening Chapel services twice a week and gave short talks at these services and took part in other services at Pukekohe, Manukau, Karaka and the Maori Mission in Auckland. The 1st XV coached by Mr. F. Parks, this year played in the Pukekohe Junior Competition and was declared Joint winners with St. Stephen's College 1st XV of the grade. Interschool matches were played with Sacred Heart, Ardmore Teachers' College and Northland College.

1951

In this year, the Board of Governors decided to close the Preparatory School at Mt. Wellington. It had commenced on 15 September 1942 with the following pupils:

Standard 1: Milne Collis, Graham Couper, Michael Horwood.

Standard 2: Leslie Booth, Bernard Hugh Clark, Leonard Urquhart, Phillip Wiseman.

Standard 3: Douglas Freeth, Murray King, Barry Leathers, John McWhiter, Ian Wiseman.

Standard 4: Norman Bagnall, Gloster Brown, Rex Dawson, Dudley Dorman, Maurice Pellett, John Pollock, Gordon Running.

Form 1: Bruce Pollock.

In later years the roll was maintained at about 30 pupils, many of whom came to Wesley College, Paerata, and the Rev. E. M. Marshall records in the "Collegian" that Phillip Wiseman had left Wesley in 1950, while Murray King, a prefect and a sixth former would complete his secondary schooling at Wesley College this year.

1952

In this year, the affectionately presented Mr. M. B. ("Snow") Knott with a coloured aerial photograph of the College to mark his 25 years of service here. The pipe organ presented by the Trustees of the Mission Bay Methodist Church, was installed in the Chapel during the August holidays and used for the first time at the Commemorative Service. Originally, a Mr. Rendell, when he came out from England, brought a portion of it and used it in his home in the country for services. In 1941 it was presented to the Mission Bay Church by Miss. Rendell and then to the College. Queen's Scout awards were received this year by I.L. Barton, C. Chauvel, J. Keyte and J. Lamb. A beautiful solid oak table with six oak chairs was presented to the library. The table is still in use in 1974 and bears the following inscription:

"In Memory of Former Pupils of Wesley College
who gave their lives in the
World War, 1939 – 1945.
Given by the Old Boys' Association."

1953

In this year, the College became an Accrediting School for the University Entrance examinations. The Board of Governors spent considerable amounts this year for modernising the kitchen, installing a modern laundry unit, providing metal lockers for the dormitories, improving the tennis courts and building sheep-yards and a new concrete woolshed. Over 80 Old Boys attended the annual reunion of the football match. The following is "Snow" Knott's report of the football match: "The Old Boys' team comprised:-

“In the first ten minutes the College has it all their own way, and Old Boys' prospects seems low when Bloomfield (College) intercepted and raced 75 yards to score a beautiful try between the posts. Heteraka failed with the kick: College 3, Old Boys, 0. Then Old Boys marshalled the forces and started to play as a team and although College played a good defensive game, they could not stop the older and more experienced players. Fast-breaking forwards and an experienced back line won the day. Tries were scored for Old Boys by Havea, Russell and Brewster. Hamana's boot added 8 points. And so the Old Boys lifted the Hickling Cup with the score: Old Boys, 17, College,3.”

1954

The total roll reached 135 boys including 27 Maori, 10 Pacific Islanders, 96 Europeans, 2 Chinese and 4 student workers. Cricket at school lapsed during the last few years, but this year once again came into its own. The choir 80 strong, travelled to Pitt Street, St Paul's in Hamilton and St John's, Ponsonby. In July, the annual school concert was held in the Concert Chamber of the Auckland Town Hall before a good and appreciative audience. The concert was repeated at the Otahuhu Methodist Hall in connection with their centennial celebrations. In October the school saw the film “Rewi's Last Stand”. The Young Famers' Club under N. Royal and the Scouts Troop under Ian L. Barton and the Cadet Ambulance Division under J. L. Peters were all strong and Mr. Lloyd, the woodwork master, supervised the erection of the Scout Hutt close to the tennis courts and sports field.

1955

ON 13 August, the foundation stone of the Assembly Hall was laid by the Hon. Mr. Justice Stanton. Over Easter, members of the Boys' Brigade went into camp at Orewa with nearly 200 others. In April, senior boys went to King's College to see a performance of “Henry V”. In October at the annual Commemoration Service, an Old Boy, the Rev. E. Te Tuhi, OBE., unveiled the plaque in memory of the Old Boys who made the supreme sacrifice in World War II. Towards the end of the first term, a prefabricated 18ft x 40ft building, soon to become a central point of College organisation arrived complete with interior decoration, lighting, plumbing and glazing. Many boys will remember watching the unloading from the special truck carrying it, and its gradual lowering onto its foundations with no more serious mishap than a broken window (which was replaced the same day). The building was moved to its more central site near Harding Hall in 197. The 1st XV played the newly-formed South Auckland Counties Union, and four boys (Kukutai; Royal; August and Ngeru) were chosen to represent South Auckland Counties against Thames Valley.

1956

On October 15th, the new Assembly Hall was officially declared open by His Excellency, the Governor-General, Sir Willoughby Norrie. In this year, the Principal, the Rev. E. M. Marshall, as District Governor of the Auckland Rotary district made a trip to the United States and Great Britain. In his absence the first assistant, Mr. J.L. Ballantine, MA, acted as Principal, ably assisted by H. C. Squier (Bursar), Miss. I. Leslie (Matron), Mr. J. L. Browning (Farm Manager) and Mr. M.B. Knott (Grounds Overseer). The highlight in cricket this year was the opening stand by Schmitt and Kukutai of 160 runs made for School House in the interhouse competition. In football the 1st XV was promoted to a higher grade in the Counties competition and Old Boys of Port Albert donated a shield for the annual competition between Port Albert and the College. In this year, the Old Boys' Association made a handsome gift of Memorial Gates at the College entrance.

Nearby, on the south side of the road, a brick residence was erected (first occupied by Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Marshall, now by Mr. and Mrs. J. G. Hall, 1973).

1957

As 152 boys had to be provided for, this year a new dining room to seat 250 and the kitchen block were enlarged and the pipe-organ, purchased from Trinity College, was installed in the Chapel. Formerly this fine organ has been presented to the Takapuna Methodist Circuit at Rothesay Bay and with necessary maintenance from time to time, remained in constant use ever since. In the course of his Rotary duties, the Principal made many trips to Manila in



August and to Fiji in September. The 32nd annual athletic sports were held on 16 March for the first time on a properly surveyed track. In March also, 25 senior boys with Mr. Knott were taken by Old Boys for a picnic cruise on the Waitemata Harbour. At the Old Boys' Reunion on 15 June, the Memorial Gates were dedicated by the Rev. E. W. Hames, MA.

1958

An influx of new boys brought the roll number up to 180. The 1st XV were very strong: Old Boys were convincingly defeated 14-6; the Port Albert Shield was retained 37-5 and 6-6; after being narrowly defeated by Papakura High School in their first encounter, this College turned the tables in the next two matches 20-0 and 8-0; Pukekohe High School was defeated in the second encounter 9-0 to even the series; St. Stephens rather against the run of play defeated the College 13-5 in a stirring match, after St. Stephens had been pinned on their goal line for the last 30 minutes. High standards were also maintained in athletics, cricket, table tennis and swimming.

1959

A new driveway from the main road along the northern side of the sports field was formed this year and a farm manager's new house (still occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Browning) was completed in May. In July, 52 boys accompanied by 3 teachers and Mr. Knott made an enjoyable 600 mile tour with stops in Te Kuiti, Stratford, Hawera and Wanganui. The purpose of the trip was to let more people know that the Methodist Church had a boys' boarding school and did much to enhance the good name of Wesley College. At the annual Service held in the hall, to commemorate the founding of the College in 1844, the guest speaker was the Hon. Mr. Justice Hardie-Boys. About 85 Old Boys attended the annual reunion on 13 June.

1960

For the first time, a College Dance was held in the hall attended by senior pupils, staff and families and parents. A College nine-piece band supplied the music. In athletics at the L. V. Bryant Memorial meeting, the College met strong competition from some 40 other secondary schools. Our school was represented by M. L. Bennett, W. D. Cocker, J.A. Cameron, G. A. Tonga, J. Pihama, I. J. Manihera, T. B. Madsen (seniors), G. N. Smith (intermediates): G. B. Carter, J. R. Harron, K. K. Litterland, D. W. Harvey and B. G. Malquin (Juniors). The team did well.

1961

To mark the fiftieth year of the administration of the College under the Wesley Training College Trust Board the school acted as hosts to the Methodist Conference at its reception and garden party. There was an attendance of approximately 2,500 people and it was on this occasion that the foundation stone of Harding Hall was laid. The inscription reads:

**WESLEY COLLEGE – ESTABLISHED 1844
THIS FOUNDATION STONE WAS LAID ON

1962

On 26 January, the Wesley College Trust Board was admitted to a Life Membership of the Maori Education Foundation in terms of the Maori Foundation Act 1961. Two tragic deaths saddened the school. At Easter, a pupil named Christopher Long, died at the College and in August, Mr. N. W. Gilling, BA, formerly First Assistant at the College, tragically met his death by drowning at Orewa. The filtration plant, given by the Old Boys for use as a swimming bath proved a great success.

1963

With the official opening in March of Harding Hall by the Governor General Sir Bernard Fergusson, all hostel accommodation was reorganised. 80 more pupils were enrolled and a set pattern in the handling of boys in various age-groups was set. In July, twenty-eight boys accompanied by Mr. Knott and Mr. and Mrs. Parks played Okaihau



High School, in Whangarei, at football as the 'curtain-raiser' came to the main match, New Zealand Maori vs North Auckland. W. T. Paki, R. J. Armstrong and J. Maniapoto played outstandingly well but we lost to Okaihau by 15-3. The home team also defeated the New Zealand Maori by 9-0. Both games were played in a sea of mud. Another residence was erected near the road on the north side of the sports field, later to be occupied by Mr. and Mrs. J. I. Horsman.

1964

1844, 1924, 1944, and 1964, these have all been significant years in the life of Wesley College. The first notable event in 1964 was the passing of the 200 mark on the roll. The last occurred at the Prize Giving Ceremony. Mr. Marshall's last, when the Chairman of the Board of Governors presented Mr. Marshall with a television set (very few had seen a television set before) and a cheque "to help him with the furnishing of his future home at Silverdale". In between these two events, to help him with the other highlights: two football teams for the first time went to play Hamilton Technical College; the visit to the school by Golf Tournament players; the Boy's Brigade N.C.O. Course held at the College; the visits of the choir to the Central Mission at Auckland to Huntly, Waiuku, Pitt Street and St. Paul's (Hamilton) Methodist Churches; the variety concert presented for the Chapel by Papatoetoe players; the visit of representatives and their supporters of five South Auckland secondary school for the Interschool Cross-Country contest. Indeed a memorable year for Principal and Mrs. Marshall and for the College.



VISIT OF THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL 1963

1965

Mr. C. A. Neate commenced as Principal at the beginning of this year assisted by Mr. E. Te R. Tauroa as his vice-Principal. The house earlier erected for the farm manager near Barrett's Road (now Sims Road) was uplifted and transferred by truck to its present site facing the road on the north side of the sports field. School socials and dances each term were introduced this year and to help boys find their feet, Mr. Tauroa took dancing classes each week. The girls were invited from Pukekohe High School under the care of Mrs. B. G. McLean. The Old Boys' annual reunion was held in June. At the dinner, about 70 were present but during the day, at least 120 Old Boys put in an appearance. At the annual general meeting, the Rev. E. M. Marshall and the Rev. E. Te Tuhi (1909-10) were both elected Life Members. The oldest members of the Association present were Mr. Dan Anderson (1916-18), Mr. P. Te Turunui Jones (1913) and Mr. M. R. Jones (also 1913).

In the August holidays the school was shocked to learn that Mrs. Crane and Miss. Margaret Crane had lost their lives when a massive landslip demolished their holiday house at Muriwai. Mr. M. J. McFarlane qualified for the Royal Life Saving Society's Bronze Cross and 21 other boys for the Bronze Medallion. As part of his teaching programme, Mr. J. L. Browning was appointed as the school's first Careers Adviser.



1966

The College Band made a tremendous impression this year especially at morning assemblies: D. Lolo, M. Neate, D. Rollerson, M. Walter, Mr. J. S. Cheeseman (trumpets); W. Neate (Clarinet), Mr. L. Ducker (Saxophone), P. Shearer (horn), S. Fotu (euphonium), Mr. L. Q. P. Johnston (conductor).

The New Zealand Players Drama Quartet visited the school and presented four modern plays: the tragic and morally climacteric "Becket" of Jean Anouith, the hilarious "Resounding Tinkle" of N. F. Simpson, the piquantly satirical "Glass Menagerie" of Tennessee Williams and the rollicking bawdy "Tom Jones" of J. Osborn.

1967

For the first time there were sufficient boys who returned after passing their University Entrance examination to establish a Form VII class of seven pupils as a vital separate entity in its own right; and for the first time since 1947, the College had its own resident (Teacher) Chaplain, the Rev. Ian H. McKenzie. As scoria royalties soared unexpectedly, the long awaited new classroom-library-administration block was completed and occupied. Thanks to the generosity of the Old Boys, the chapel organ was overhauled and repaired and put in first-class order. New residences were erected for the chaplain and the farm manager. Other highlights: In August holidays, Mr. J. G. Hall took six senior boys to Mount Ruapehu; the school band under Mr. L. Q. Johnston played the hymn at assembly on one or two mornings each week; in the South Auckland Secondary Schools Swimming Championship, in the intermediate section, the College team (W. Neate, H. Coughlin, L. Donald and Iain Hudson) were placed 1st or 2nd in every event (including a first in the relay); in Athletics teams did nearly as well in the South Auckland and Bryant Memorial meetings; in hockey, the College fielded three teams; and in rugby, seven teams in the Counties competitions. Finally at the end of the year, the Principal, Mr. C. A. Neate, was farewelled and congratulated on his appointment as Principal of Pukekohe High School. After three strenuous years, he left with the best wishes of all.



STAFF, 1969

1968

This was Mr. E. Te R. Tauroa's first year as Principal with Mr. J. I. Horsman as his vice-Principal. Besides now having an Old Boy as Principal, five other Old Boys are also serving as members of the Board of Governors: the Rev. Rangī Rogers, Arthur Winstone, Harold Denton, Jim Beever and Eric Beavis.

In addition, former master (1924) the Rev. G. I. Laurenson is one of the members with the longest service. At the end of the first term, Mr. Knott died suddenly of a heart attack. Later in the year, Mr. R. J. Sealby was appointed as Maintenance Manager in his place. By converting the Harding Hall music room and the use of bunks to provide extra accommodation, the needs of a total enrollment of 237 boys were met this year. The new library is the largest room in the school and additional new shelving has made it possible to increase the stock of books substantially. "New



Mathematics" was introduced to the lower forms this year. Approximately 50 boys presented themselves for the Royal Life Saving Society's awards and Hugh F. Corigall qualified for the Distinction Award which is the second highest award available. Seven boys qualified for the Higher School Certificate, 3 for University Bursaries, 20 University Entrance (an 80% pass rate) and 34 boys passed the School Certificate Examinations.

1969

Many books were presented to the Library this year by parents and others, including an almost complete set of "Collegians" by Mrs. M.B. Knott. The Old Boys' Association annual reunion was well attended. For the first time, wives of Old Boys were officially invited and about 20 wives were present. After the establishment of a Bursary to perpetuate the memory of Mr. "Snow" Knott, the Association now had nearly \$2,000 in hand. This sum will have to be doubled before it will produce sufficient income to endow a Bursary permanently. In the winter term, a wide-spread influenza epidemic struck the school and resulted in one week's extra holiday. "It's an ill wind that blows nobody good" was the comment of one form. In October the New Zealand Player's Drama Quartet played "The Tempest" in the Hall. After a long period of producing meals of a very high order, Mr. and Mrs. F. W. Longhurst left and Mr. Hugh Carpenter became Domestic Manager. The Farm Manager, Mr. Murray Snook also left to take up his own farm at Hikuai and he was replaced by Mr. Owen Reeve.

1970

In his foreword to this year's "Collegian", Mr. Tauroa comments on the alarming urban sprawl that is taking place. Papakura spreading southwards, Pukekohe spreading northwards, Waiuku with its new steel complex, moving eastwards and to the east, the motorway bringing city-dwellers of Auckland within easy reach of the College. In future, "it could be that Wesley College will be one of the few green areas left in a built-up suburban district". In June the 1st XV won the Moascar Cup from Northland College but after holding it for one month, lost it to Papakura High School. On 24 July, the school had its first Silent Meal in the dining room. Strange to say, it was a great success! The fashion of wearing long hair is becoming noticeably prevalent this year but Form VII regretfully records that a Pukekohe hairdresser, Mr. Chas. Buck arrived on many unexpected occasions to cut hair, "sending us home with that clean-shaven look". In this year, Mrs. S. Moorfield formed a Japanese Club for learning Japanese language and the Japanese time and number systems. Films were used fortnightly to depict aspects of life in Japan.

1971

VISIT OF THE MAORI QUEEN

The Young Farmers' Club (Richard Kay, Chairman) had a successful year in a varied programme of activities. Mr. E. Meikle's Motor Vehicle Mechanics (Theory) Club learned much that will in future save unnecessary expense. This Club's activities were dovetailed in with those of the Road Safety Club. Philip Wilson (Winstone House) won the 5000 metre championship in the record time of 17 min. 14.2 secs. The 1st XV with Douglas Rollerson as captain, played 22 games, won 18 and drew 1.

Altogether the team scored a total of 574 points with 129 against. The College fielded 10 rugby teams, 4 hockey teams, 6 cricket teams.



At the end of the year, one of our pupils, Richard J. Maurice became the College's first University Junior Scholarship winner, his subjects being English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Additional Mathematics. He won 12th place on the Dominion list with a total of 665 marks out of a possible 800. In addition, five boys qualified for University Bursaries, 11 for Higher School Certificate, 21 for University Entrance, and 35 for the Sixth Form Certificate.



1972

With Mr. S. Moorfield as Librarian, assisted by a team of 14 boys as assistants, the library functioned well. About 200 new books were added to be shelved and full use was also made of the National and School Library Services. The following clubs were healthily active: Radio Communications (Mr. Horsman), Photography (Mr. Burt), Cooking (Mrs. Moorfield and Mr. Carpenter), Field Club (Mr. Moorfield), Chess (Mr. Hall), Computer Club (Mr. Hall), Young Farmers' Club (Mr. Browning), Horticulture Club (Mr. Browning). The 1st Cricket XI did particularly well this year. With Rob Allan as captain, in the Franklin C Grade section the team won all its matches, two of them outright. In December, after six years as Chaplain, the Rev. Ian H, McKenzie retired. At the final end-of-year ceremony, the school was honoured by the presence of Queen Te Atairangikaahu. She presented special prizes. Following R. J. Maurice's example in 1971, D. S. Fowlds capped the year by winning a University Junior National Scholarship (55th place in the Dominion list of passes).

1973

The new Chaplain, the Rev. W. Chessum commenced in February. A monster gala day was held in April when a nett sum of \$7,000 was raised as the nucleus of a fund to meet the cost of a larger swimming pool. While Mr. Peddie, our Chemistry master, was away for two months in the U.S.A. on a Rotary Scholarship, Mr. J. Beaver took his classes. In debating a team comprising S. Pivac, D. Munn and M. Habershon debated St Stephen's and then Pukekohe High School. In the third debate, Wesley was defeated by Lavalla College by only 9 points out of a possible 400. At the athletic sports nine new records were made and at the swimming sports, W. Coates made five new records, so that he now holds 14 of the school's 21 swimming records. Much enthusiasm for table tennis prevailed during the winter term. The grass plot in the playground was enlarged and surrounded with kerbing. At the end of the year, we farewelled the Principal, Mr. E. Te R Tauroa and Mr. J. C. Moorfield who are going to Tuakau College. At the prize giving ceremony, we were delighted to have a former Principal, Mr. R. C. Clark and his son Bernard with us; and after the Chairman, Mr. Donnelly had presented Mr. and Mrs. Tauroa with a silver afternoon tea set, all present were most favourably impressed by the response to the new Principal, Mr. John McDougall, to the Chairman's invitation to show himself and to speak.

1974

When the College reopened on 1st February, everybody was indeed sorry to learn that the vice-Principal, Mr. I. J. Horsman had left with Mr. Moorfield to join the staff at Tuakau College under Mr. Tauroa. The new Principal, Mr. J. B. McDougall was formally inducted in a service held in the newly enlarged and renovated Chapel on Sunday 3rd February. New teachers were Mr. J. K Somervell, Mr. T. Turuwhenua and Mr. C. Mitchell and the acting vice-Principal is Mr. G. S. Watson.

Mr. John Hall was appointed Deputy Principal in Term II and Mr. Graham Watson was confirmed as a Senior Master. Mr. Hugh Carpenter resigned as caterer and Mr. and Mrs. Short retired as caretakers. The introduction of Fijian girls to the kitchen from the Methodist Church in the Pacific consolidated stability in this area.

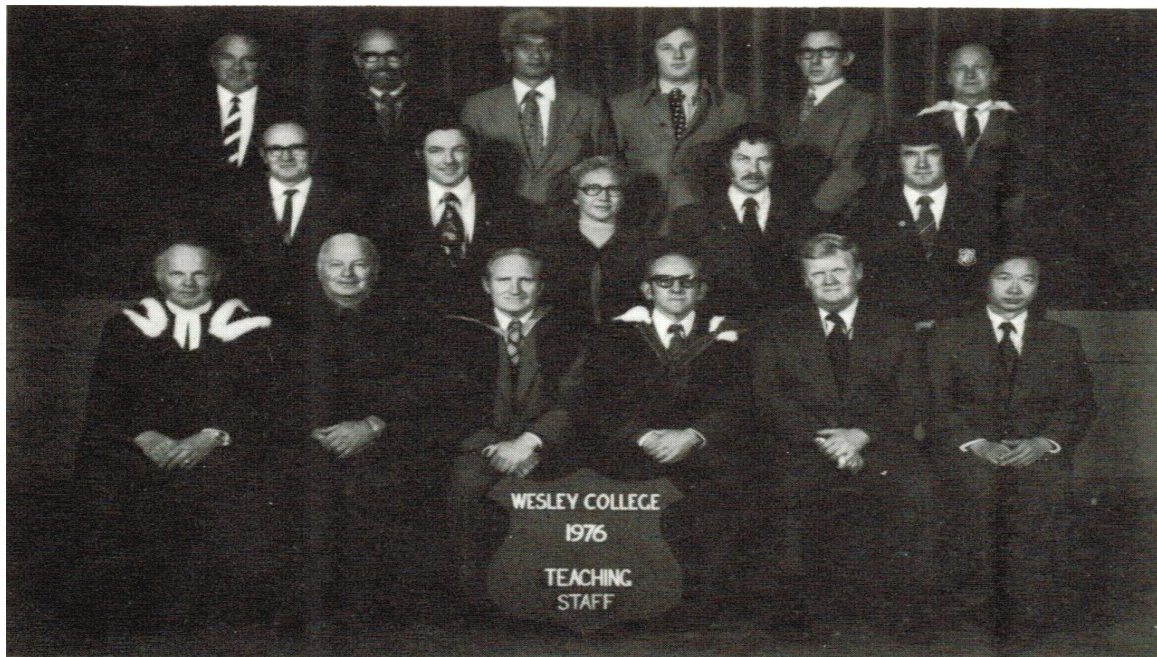
The Chapel refurnishing was completed, presenting a wonderful new focus for worship and allowing for seating of 300 students, staff and visitors. The Jubilee (fifty years at Paerata) was celebrated with the Hon. Mrs. Tirikatene-Sullivan as guest speaker. Exam results in 1973 reached a new high with the 1974 announcement of Ngarimu Scholarships to David McDowell and David Tipene-Leech. New endeavours introduced were Yachting, Golf, Scuba Diving, Karate and College dances.

1975

The roll increased to 253 (from 211) with a pleasing number of 63 Maori, and 21 Pacific Islanders. Mr. Ron Teasdale, M.Sc, was appointed Head of Science and Mr. Bob Lendrum, BA, DipTchg became Head of Social Studies.

Mr. Chris Mitchell left to complete his degree at University while Mr. J. K Somervell, MA, became part time and Mrs. Clare Turuwhenua, full time, with Mrs. McDougall, DipTchg., joining the staff as a part time English teacher. Mrs. O. Fordyce became Senior Matron.

1976

The roll increased to 263 (with a waiting list created by lack of boarding accommodation). Mr. Terence Sargent, BA, DipEd, DipTchg, joined the staff as Head of Commerce, while Mr. Bruce Johnston, MA, DipTchg, was appointed to Social Studies.

Mr. J. L. Browning resigned after 22 outstanding years as farm manager and Agriculture teacher. He will always be remembered for his dedication to Winstone House and the Young Farmers' Club. Mr. J.A. Allan retired after 16 dedicated years of service as College Bursar. Mrs. Edith Appleby became Head Caterer following the transfer of Mr. Wells.

A major upgrading of classrooms occurred as the Trust Board continued time consuming negotiations towards Integration. A new tar sealed road along the top of the batter was formed creating a new front entrance to the College buildings.

Three new sports were introduced: Rowing, Boxing and Soccer, with a new Soccer Field developed. Yachting at Clarks Beach was a popular pursuit. The first XI won the Haslam Cup for Franklin Schools with 4 players gaining representative selection.

The filtration plant and new changing sheds for the enlarged swimming pool were completed. The boys continued their community efforts by helping those less fortunate than themselves by assisting in collections for over 20 organisations.

Doug Rollerson became the College's first full All Black.

1977

Wesley College became the first school to be integrated into the State System. A new Board of Governors responsible to the Education Department was elected while the Trust Board continued to own all the buildings and to administer the Hostel and Farm.

The special character of the College was protected by the historic Integration Agreement.



The roll reached 275 students with a substantial waiting list. Mr. John Bradshaw, BA, DipTchg, joined the English staff while Mr. Bruce Reynolds, B.AgrSc, became the Agriculture teacher. Mr. Henry Hartridge retired after a record 39 years as farmhand and groundsman.

The YFC had a record number of 72 members equalling the Polynesian group as the strongest clubs in the school. The first Cricket XI had another successful year while the improved First XV played Hato Petera at Eden Park as curtain raiser to the Lions vs the Maori All Blacks.

The Science and classroom blocks were upgraded electrically, painted internally and externally with new floor coverings throughout.

The Universities reported that the ex-Wesley College first year students at their institutions had passed 93% of their first year papers.

1978

Form 1 was eliminated because of the demand for places in the senior school. Capitalising on the advantaged offered by integration all school buildings were brought up to state standards and the new Technical block was opened, creating space for an Art room.

Mr. David Law, BA, DipTchg, resigned as Head of English to be replaced by Mr. Stephen Fordyce, MA, DipTchg. At the end of the year, Mr. Ron Teasdale, BSc, DipEd. Mr. Bob Lendrum, BA, DipTchg and Mr. Bruce Reynolds, B.AgrSc, DipTchg all moved on promotion to other Colleges. Mr. Ann Johnston left after two years of valuable service as a Remedial English and Maori Studies teacher.

Mrs. C Bailey left from the office staff while Mrs. T Tyler resigned after eight years as piano tutor.

Mr. Brian Minogue, FCIS, FCA, retired after 20 years as Secretary to the Wesley College Trust Board.

Fourth Form Outdoor Education Camps were introduced with Mr. Ducker at Parau Bay. The College undertook their first overseas sports trip when 40 senior students traveled to Caulfield Grammar in Melbourne.

The Polynesian Club gained much satisfaction by finishing second in the Auckland Schools Festival.

A new Chaplain's residence was built.

1979

Mr. Peter Spratt, MSc, DipTchg, became Head of Science while Mr. Warwick Sanson, BA, DipTchg, joined the Social Studies staff and Mr. Charlie Johnston, BAgSc, with Mrs. Gail Burroughs, TTC in Art. At the end of the year, Mr. Terence Sargent, BA was promoted to Mangakino while Mr. Bob Fordyce, BA, took leave for England. Mrs. June Johnston became Senior Matron replacing Mrs. Fordyce.

Mr. Gordon McGavin was appointed to the newly created position of Hostel Executive Office while Mr. Norman Johnston, BCom, ACA, CMA, FCIS, ANZIM, became Secretary to the Trust Board.

Mr. McDougall was awarded a Woolf Fisher Scholarship and travelled to the United States of America, Great Britain and Europe, studying education with an emphasis on boarding schools which had introduced girls into their senior forms. His report to the Board became a 'blue print' for the future of Wesley College.

Mr. John Hall acted as Principal for the second term while Mr. Graham Watson became Deputy Principal.

The College entered 21 teams in Rugby, Hockey, Soccer and Cricket. Twenty four students gained Life Saving awards. The Boxing Club had 40 members. G. Raymond represented Franklin School at Cricket for a record three years in a row.



Drama produced their first major undertaking, "Billy Budd".

Cafeteria style serving of food was introduced into the Hostel Dining Room.

1980

Highlight of the year was the opening of the senior hostel honouring the Caughey Family's continuous association with the College since 1892 and of Caughey Hall. This fine building provides bed and private study facilities with a lounge for 6th and 7th formers. This allowed the roll to increase to a record 305 student of whom 244 lived on the campus (there was a waiting list of 60 students). The Maori and Pacific roll rose to 121 students.

Three new teachers joined the staff: Mr. Eti Maiava, BCom, ACA, (Head of Commerce), Mr. Andrew Ball, ANZIM, DipTchg and Mrs. Gail Gardner, BA, DipTchg, Mrs. Doris Reeve (Head of Laundry) moved to the College office replacing long serving Mrs. Julia Smith. Mr. Roy Savery was appointed as Hostel Executive Officer. Mrs. June Johnston became Senior Matron.

The Wesley Athletics team won the Senior Manukau Schools title for the first time since 1969, while 10 Rugby players were selected for the Counties Representative team. Doug Rollerson was reselected as an All Black.

1981

Mr. Bob Fordyce, BA, retired after ten years of French and History teaching and many memorable sermons. Mrs. Dorothea McFadden retired as remedial English teacher.

Highlight of the sporting year was the First XV winning the coveted Moascar Cup from St Stephens and also defeating the champion Samoan Team, Avele College. The First Hockey XI won the Schools title for the first time in 10 years. Craig Cheeseman created a new record by winning 8 titles in Junior Athletics.

Over 70 students took part in a wide range of Polynesian Club performances with honour derived by being invited to crew at Turangawaewae. Maori carving classes reached new standards of accomplishment.

The male section of the Manukau Music Festival was dominated by Wesley students. The Inter-House Choral and Music competitions reached new standards of enthusiasm.

A 14 hectare block of the College farm was converted to Horticulture with squash and sweet corn being grown while the shelter belts developed for future kiwifruit planting.

Twenty one students qualified for University Entrance, the largest number in the College's history.

The traditional 4th and 6th Form Outdoor Education Camps moved to a new location at little Huia.

1982

The Rev. Bill Chessum, Mus.B., DipTchg, retired from the chaplaincy of the College after ten years of dedicated service but continued as part time music teacher.

Mr. Bruce Johnston, MA, DipTchg was promoted to Opunake being replaced by Mr. Nixon Cooper, MA, DipTchg. Mr. Andrew Ball, ANZIM, DipTchg, transferred to Wellington. Mr. John Bradshaw, BA, DipTchg, left at the end of the year on promotion.

Mr. Owen Reeve assumed control of the two agricultural areas on the property, the Grafton Downs' Town Supply farm with Mr. Tim Mundy as a contract milker and Mr. David Slack, BHortSc, in charge of the Horticultural Block called "Fitzroy Grove".

Three stalwarts retired from the Hostel area, Mrs. Sealby and Mrs. Brownlee from the laundry and Mr. Bernie Clarke as carpenter. Mr. and Mrs. S Smith became the Caretaker-Cleaners of the school buildings.

Soccer came of age when the First XI won the Manukau Schools title for the first time. The First Cricket XI were



undefeated throughout the season.

Horticulture was introduced as a new subject being part of General Science in Form 3 and 4.

The College held a major fundraising effort with a most successful Gala Day.

A memorial service was held for the Rev. Belshazzar Gina, the first Solomon Islander to be educated in New Zealand. He attended Wesley in 1926-1928.

Extensive tree planting took place throughout the grounds lining the newly formed tar seal roadways.

Nigel Taylor had the double distinction of being academic DUX and DUX LUDORUM for all round sporting achievements.

1983

The major event of the year was the opening of the Hames Music Centre. The name honoured the Hames family, outstanding supporters of the College for over 50 years, and particularly, the late T. L Hames, a very generous benefactor and the Rev. E. M. Hames, the school historian.

The old music room was converted to a modern laundry and sorting room while the kitchen was upgraded with the latest equipment to provide a new functional unit producing over 1000 meals per day.

New teaching staff appointed were Miss. Vanessa Ball, BSc, and Miss. Moycen McCoy, MA, DipTchg. The Rev. Graham Kane took up his duties as Chaplain. Mr. Eric Meikle retired after 23 years of service.

Three Trustee members retired after a combined contribution of 100 years on the Board. They were Rev. E. W. Hames, MA, Rev. G. I. Laursen, CBE, and Mr. N Nicholls, MBE, ED, MA. Mrs. Edith Appleby retired as Catering Manager. George Beck won the Bledisloe Cup for senior Speech among all the Colleges in the district. Steve Autagavaia became the first athlete to win a North Island School title while the Wesley Golf Team won 3 Auckland titles. Te Hurunui Muru's selection to the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby Team was another first for the College. Colin Hickman toured to the United States of America as an Auckland Life Saving representative. The Soccer First XI retained their Manukau title.

The move of the Outdoor Education camp to Te Mata was a successful innovation.

Fifth Form School Certificate Horticulture was introduced with practical work carried out on the new Fitzroy Grove which had been planted in kiwifruit, avocados and persimmons.

1984

Mr. Harold Denton, JSM, FCIT, Chairman of both the Trust Board and Board of Governors was awarded the OBE for his outstanding services to education and the community. Mr. Tom Spooner, MA, DipTchg became Chairman of the Board of Governors.

Mr. Richard Smythe, MSc, was appointed as Mathematics and Physics teacher. Mr. Charlie Johnston BAgSc, after six years of dedication at Wesley, was appointed to Indonesia. His wife Mary who had acted as "mother" for many of the Pacific Island students was sadly missed by the boys. Miss. Moycen McCoy, MA, moved on promotion, Mr. and Mrs. McDougall represented New Zealand at the World Conference on Youth Rugby held in Oxford, United Kingdom.

Construction of the senior girls hostel was commenced incorporating many of the good points observed by the McDougalls on their Australia investigation. The original Boys Hostel buildings were re-roofed in colour steel. A large plastic and shade cloth building was constructed to allow a full class to be instructed in practical Horticulture.

The debating team reached the final of the Auckland Jaycees competition. The First Soccer XI retained their Manukau title and were runners up at the New Zealand tournament. Simon Bailey won the North Island under 17 tennis title. Richard Anderson was the first Wesley student to be selected for an AFS exchange to Germany.

Form 6 Camp under the guidance of Mr. Spratt, undertook new style leadership training and bush survival skills in



the Kauaeranga Valley while the 4th formers enjoyed a new site, Te Mata.

The town supply farm, Grafton Downs, reached record milk production.

1985

The year was notable for the reintroduction of girls to the school for the first time in over 100 years. Twenty three girls, 20 of whom were boarders, entered the senior College. This increased the roll to 68 students in Form 6 and 25 in Form 7. The waiting list for the College reached 100.

Three new teachers started the year, Miss. Meg Cooper, BAgSc., DipTchg, Mrs. Alison Cleary, BA, DipTchg, and Mr. Robert Arreel, MA (Hons). At the end of Term I, the College suffered a major loss when Mr. John Hall, BSc (Hons), retired after 19 years at Wesley, 11 years as Deputy Principal. His replacement from a strong field, was Mr. Chris Grinter, BA (Hons), DipTchg. Mrs. Lorna Coker retired after 21 years of office service having been Secretary to four Principals. Mr. Dick Sealby retired after 17 years as Maintenance Manager. 'Te Paea' Hall with Mrs. Gail Burroughs as first Matron proved to be well designed and very functional unit. Harding Hall was upgraded and plans drawn for the new Junior and Intermediate Boys Hostel.

Chad Brown had the distinction of being Head Prefect and Dux of the College. Danny Kaleopa gained New Zealand Secondary School Rugby selection as well as captaining Counties and Northern Regions, while Samantha Gatehercole created girls records at the Manukau Swimming Sports and was placed at Nationals. Twenty eight Wesley students, including 6 girls, gained Counties / Manukau representative honours in a wide range of sports. Seven rugby and soccer teams were either winners or runners up in their Secondary Schools grade championships.

1986

Feature of the year was the opening of the 150 bed hostel for Junior students, appropriately named "Denton Hall". Two bed carpeted cubicles replaced the old style open dormitories. The original brick buildings were converted to study rooms with individual carrels.

Mr. Graeme Kerr, MA, DipEd., SocSc, and Mr. Jeffrey Lockhart, BEd, TTC., joined the staff at the commencement of the year, while Mr. Nixon Cooper, BA, DipTchg, and Mr. Robert Arrell, MA(Hons), DipTchg, and Mrs. Gail Burroughs, TTC, left at the end of the last term. Mr. Colin Nicholls was appointed as Maintenance Manager.

A record number of 37 students, including 12 girls, entered Form 7, the teaching day was modified from 7 x 45 minute periods to 5 x 60 minute periods. Block teaching was introduced into Form 3 so that all students were introduced to Art and Craft, Woodwork and Technical Drawing and Agriculture/ Horticulture which has been optional subjects in the past.

The cultural heritage of the College was further strengthened by all students in Form 3 studying Maori language, instead of by choice as in the past. Maori speeches, waiatas and hakas were introduced as part of the Inter-House competitions. Historical and spiritual values were made part of the design of the bodices for the girls section of the Polynesian Club. Many years of the College's involvement in the Turungawaewae regatta were recognised when seven Wesley students were selected to paddle Tahere Tikitiki at Perth, as part of the America's Cup New Zealand promotion.

UE moved to Form 7, with the upgrading of 6th Form Certificate. New subjects introduced at Wesley in Form 6 were Agriculture Science, Horticulture, Computer Awareness and Pacific Studies. Classical Studies was a new Form 7 subject and Workshop Technology a new practical course in Form 5. The College received a splendid gift of 10 IBM Computers from the Trust Board. Feature of the social activities was the first ever College Ball. The formal dress and dignified behaviour ever a credit to the senior students. The inaugural Inter-House debating series was added to the successful speech contests, while Maori speaking became part of the competitions.

The first XV came of age winning the Counties Championship, the Moascar Cup, and the Scarlett Trophy while their 7s team were Runners up in the New Zealand championship. The two Wesley 7s teams travelled to Fiji where the A team was placed fourth in the International event. The First Soccer XI won the Manukau title for the fifth year in succession while the Girls A Netball won their grade in the Counties competition. The very popular Tae Kwon Do discipline was introduced. Thirty two students gained representative honours in a wide range of sports. Mr. Chris Gunter was appointed Coach of the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby team.



Roimata Clark was selected as Wesley's first Rotary Scholar, with his destination Finland.

The College were privileged to host the first day of the Methodist Conference with 1200 guests accommodated in a marquee and with students taking part in the Multicultural festivities.



STAFF, 1986

1987

The year started with the largest Pacific Island contingent on the roll in the history of the College consisting of 14 Solomon Islanders, 14 Fijians, 13 Tongans and 12 Samoans.

Mr. Tom McDonald, BSc, DipTchg, joined the Science staff from Pukekohe High, while three very keen young teachers, Carolyn Fraser, BA, Brian McDonald, MA(Hons) and Susan Segar, BAgSc, had an immediate positive impact on the life of the school. Mrs. Jean Taylor, BSc, DipTchg, became the Head of Science replacing Mr. Peter Spratt, MSc, DipTchg, who had moved on promotion after 7 years of excellent service.

The new octagonal office additions were completed providing a new entrance to the College with offices for the Principal, Senior Master, Principal's Secretary, a Board room and an area for archives underneath. A new hospital dispensary and baths parking area were welcome developments.

The College hosted the regional finals of the Inter-School Maori speaking contests while all students had the opportunity to visit the Te Maori exhibition.

The new sport of Wrestling was introduced with outstanding success, 4 participants winning Auckland Novice championships. The Tae Kwon Do group produced a record number of gradings. The cycling group showed promise in its competitive endeavours.

The Girls Netball won their Counties grade and enjoyed their trip through Northland, while the First XV journeyed to Queensland winning all 4 matches played. The first Cricket XI completed their season undefeated while the Indoor Cricket team also won their championship. The College A debating team retained the Rotary Cup against other Counties schools.



The Fourth Form Outdoor Education Camps made good use of a new site at Raglan.

1988

The trend to increased numbers in the senior school continued necessitating the elimination of Form 2 so Wesley became a Form 3 to Form 7 Secondary College. For the first time, Pacific Island students reached 50 enrolments, with 96 pupils of Maori descent in the total roll of 330.

Stable staffing continued with no changes in teachers at the commencement of the year. At the end of Term I, Miss. Gail Gardner, BA, DipTchg, left after 8 years of service to be replaced by Mr. M Lesley Menzies, BA, DipEd. Mr. Roy Savery retired as Hostel Executive Officer, the new appointee was Mrs. Barbara Thoresen, ANZIM. Matron Judith McKenzie resigned after five years of service.

A new position of Maori Hostel tutor was created in Term III with the successful appointment being the Rev. John Manihera. This was the direct result of a combined Hui weekend of Board members, staff, students and church representatives, when the need for additional support services for Maori students was emphasised.

In the school curriculum, increased emphasis was placed on Transition and Health Studies. Art gained further prominence in the school with increased numbers studying the subjects in Form 6 and 7. With increased emphasis on practical work in Form 7 Geography studies were undertaken in Pauanui.

In sport, 3 students represented New Zealand, Waisake Sotutu in Rugby, Tim Everett in Wrestling and Kingley Thompson in Motorcross. Thirty one Wesley sportsmen and sportswomen gained Counties / Manukau representative honours. The girls undertook a 'self funded' netball and cultural trip to Tonga while the First XV toured the South Island.

The direct subsidy from the Trust Board to keep boarding fees down reached \$750,000 for the year. Together with special allowances and scholarships, the Trust Board's contribution to the College reached \$1 million per annum excluding capital expenditure. In the last fifteen years, the Gibson Trust in Taranaki contributed over \$200,000 to needy Wesley students, while many other benefactors gave additional help.

Harding Hall was refurbished completing the ten year plan which eliminated all "barrack room" style dormitory layouts. Two new Lockwood-Initial flats were built for staff accommodation. In May, Mr. and Mrs. McDougall were sent by the Trust Board on a goodwill tour of the Pacific Islands visiting old students, parents and supporters.

A new free standing library with Maori language room attached was opened in Term III. The naming of the block as the John and Pauline McDougall Library was a fitting testimonial to their completion of 15 years of stewardship.

At his farewell at the final prizegiving, Mr. McDougall stated, "No matter what the future holds in social and racial challenges, or further dramatic changes in educational administration, assessment or subject content, Wesley College will always have a part to play. In a changing world, there is no substitute for tradition. The educational philosophies of the College emphasising christian, multiracial and boarding values will always endure. I feel proud of the students that the school produces.

1989

From an education perspective, 1989 was a remarkable year with the implementation of "Tomorrow's Schools". In this blueprint for the future, the Government proposed reforms that would result in more immediate delivery of resources to schools, more parental and community involvement and greater teacher responsibility.

During the year, the Administration became concerned about the Government's new "Foreign Student Policy" and the educational assistance to be provided to students from developing countries. With the backing of the Trust Board, Mr. Watson accompanied by Mrs. Watson visited the Solomon Islands and Fiji during the Christmas vacation to assist with the transitional arrangements there.



During the year, the Trust Board reequipped student flats with new furnishings, remodelled and extended the Ladies' ablution area in the Hall and built a magnificent new staffroom. The Department of Education before they were out of existence provided approximately \$40,000 to renovate the interior of the Hall, replace the glass dome in the Music complex, upgrade the classroom furniture and enable a new tractor to be purchased.

The Christian ethos of the College was readily apparent but memories of particular poignancy during the year include the Service of Beginnings and the visit of the President of the Methodist Church – Mr. Eric Laurenson, the Fakame Service, the Carol Service, the preaching of student Tevita Mone and some fine singing of hymns.

Paki Rawiri was appointed as Senior Prefect, Waisake Sotutu was appointed as Head Boy and Alisi Tupou was Head Girl.

The inaugural meeting of the "Eric Salmon Educational Trust" was held in July 1989.

Early in the year the College participated in the Maori and Pacific Islands Cultural Festival. The College choir visited a number of churches and students participate in the Manu Korero competition, speech contest, choral festival, Solomon Island concert and there were significant successes by pupils in the Royal Schools of Music examinations. Iain Campbell painted a superb mural on the outside of the Technical Block and Mr. Te Whare Turuwhenua was honoured as kaumatua for PPTA.

In the sporting area, there were many highlights but worthy of mention are Jonah Lomu and Sam Nonoa who each gained four first places at the Manukau Secondary Schools Athletics Championships and Sam went on to gain a New Zealand title in the 110m hurdles.

Tony Liefiting won representative honours in cricket while Grant Hansen and Jason Turuwhenua achieved Black Belts, only the second and third gained by members of the Wesley College Tae Kwon Do Club.

The first and second soccer elevens were each runners up in the Manukau Secondary Schools A and B competitions while the First XV team members, Edwin Talakai and Waisake Sotutu won New Zealand Secondary Schools rugby representative honours and Waisake went on to become the first school boy to play for Counties at a senior level.

The College's seven-a-side Rugby team took the New Zealand Secondary Schools title at the Condors Sevens tournament.

In all respects, the First soccer XI's tour to the Solomon Islands and Fiji and the First XV's tour to Tonga, Western Samoa and Fiji in the August vacation were outstanding successes and enhanced the name of the College in the Pacific.

During the year, Paki Rawiri and Alisi Tupou met with Her Royal Highness Princess Anne; six students aided by the Trust Board experienced voyages on either the Spirit of Adventure or the Spirit of New Zealand; Julie Butler participated in a "Friends of the Pacific" Youth Work Camp in the Solomon Islands. At the end of the year, Jason Still left on a Rotary Exchange to South Carolina while Michael McGarva prepared to spend four months at the beginning of 1990 in the Himalayas cleaning up refuse left by mountaineers – all the training at picking up rubbish was done at Wesley!

At the end of the year, we farewelled Rev. Graham Kane, Mrs. Susan Seagar and Mrs. Allison Cleary. Mr. Gary Collins left to spend 1990 on a teacher exchange in the United Kingdom and his replacement from Bristol was Mr. Miner-Williams, M.Ed., and we welcomed to the staff, Miss. Christine McBain, BA, and Mr. Amanaki Palavi, BHortSc, DipAg, DipTchg, and Mr. Frank Kraushaar, CertEd.

1990

At the beginning of the 1990 year, Mr. Harold Denton, OBE, a former member of the Board of Governors and Trust Board, stepped down as Chairman of the Trust Board after 15 years of service in that capacity. Mr. Jack McCoskrie, BCom, LLB, ACA, ACIS, was subsequently elected to the Chairmanship of the Wesley College Trust Board.



At the beginning of the year, Aisea 'Aholelei was appointed Senior Prefect while Laisenia Bale was appointed Head Boy and Anne Robinson was appointed Head Girl.

New staff who joined the College during the course of the year were Mrs. Pauline Cook, Principal's Secretary, Mrs. Joy Johnston who became fulltime Matron, Mrs. Judith Phillips, Girls' Supervisor at Te Paea Hall, Catering Manager Mr. Chris Rodgers, and Gardener Mr. Ray Golding.

Because of a change in Government's Foreign Student Policy, overseas students could no longer count on our College roll for staffing and finance purposes. In order to maintain the College's historical links with students from the Islands, the Board of Governors requested Mr. and Mrs. Watson to travel to Tonga, Western Samoa and Fiji to liaise with potential and former students and parents, churches, embassies and schools.

At the end of the year, in addition to the standard academic qualification of Sixth Form Certificate, nearly all Sixth Form students entered for the private Combined Schools' Sixth Form examination and a number of Seventh Form students entered for the privately run New Zealand Foundation Scholarship examinations which were offered in place of the Universities Board Entrance Scholarship examinations which had been abolished.

There were many student highlights to the 1990 year and among them were the recording of ten hymns in the Chapel for the TVNZ "Praise Be" programme. College sports teams performed exceptionally well and the First rugby XV won the "Top Four" tournament at Invercargill when they defeated Gisborne Boys' High School by 21-6 in the final. Kenneth Pourewa was selected for the Under 17 New Zealand rugby team.

Students from the College participate in : the 75th Anniversary in Turkey of the landing of the ANZAC forces at Gallipoli, the Royal Henley Regatta crewing the Maori waka Taheretikitiki and then accompanied that waka to Canada.

Four students gained their Black Belt in Tae Kwon Do and a magnificent mural undertaken by pupils and staff was mounted outside room 9. A number of students experienced voyages on the sail training ships, Spirit of Adventure and Spirit of New Zealand.

The College was privileged to host American Field Service scholar, Lars Darmann from Germany.

During 1990, the Trust Board renovated the Junior Television lounge and the Board of Governors spent in excess of \$50,000 on new computers, furniture and equipment for classrooms.

During 1990, Mrs. Nicholson was a voluntary Guidance Counsellor for one day a week while the ex-Principal of Melville College and the Rev. Ed Marshall's son-in-law, Mr. Fraser Campbell, joined us as relieving teacher for a term while Mr. Brian McDonald and his wife were touring through Europe.

1990 external examination results were generally very pleasing with the College recording its highest ever examination passes in the University Bursaries examinations. Twenty bursaries were gained of which six were A awards and in addition five students gained National Scholarships in individual subjects. During the year, nine former students of the College graduated from New Zealand universities.



STAFF 1991

1991

At the beginning of 1991, Miss. Sally Pendergrast, BA, DipTchg, came to Wesley College from Tamaki College as an English teacher, replacing Miss. McBain, Mr. Graeme Kerr resigned to recommence University studies and Mr. Collins returned from Bristol.

In 1991, we introduced into our curriculum at Form Seven level Agriculture and Horticulture and Art History. Sadly, we recorded with sorrow the passing of long-serving staff member and Senior Master, Mr. Grahame Watson. Grahame passed away on 30 July after being ill for most of the year. He joined the staff of the College in 1966 and had completed 25 years' service at the time of his death. At his funeral at the College on Saturday 3 August, former pupils from each of the intervening years appeared to be present. Sad though the occasion was, Grahame's funeral was a tremendous tribute to him and to the College – a time when the whole family of Wesley came together in a very special and meaningful way. Significantly, an anonymous benefactor presented \$25,000 to the Trust Board to honour Grahame and his family and the contribution that Grahame made to Wesley College. Interest from this money provides a Scholarship to enable students from the Pacific Islands and in particular the Solomon Islands to attend Wesley.

The College celebrated with Mr. Chris Grinter, his appointment to the Principalship of Rotorua Boys' High School. A poroporoaki was held for Chris and Hillary Grinter in the College Hall on the afternoon of Friday 26 July. It was a moving occasion during which representatives of all the ethnic groups at the College said their farewells.

Mr. Ray Golding reduced his involvement to that of Consultative Gardener and John Rollett took over the day to day running of the College gardens.

During the third term, the Board of Governors in two unanimous decisions appointed Mr. Stephen Fordyce as Deputy Principal and Mrs. Catherine Richardson as Senior Mistress. This was the first occasion in the history of Wesley College that a woman had been appointed to a Senior Management position in the College.

At the beginning of Term 3, it was a pleasure to welcome our new Chaplain, the Rev. Alan Upson, following confirmation of his appointment at the Methodist Conference at Wanganui.



We were indebted to the Superintendent of the Manukau District, the Rev. Dr. Keith Rowe for organising preachers at our Sunday services during Terms 1 and 2. We were especially grateful to the Rev. Warwick Gust and the Rev. Percy Rushton for teaching our Life and Faith classes until an appointment was made to the Chaplaincy.

During the course of the year, two long-service Trust Board appointees to the College Board of Governors retired. Mr. Tom Spooner and Mrs. Christine Peak resigned their positions and were replaced by Mr. Jack Paine and Mr. Norman Johnston respectively.

The 1991 school year commenced a little down on our maximum roll number but we were pleased to welcome Guiliano Pintao from Brazil, our AFS student for the year.

In an innovative step at the beginning of the year, the College invested in professional leadership training for the School Prefects. The personable Marcus Topine was Head Prefect for the year and was ably assisted by Head Girl, Donna Duggan and Head Boy, Lyall Bowsher.

In a simple ceremony on 3 May, the College waka Te Puhī O Paerata was returned to the campus to be placed in the quad underneath the large Totara tree. The mid-July visit of members of a rugby team from Tupou College in Tonga.

College teams achieved success in netball, hockey, soccer and rugby and two students were selected for the North Island under 16 secondary schools rugby team, Jonah Lomu and Sam Nonoa were selected for the New Zealand under 17 secondary schools rugby team and Sam Nonoa and Kenneth Pourewa were selected for the New Zealand secondary school rugby team for which Sam Nonoa scored two tries in the test match against Australia. Some four students, both boys and girls participated on voyages of the sail training ships Spirit of Adventure and Spirit of New Zealand during the course of the year. Kiri Lane became the College's first girl DUX and Carl Morley was awarded the W F Birch Educational Scholarship for 1992, while Silina Bale was awarded a three-year scholarship to study in France.

During the course of the year we substantially upgraded our classroom computer facilities and much of the year in the Administration area was devoted to developing an integrated software system for the production of Board of Governors monthly accounts and to provide an enhanced statement for parents.

The College was delighted with the decision that our 1994 150th Anniversary project was to raise \$5 million for the College, the major part of which was to provide a much needed recreation centre.

Tragically, the last full weekend of our 1991 College year will forever be a black one in all of our minds when one of our students was horribly injured as a result of a horrendous beating at approximately midnight on a Sunday. The beating was administered by a senior student who had been officially signed out of school into the control of his family and who had no reason to be at school.

1992

In 1989 after commencing as Principal of Wesley College, Mr. Graeme Cowley applied to the then Department of Education for permission to appoint a Guidance Counsellor at the school. Although declined then, this dream was finally realised at the beginning of 1992 when Mrs. Judith Philips, BEd, DipTchg, was appointed to the College as the School's first formal Guidance Counsellor.

Scott Kahle was appointed as Head Prefect while Etika Langi and Scott Mabey were joint Deputy Head Prefects for the boys and Ilima Fifita was Deputy Head Prefect representing the girls.

During the course of the year seventh form student Brendon Hogg departed to spend a year in the United States of America under the auspices of the EF Foundation while sixth former Michael Costello was selected as an AFS student to travel to Edina in Minnesota. Duane Taiapa was selected as an AFS student to spend a year in Portugal. It was a pleasure to welcome Japanese AFS student Yukio Shinano to Wesley.



During 1992, Form two students were readmitted to the College in readiness for the commencement of a Form 1 and 2 composite class in 1993.

In the 1992 Australian Mathematics Competition, ten students gained Certificates of Credit while Neil Cramp was awarded a Certificate of Distinction and a prize. Wesley students also participated in the Australian Science Competition gaining pleasing results.

During the 1992 year, twenty former College students graduated from New Zealand universities.

A pleasing aspect of the 1992 school year was the involvement of students in cultural activities with the continuation of the Maori Culture Group and the formation of a Tongan and a Melanesian Cultural group. These latter two groups went from strength to strength and won a number of trophies at the Maori and Pacific Islands Cultural Festival while the Tongan Group was invited to perform before the Maori Queen at Turangawaewae. A one-hour per week special cultural programme for Form 2 to 4 students was commenced early in Term 3 in which students could opt into Maori, Tongan, Samoan or Melanesian Cultural activities. These groups subsequently performed at a concert in Pukekohe and were very well received.

All College students participated in the usual Inter-House cultural activities and in addition, a choral workshop was held in association with Hamilton Girls' High School at Wesley over ANZAC weekend. The cultural highlight of our College year was the production in Term 2 of the rock musical "Godspell". This was performed in the Chapel over six successive nights and the standard achieved by students was a credit to the Producer, Mrs. Richardson and to the Musical Director, Mr. Smythe. Of those who saw it few will ever forget the outstanding performance of Etika Lani as Jesus.

College Chapel activities developed markedly during the year with a strong student Fellowship Group, visits to other Methodist Churches and the baptisms and confirmations of a number of College students.

As usual, Wesley students participated enthusiastically in a wide variety of summer and winter sports. The inaugural Topline Traders Road Race was held at Wesley College in mid- April and this event was an addition to the Winstone Cup Inter-House Competition.

For the first time in its history, the College fielded a girls' soccer team in the Southern Zone of the Auckland Secondary schools' Girls' Soccer Association.

Students from the College had the opportunity to participate in the New Zealand Secondary Schools Ski-ing competition, the Auckland Secondary Schools Golf competition and in the Manukau Secondary Schools events comprising athletics, tennis and cross-country.

Jonah Lomu was selected for the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby team and successfully represented his country against both Ireland and Australia.

In addition to the substantial financial assistance provided for students at College by the Wesley College Trust Board and the Robert Gibson Methodist Trust, the ASB Charitable Trust also strongly increased its commitment to the College and we were also grateful for the support of Te Puni Kokiri which assisted with funding for some Maori students during the year.

During the course of the year, we appointed Mr. Bert Phillips as our Maintenance Manager and not only has he been extremely popular in that position but he has done much to upgrade standards within the dormitories and the College environs.

At the end of the year, we sadly farewelled Mr. Brian McDonald and Jeff Lockhart who had accepted positions as Head of Social Sciences and Head of Art respectively at Pukekohe High School for 1993. Ms Vanessa Ball and Mrs. Sharon Thomson both resigned their teaching positions in order to spend more time raising their families. We also farewelled Mr. Bob Chesney who held a term by term relieving position for the year.



We were pleased to welcome to our prizegiving Mr. Kevin Wilson, ACA, ACIS, ANZIM, DipTchg, to teach Economics and Mathematics next year, and Miss. Maureen Thomson, BEd, DipTchg, to teach the Form 1 and 2 class in 1993. The Principal also announced the appointment of Mr. Richard Smythe, MSc(Hons), DipTchg, as the College's next Head of Mathematics and Computer Studies.

1993

Miss. Julie-Anna Child, MFS, joined the College as Head of Art, Mr. Chris Bean, BA, DipTchg, returned to Wesley to teach Social Sciences, Mr. Bennett Kaa, BSc, DipTchg, MNZIP came to teach Mathematics and Mr. Tim Kaye, BA, ACTL (Speech and Drama), DipRec. And Sport to teach English, History and Social Studies. Ms Vanessa Ball, BSc., DipTchg resumed teaching Mathematics on a part-time basis and Rev. Bill Chessum returned to teach Music and Life and Faith. Rev. Manihera resigned from his position as Maori Tutor due to ill health and we farewelled Mrs. Clare Turuwhenua early in the year.

Significantly 1993 saw the College roll increase by ten percent to 363 pupils and the reintroduction of Form 1 pupils to again make the school a truly Form 1-7 College. With the increase in roll, the Trust Board provided a new classroom for Form 1 and 2 students and a new kiln room was being constructed before the year was finished. The Board of Governors purchased a new building to be used as a day boys' Common Room with associated ablution facilities and in honour of our former Senior Master this was called the "Watson Common Room".

In addition to the normal external qualifications, Wesley College students participated in the Massey University-based "Creativity in Science and Technology" activities and participated in the Australian Schools Science competition which was held under the auspices of the University of New South Wales, with three students gaining Certificates of Distinction and 17 other students gaining lesser Certificates. Wesley students also participated in the Australian National Chemistry Quiz which was organised by the Royal Australian Chemical Institute with two students gaining Certificates of Merit with High Distinction, three with Distinction and one with Credit. As usual, Wesley College students participated in the Australian Mathematics Competition achieving four Certificates of Distinction and eight Certificates of Credit.

A pleasing development has been the involvement of our Sixth Form Accounting class in the "Young Enterprise Scheme" which was founded more than a decade earlier by a National Trust sponsored by businesses of whom the major one is Fletcher Challenge. This scheme aims to teach pupils practical business skills through the formation of a company to market a service, a product of both from April to September of any given year. Wesley pupils set up "Ka Awatea Enterprises" (From Out of the Darkness) to act as a public relations and promotional company for the College.

We were delighted that 27 former Wesley College students graduated from New Zealand universities this year.

Throughout 1993, Wesley College student continued to excel at individual team and group activities. The College First Rugby XV in an unprecedented achievement won the Caltex Top Four Tournament for supremacy in First XV Rugby and also won the Condors National Sevens titles and except for an administrative decision should by rights also have held the MOASCAR Cup after Wesley College defeated Gisborne Boys' High School by 11 points to 8 in extra time.

Jonah Lomu, the First XV captain, was selected to represent New Zealand Secondary Schools in test matches against England and Australia.

The Wesley College First XV was invited to represent New Zealand Secondary Schools in a rugby tournament in Taipei in 1994 as a consequence of winning the National Top Four competition.

The College First and Second XI's and the girls' soccer team all won their respective team championships while our hockey and netball teams made spirited efforts in their competitions.

Robert Wakelin in Orienteering and Nicholas Hall in Gymnastics both represented New Zealand in competitions in Australia.



At the ASB Young Sportsperson of the Year dinner on 26 November Paula Gruber received the award for Girls' Cricket while Jonah Lomu was successful in rugby and also received the award for the Allrounder Category and in a final triumph was announced as the ASB Young Sportsman of the Year.

During the year 1993, AFS Scholars Dean Robins left for Brazil , Kylie Bloxham left for Belgium and Heath Calman left for the USA while Lucas Uasuf from Argentina arrived to spend a year at the College.

Wesley students participated in a wide range of cultural activities including the wonderful musical production "Murder at Music Hall". The Maori and Pacific Islands Cultural Festival in which the Tonga Group came first in the Kailao and second in the Best Boys' Group and there were excellent performances from the Maori and the Melanesian Cultural Groups and also in the usual inter-house activities.

Our Senior Lady, Mrs. Richardson journeyed to the Solomon Islands and Vanuatu and Fiji to meet our extended Wesley College family and to visit High Commission staff, Scholarship Officers, Church staff, Prime Ministers, Ministers of Finance and Education and local school Principals.

The College was indebted to the 18 College Prefects and the Deputy Head Prefects, Anna Seccombe, Jonah Lomu, Michael Butler and Mapa Tu'ipulotu and our Head Prefect, Scott Hay and later Michael Butler, for their leadership within the School.

Sadly, our College Chaplain, the Rev. Alan Upson, resigned his position at the end of Term 1 and we were grateful to the Church for providing us with visiting preachers and particularly to those staff and students who took a prominent role in organising our Sunday night services. We were indebted to the Rev. Bill Chessum who reorganised his schedule so that he could take our Life and Faith classes during the latter part of the year. Students from the College enjoyed participating in other Methodist Church services.

At the end of the year, Mr. Leon Ducker (HOD Technical), left the College after 30 years of service to the school and he was thanked for his dedication to Wesley and for his wider contributions both in the Chapel and in outdoor education. Mr. Bennett Kaa, BSc, DipTchg, who had held a relieving position for 1993 also left at the end of the year.

1994

The year commenced with the arrival of two new members of staff, Mr. Eric Sharples who has a Bolton Institute of Technology Diploma and a St Helens College of Technology City and Guilds Foundry and Patternshop qualification who was appointed to teach woodwork based Workshop Technology and Graphics and Design and Mr. Tofia Taufalele, Assoc. of Science Diploma, BSc, DipTchg, TTC, who was appointed to teach Mathematics to Form Seven.

At the beginning of the year, 20 College Prefects were appointed and among them, were five Deputy Head Prefects, Megan Taylor, Davis Harara, Kirk Manihera, Daniel Price and Evan Rakena, while Craig Campbell was appointed Head Prefect.

Alain Boudreau from Canada joined the College as an AFS student.

During 1993, preparation was made for the introduction in 1994 of a Seventh Form National Certificate of Business qualification in conjunction with Manukau Polytechnic Institute so that our Commerce students will have the opportunity to gain papers in this tertiary qualification in addition to their normal school qualifications. Wesley Staff were accredited to teach this school-based programme with moderation to be carried out by the Polytechnic.

The College looks forward in 1994 to a generous grant of Ministry of Education deferred maintenance money to enable the teaching block incorporating the Science laboratories and the Art Room to be fully refurbished.

During the course of the preceding Christmas holidays, deferred maintenance money from the Ministry of Education enabled the eucalyptus tree fronting State Highway 22 to be felled and classrooms 5-9 and the adjoining corridor to



be refurbished along with the outside of the Administration Block.

At this point in time, we look forward to Wesley's sesquicentennial which will be celebrated from 1-9 October at the College and celebrations will also be held in many of the Pacific Islands. Associated with the celebrations at Wesley will be the construction and subsequent opening of a magnificent new Recreation Centre to be erected adjacent to Caughey Hall on the previous netball/tennis courts. It will be an extraordinarily important facility which will be thoroughly enjoyed and utilised by Wesley College students and also, we hope, the local community for many years to come.

During the last fortnight of Term 1, a party of 23 First XV members, Messrs Palavi, Sanson and the Principal accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. Dunn and Mr. and Mrs. Price journeyed to Hong Kong and Taiwan where the First XV played in the Ninth Pan Pacific Youth Rugby Tournament, although this tournament has never previously been won by a New Zealand school team, Wesley had high hopes of being the first team to do so but in spite of playing particularly well, they lost their final game to Tupou College from Tonga but brought home a magnificent trophy for second place in the competition. More importantly, team members played to the best of their ability, were extremely popular with their competitors and with their hosts and their behaviour and deportment were a credit to the College.

1995

The College celebrated a kaleidoscope of successes this year, although it may well be remembered by some as the annum which said farewell too soon and marked the end of an era for another. Here we acknowledge intermediate student Wayne Robinson who passed away of a life debilitating disease on September 25, and Mr. White who was involved in a traffic accident during the August Holiday Break. It was also the last of seventeen years dedicated to the English department, head teaching staff, champion College soccer squads, cross country, road race events and College life in general by HOD, Mr. Stephen Fordyce (1978-1995).

New staff appointments included Chaplain, Rev. George Bryant and his wife Joan (Relief teaching, with a focus on ESOL students); past Wesley student Rev. Stephen Tema (Guidance Counsellor); Mr. P Irving (Maths); Mr. N Leger



(PE) and Matron Roxburgh who replaced Matron Phillips at the helm of Te Paea Girl's Dorm.

Temporary positions were held by relief teacher Mr. Jean-Paul Eason - another past Wesley student - Mr. Greg Oates in the Maths department and the regular addition of GAP Students [whom provide Prep Supervision throughout their stay] were Mr. Ed McMullen and Mr. Charlie Norton. The College has also bid a brief adieu to Mr. Kraushaar who will spend a year working at a school in Britain and Mrs. Annie Sio-Tema who leaves us for maternity leave and takes our well wishes with her.

The College roll boasted 428 students this year with an increased number of boarders in both the boys (249) and girls (34) quarters – despite seven of the latter choosing to leave Te Paea by Term 4, in pursuit of tertiary study and other endeavours. There were also a record number of day students which initiated extensions to the Junior Locker room to accommodate the influx, and the College proudly hosted AFS scholar Denis Nougailon from France – who was the proud recipient of a College blazer generously donated by the Friends of Wesley.

During this year there were 27 College Prefects nominated to lead the student body, with Evan Rakena being supported in his post as Head Prefect, by Deputy Head Prefects Michele Dickin, Kevin Metuisela, Stuart Price and Rocky Tuku.

Academic achievements for the year began with news that 14 of last year's student body gained University Entrance – including one A Bursary and six B Bursaries – whilst a total of twenty two former students graduated from New Zealand Universities over the course of the year. Ten of our current seventh form students also attained passes in the First Semester exam for the Accounting Principles paper offered through Manukau Polytechnic, whilst Eleanora Biukoto was awarded an A Grade for her efforts.

At the end of year Prizegiving the esteemed title of Dux Litterarum was presented to Rebecca Ward which recognised her being awarded the Morley Cup for Academic Achievement, the Franklin Rose Croix Service Trophy for Best All-Round Girl, the prize for Best Arts Student and a first in History, Biology, Geography and English.

Thanks to the support of numerous staff and the commitment of the students themselves, many entered in local sports competitions competing in cricket, cross country, equestrian, golf, hockey, netball, rugby, skiing, soccer, swimming, tae kwon do, tennis and volleyball. Certain individuals then went on to celebrate personal successes on a regional and national scale. A number of College students competed in and achieved placings at both the Manukau Athletic Championships and North Island Athletic Championships; Koula Tukino was selected for the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby Team to tour Australia and Stuart Price played as a reserve for the Northern Region A Rugby Team to tour Fiji. Andrew Haliday competed in the New Zealand Under 18 Badminton Competition; Nicholas Hall was Runner Up in Level 9 of the New Zealand Gymnastics Championships and a competitor in the Australian National Gymnastics Championships; with Danielle Taylor receiving a Bronze Medal in the Junior Women's section at the New Zealand Olympic Luge Championships which ranked her 3rd in New Zealand.

The Dux Ludorum award went to Koula Tukino who also received the Bennett Cup for outstanding Rugby Player, Blues in Athletics and Rugby, and the McDonald's Franklin Under 19 Sportsman of the Year.

The Colleges' contribution to the arts begun in earnest with four cultural groups diligently practicing day and night in Term One in order to perform at The Maori and Pacific Islands Secondary Schools Festival. There were Maori, Samoan and Melanesian collectives whom delighted the non-competitive section and a Tongan group that was placed 1st in the Me'e Tu'upaki and 2nd in the Mako. Towards the end of 1995 students also combined to form the Wesley College Festival Choir which was placed 2nd in the One Big Voice competition for singers of sacred songs. On a social note, senior students were fortunate enough to enjoy their well-attended School Ball at Alexander Park.

The spiritual character of the College was strengthened by 20 student chapel monitors, whom organised and participated in, a number of student-led Sunday night services where religious drama, multi-cultural performances, group and solo items, as well as visiting youth groups were appreciated. The student chapel monitors were also pivotal in nurturing the enthusiasm of the 30 strong student youth group, who met regularly for fellowship and



delivered outreach concerts to churches around Auckland.

Lastly in May, on behalf of the College, Mrs. Richardson embarked on an annual visit to the Pacific Islands to meet with the families, schools and church leaders of existing and potential students. The Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Papua New Guinea were all on her itinerary. In late July the College were then honoured to host the Papua New Guinea High Commissioner to Australia and Papua New Guinea Honorary Consul in Auckland who described Wesley as “...one of Auckland’s best kept educational secrets” – high praise and a standard to build on.

Mr. Fordyce (DP) left the College this year.

1996

This year signalled a time of commemoration, conclusion and change for the College. The last day of November marked twenty years since we became the first private school integrated into the state school system and we accepted an invitation from Te Papa Museum of New Zealand to display selected items from our boys’ school uniform as part of their Mana Pasifika exhibition. We acknowledged the thirty years of service Messrs Eric Beavis and Brian Caughey have devoted to Wesley and we agreed to end Saturday morning classes in favour of establishing five and seven day boarding. We also begun plans for building a Whare Wananga (to be situated near the current location of the College tennis courts) and a Day Student Facility with a specific edition for girls.

New staff appointments included Mr. R Biddle (DP); Mr. D Appiah (English); Mrs. Ayers (Fabric Tech); Dr S Das (Physics/Maths); Mrs. L Gaines (Geography, Soc Sciences); Mr. J Henderson (HOD English); Mr. P Radmore (PE); Ms G Townsend (Science/Tech), Mrs. H Clarke (Maths) and Messrs Tuitama, Morrison and Lambert (Boys’ Hostel Supervisors).

Temporary positions were held by our GAP students Tom Goy, Matthew McCahearty, Melanie Dinnis and Sarah McCormack – the latter being the first females whom have participated in this programme at Wesley – with all four providing prep supervision at different stages throughout the year. The College also bid farewell to Ms Caulton (New Plymouth Girls’ High), Mr. Eason (Pukekohe High School) and Mrs. Williams (Manurewa High) who have all accepted teaching posts in alternative locations around the country, whilst Mr. Ngatai (Japan) and Ms J Child (Brunei) are leaving our shores for opportunities overseas.

The College roll was marginally lower than last year with 402 students filing along its corridors, of which 230 were boarders including some of our youngest students in Form One. We were also home to AFS scholar Martin Gorkiewicz from Santiago in Argentina.

27 prefects were elected to support the staff and student population alike, with Deputy Head Prefects Moses Alatini, Rolando Hanipale, Tima Kaitani and Jacob Prisk assisting Head Boy Rocky Tuku in the lead role.

Academic achievements for the year were initiated with the promising news that eight students had attained University Entrance including four A Bursary and four B Bursary grades. A group of gifted scientists soon followed with the College touting 3 distinction passes, 7 credit passes and 19 achievement passes in the Australian Schools Science Competition, as well as 3 Certificates of Merit with Distinction and 2 Certificates of Merit with Credit in the Australian National Chemistry Quiz. Furthermore, Beikake Meita was selected to attend the Science Women – Our Future Conference, in Wellington due to her outstanding results in this field.

The prestigious Dux Litterarum was awarded to Zinnia David for placing 1st in English, History and Life and Faith. Zinnia also received the prize for Best Arts Student and the Leonard Knight Memorial Prize for Senior Economics.

Considering the size of our student population the College fielded another admirable number of teams in local sports competitions including basketball, cricket, golf, hockey, netball, rugby, soccer, triathlon, tennis, swimming, tae kwon do and volleyball. Group participation and enthusiasm were high with the end of season conveying a range of results, which no doubt contributed to some degree for the successes celebrated by various individuals at national and international levels.

Nicholas Hall continued to demonstrate his competence from last year when placed second in the Under 18 section of the New Zealand Gymnastics Competition and as the New Zealand Representative in the Australian Competition. Scott Moyle managed a third in the New Zealand Open Judo Secondary School’s Championships, while Lester Holani



and Salesi Moimoi were respectively selected to play for the New Zealand Secondary School's Rugby Team and B Squad. Our 7s Team did well to win the National Condors Tournament, alongside the 1st XV who reigned supreme in the Counties Secondary Rugby Championships and were placed 8th in the New Zealand Secondary Schools Competition. There were also 2 students named in the Counties Under 15 Squad and another 2 for the Under 16 Squad. Our boys volleyball team gained a 3rd in the Auckland Secondary School's Volleyball Competition at which Salesi Moimoi was selected for the tournament team and the College travelled in another year of success with multiple placings at the Manukau Athletic Championships.

Salesi Moimoi was named Dux Ludorum this year, marking his achievements of Senior Boys Athletic Champion in addition to Blues in Rugby and Volleyball.

A large number of students were rewarded for their persistent rehearsals this year when the Tongan group were named the overall winners of their cultural section at The Maori and Pacific Islands Secondary Schools Festival; whilst members of the Maori, Samoan and Melanesian groups who entered the non-competitive section also contributed to the high standard of performances. A fitting result was Wesley being announced as the best behaved and best turned out school involved. To this end the Melanesian Group went on to compete later in the year at the Wantok Association Competition – where they received two second placings as well as a 3rd – if only there were a section for them to contest at the festival.

Cultural happenings in 1996 comprised of Mr. and Mrs. Cowley attending the commemorative dinner for the Coronation of Te Arikinui Dame Te Atairangikaahu at the Turangawaewae Marae in Ngaruawahia; the College's annual visit to the Pacific Islands – again by Mrs. Richardson – who was fortunate enough to spend time meeting with the families, schools and church leaders of existing and potential students in Kiribati, Tuvalu, Fiji, Solomon Islands, Papua New Guinea and Vanuatu; while Rev. Tema and Mr. Irving also went to Samoa and Tonga on our behalf. There were also occasions when we were privileged enough to play host as the President of the Methodist Church of NZ, Rev. Tuvake Tupou, and the Vice-President Jill van de Geer included a visit to the College in their busy schedules this year, as well as two rugby teams visiting from a private Methodist School in Singapore, and a team from Tokiwa High School in Japan.

Mrs. Richardson left the College this year.

Students exercised their skill for new ventures this year with the launch of the Interact Club (a youth version of the Rotary initiative) and a barbershop group called Revealing Echoes. Both groups were intent on participating in community outreach which saw them travel to various places around Auckland. On the other hand it was the College that were blessed with donations when the Trust Board offered contributions to the Girls' soccer and netball teams, as well as equipment for the library, tuck shop, games room and chapel.

Finally, a solemn acknowledgement goes to the bereavement of Mr. Arthur Winstone – who gave 35 years of his life to the Wesley College Trust Board, was President of the Old Boys Association and donor of the renowned Winstone Cup, as well as the Maori Leadership Award presented at our annual Prizegivings. Go now in peace, Sir.

1997

The greatly anticipated construction of the Wesley Whare Wananga begun this year - with an estimated cost of \$450,000 - it will be erected east of the Tennis Courts, where the Horticultural Block currently sits. 1997 also marks the annum when 22 former Wesley students graduated from New Zealand Universities and we were extremely proud to learn that Jason Turuwhenua won a \$64,000 Science Scholarship to complete his PhD in physics.

New staff appointments included Ms S Cogan (HOD Art) and Miss. J Rayner (Maths, English and History), whilst the College happily welcomed Mr. Kraushaar back to his former post, as well as appointing Messrs. J Henderson and W Sanson as our Acting Senior Masters.

Temporary positions were filled by our GAP students Jessica McMullen, Gareth Miller, Nicholas Brown, Richard McPhail and Michael Baldock who satisfied the task of prep supervision for another year, whilst Mr. Eric Sharples (HOD Workshop Technology and Graphics), has moved on to a teaching position in Timaru and Mr. Nick Leger looks forward to a one year teaching exchange in Felixstowe, England.



The College roll almost returned to its full strength of 1995, with 416 enrolled this year only 12 short of the previous number. The College were responsible for 248 male boarders, 123 day students - including 12 girls who added to the total number of 54 female students - as well as 82 international students. We also hosted AFS Scholar Atte Sebastian Flores Aravz, from Costa Rica.

Our Head Prefect Keith Taulahi was one of 24 College Prefects selected this year, and he was supported by Deputy Head Prefects Daryl Habraken, Isi Tupou, Nicky Kaierua, Seilala Mapasua and Koli Latailakepa.

The College were pleased to unveil their academic achievements for the year with the news that 23 former students had gained University Entrance including 12, B Bursary grades and of the School C results announced a number of 4th formers and a 3rd former received excellent passes. Over the year we also took pride in 16 of our students achieving external qualifications with 5 students passing the Accounting Principles paper offered by the Manukau Institute of Technology, 8 students passed the Economics Environment paper offered at the same location and 4 students completed both; whilst 3 students were awarded passes for the Young Enterprise Scheme exams offered by the Auckland University of Technology. At a national level the Wesley A Team won the regional NZSE Stockmarket Game Competition and placed 3rd in the country and Joanna Ward was the recipient of an ASB scholarship.

At an international level Emerson Taylor and Ben Henry gained Distinction Certificates in the Australian School's Science Competition offered by the University of NSW, and in the Australian National Chemistry Quiz Mary Lee attained a High Distinction, with Etuini Ma'u and Karotu Tannang, receiving Distinction passes.

At the year's completion Etuini Ma'u was awarded the distinguished Dux Litterarum award in recognition of receiving the BHP New Zealand Steel Prize for Best Science Student, and firsts in English, Chemistry, Maths with Calculus and Maths with Statistics.

The College demonstrated its usual commitment to local sports competitions by fielding teams in basketball, cross country, cricket, golf, hockey, netball, rugby, soccer, tennis, swimming, tae kwon do and volleyball. We begin by acknowledging the much deserved accomplishments of our 1st XV who won the Counties Manukau Competition and the Nike National 1st XV Competition which led to an invitation to play at the World Secondary School's Competition in Zimbabwe next year. Our College Rugby 7s Team were also runners up in the Gilbert National Secondary School's Sevens comp, whilst our 1st Soccer XI won the Counties Manukau A Grade with a record 9 wins and 1 loss. The Wesley Senior Boys and Senior Girls Volleyball Teams represented Auckland in the National Secondary School's Volleyball Champs with remarkable results for both considering the small pool of players to select from - the boys won the super league and the girls were runners up.

Individual accolades went to Nicholas Hall who was selected to represent NZ in the Under 18 section of the Trans-Tasman Gymnastics Competition in Australia; Luke Vazey was named in the Counties Secondary School's representative Hockey Team; and Simon Jepsen was asked to Captain the Under 20 Cricket Team to tour Hong Kong and South Africa. In rugby Salesi Moimoi was picked for the Nike NA Youth Rugby Team to tour Canada and England, Sione Kepu played for New Zealand Secondary School's Rugby Team and a significant number were selected for Counties Manukau Secondary School's Rugby Teams - including 10, 1st XV players, 5 for the Under 16 Team and 2 for the Under 14 Team. Regional accomplishments were also celebrated by Joanna Ward, Dali Jobsen and Charlamaine Te Ao who qualified for the Manukau Swimming Championships; Beatrice Schindler, Joanna Ward and Lian Wharepouri who qualified for the Manukau Athletics Championships - with Wesley boys achieving final placings in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior sections of the same competition - and Tracey O'Connor and Dali Jobson qualified for the Manukau Cross Country Champs as well.

For the second year in a row Dux Ludorum went to Salesi Moimoi, again for being awarded the Senior Boys Athletics' Champion and Blues for Volleyball and Rugby.

In Term One the College supported four cultural groups to enter the annual Maori and Pacific Islands Secondary Schools Festival in Auckland. We celebrated placing's on the Tongan stage - 1st in Me'etu'upaki and 3rd in Kailao -



alongside fine performances delivered by our Maori, Samoan and Melanesian groups. Staying with the arts our Tongan and Melanesia groups were invited to perform at a state dinner for the President of Mongolia and the National Maritime Museum called upon our Solomon Island group to perform for the presentation of the Solomon Island canoe Lolalitolu. Closer to home, Sitalimani Lolohea designed murals for a wall in the Counties Steelers Stadium and their Supporters Club, while our 4th form exhibited art work at The Old Courthouse Gallery in Papakura. Internally our School Band were reinforced by the help of a special grant for more instruments which led to a record number of 15 players and the fruits of their labour were enjoyed at the Senior Prizegiving – conducted by their tutor Rev. Chessum and his assistant Mr. Smythe.

Wesley's annual visit to the Pacific Islands was undertaken by Mrs. Townsend this year who spoke highly of her experiences meeting with the families, schools and church leaders of existing and potential students in Kiribati, Tuvalu, Fiji, the Solomon Islands and Vanuatu. Elsewhere in the region Rev. Tema and Mr. Palavi made the most of their time in Western Samoa, Fiji and Tonga; while travelling in the opposite direction Mr. and Mrs. Cowley were fortunate to attend the 3rd International Convention of Principals in Boston, America, followed by a visit to Montreal under the AFS NZ Educator Award to represent New Zealand at their annual, International Convention. Back on Wesley soil we hosted 16 Japanese students from Tokiwa High School, who travelled from the University of Waikato to spend a day engaged in cultural activities with our students.

This year's Senior School Ball was held at Clifford House in Mission Bay, where students enjoyed a well organised evening along with chaperoning staff.

The Chapel was at the heart of many a special occasion this year including a baptism and confirmation service held for a small group of students, a significant increase in Holy Communion, community outreach to churches around Auckland, several visits by guest preachers and the Rev. G Bryant livened up our repertoire of hymns with favourites introduced following his visit to Hills Church in Sydney.

The Interact Club enjoyed a second year of activities organising fundraisers. These included a Junior Social with Epsom Grammar and St Cuthberts and a BBQ with the Pukekohe High School Interact Club, which donated to the National Braille Collection and Christian World Service in aid of providing a village in East Timor with milking goats.

Finally, the College wishes to acknowledge the Association of Presbyterian Women and Methodist Women's Fellowship who raised funds for a Day Girls' Centre which will be incorporated into the design of the new Day Student's Facility; and to the Friends of Wesley who donated library books, games equipment and a contribution to the production of the first ever Te Paea magazine.

1998

This year the College was finally blessed with the long awaited approval for Sherwood Trust funds to be utilised for scholarships, new school buildings – a Day Student Centre, [the already in construction] Whare Wananga, a new Dining Room, Kitchen and Laundry – as well as a much needed contribution towards the maintenance of existing structures. We also marked the departure of Paul Burt and his wife Betty after 33 years of service to the College, and the passing of former Wesley student James Beever, who by the age of 85 could count being President of the Old Boys Association, a longstanding Trust Board member and a Fellow of Wesley among his many acts of service to our alumni. On an equally solemn note, intermediate student Fernlea Rangihaeata – the son of a Wesley old boy - lost his battle with cancer on 26 June, after only 18 months attendance.

New staff appointments saw Jim Field-Mitchell (HOD Tech), Mrs. Field-Mitchell (English and History), Ms Lorraine Fuller (travelled from Felixstowe, due to a teacher-exchange with Mr. Leger), and Chris Johnston (School Bursar) join the College.

Additional responsibilities were also formalised for Mr. J Henderson and W Sanson in their role as Senior Masters, Chris Bean was appointed HOD Social Sciences, Mrs. Annie Sio-Tema became HOD English and Rev. S Tema was confirmed as our part-time Chaplain.

Mrs. B Thorensen (School Busar) and Rev. G Bryant left Wesley at the end of the year, as did our temporary staff



Richard McPhail, Michael Baldock, Patrick Stone and William Page whom arrived via the GAP programme and supported prep supervision in the boys' hostel.

In 1998 the College had 413 students on its roll with slightly fewer female students (48) than last year and 75 international students including Chris Gough and Anthony Ross whom came to us all the way from Woodhouse Grove School in England where two of our students - Mark Price and Patrick Tongi - then attended in Term 4. AFS scholar Riku Pentikainen was perhaps our most exotic addition, as he hailed from Finland.

Early in the year 27 College Prefects were elected to lead the College with Senior Prefect Koli Latailakepa and his two Deputy Head Prefects Mary Lee and Seilala Mapasua taking on the lead roles.

For the College, our academic achievements begun with the knowledge that 21 candidates from 1997 had gained University Entrance and 12 of these were bursaries - 6 at A level and 6 at B level. There were mixed results for School Certificate although of particular note was our top student who scored 360 in five subjects and a 4th Form student who received 80% for science. In the Australian Schools Science Competition offered by the University of NSW, Emerson Taylor received a High Distinction Pass with Keith Izett receiving a Distinction pass for his efforts. Emerson also received a Certificate of Merit with Distinction in the Australian National Chemistry Quiz, whilst Mary Lee achieved a Certificate of Merit with Credit for the same test. Back on our national stage Emerson continued to excel with a Distinction and cash prize for his efforts in the Senior Schools Science Quiz offered by the University of Otago, whilst Keith Izett was awarded a Merit.

In the Australian Mathematics Competition it was Lachlan Bruce who received a Distinction pass in the Senior Division, with 19 credit passes going to other Wesley students.

The College is also proud to acknowledge scholarship recipients Braden Te Ao – who received the first ever Waikato Rautapu Lands Trust co-funded Scholarship (Wesley College Trust Board are other contributors), with Seilala Mapasua, Enny Keaki, Sarah Brandt and Mary Lee all being named as winners of ASB scholarships. We are also delighted to note that twelve past Wesleyan students have graduated from New Zealand universities over the course of the year.

The esteemed Dux Litterarum prize went to Ka Menu Lee for which recognised her receipt of the BHP New Zealand Award for Best Science Student, first in Chemistry and Maths with Statistics, the Franklin Rose Croix Service Trophy for Best All Round Girl and The Morley Cup for Academic Achievement by a Girl.

This year the College fielded teams in local sports competitions for basketball, cricket, golf, hockey, netball, rugby, soccer, tennis, swimming, tae kwon do and volleyball – as well as making a debut in girls' outriggering.

1998 marked numerous group and individual endeavours in regional, national and international arenas. Our College Boys 1st Soccer XI was a prime example with their win of the Counties Manukau A Grade and the seven players from this team who were selected for the Counties Manukau Secondary Schools Representative Team. The College Girls 1st Soccer XI also won the Counties Manukau B Grade. In rugby our College 7s Team were invited to play in the National Final of the New Zealand Secondary Schools 7s Competition held in Christchurch, the 1st XV were runners up in the Inaugural LENCO Cup Competition, finished 8th in the Top 32 New Zealand Schools Competition and a selected few went on to win the World 10s Rugby Competition in Sydney. Individual accomplishments were awarded to Sione Kepu who was named in the Nike New Zealand Youth Rugby Team to tour North America and Wales, Koli Latailakepa received the Fair Play Award at the Westpac Trust Counties Manukau Sports Awards, Seilala Mapasua was selected for the Counties Manukau Steelers Rugby Team and the New Zealand Under 19s Secondary School's Team with teammate Hale Tu'uhoko. Four of the 1st XV were also selected for the Northern Region A Rugby Team, with 12 of the same team selected for the Counties Manukau Secondary Schools Under 19s Representative Team and an impressive number of other Wesley players were named across the representative age groups – Under 17s, Under 16s and Under 14s.

In Term One Billy Wallbridge-Paea was selected to represent Counties in the Club National Athletics Championships and Danny Given competed in the New Zealand Secondary Schools Athletic Championships in Christchurch.

Dux Ludorum was bestowed upon Seilala Mapasua for his selection in the New Zealand Under 19s Rugby Team, New



Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby Team and the Counties Steelers Rugby Team – all for which he received a Blue. Seilala also captained numerous sides to victory including the Wesley College 1st XV, the Wesley College 10s Rugby Team and the hugely successful Stanton House who triumphed in the Inter-house Choral Competition, Swimming Competition, Athletics and overall Winston Cup title.

The College took a different approach to the Maori and Pacific Islands Secondary Schools Festival this year by creating a Polynesian Group of approximately 100 students who set out to perform for the non-competitive section on the Maori stage with the objective to make “an attempt to understand a little bit of a different culture”. Their fusion of Polynesian and Melanesian cultural dances provided an enviable reflection of the 20 different ethnicities that currently live at the College and was very popular amongst festival-goers. Resonating with this sense of integration a group of 12 Wesley students were later selected to represent NZ at the first ever Melanesian Arts Festival and 20th Anniversary of Independence Celebrations in Honiara, Solomon Islands. What an honour!

The Chapel were blessed with a follow on from last year’s spiritual revival in that there were again a number of baptism, confirmation and recommitment services throughout 1998, as well as record participation in the 40 hour famine – for which the College raised \$2000. Student groups continued with community outreach to churches around Auckland and the College hosted a number of guest preachers.

Added to this was an international visitor’s list which included the Hon. Major-General Sitiveni Rabuka, Prime Minister of the Republic of Fiji Islands and his wife, a group of students and staff from Tokiwa High School and Mihagino Girls’ High School in Japan and a group of Educators from Spain, Sweden and Hong Kong as well as an AFS delegation.

Here we proudly announce the acceptance of Shannon Tauroa for an AFS exchange to Argentina and Sarsha Wright’s Rotary Exchange to Belgium, both planned for 1999.

Lastly our special events calendar included the Senior Ball – a Night at the Emmy Awards - held at the Strand Function Centre in Parnell, a Coaches’ Dinner where guest speaker Peter Fatialofa entertained and a 1st XV Fundraising Dinner which welcomed our very own Jonah Lomu back to fill the VIP spot. College firsts took shape with the 24 senior students who were trained as reading tutors to support selected juniors – a very successful peer programme that we hope to see replicated in years to come – and Ms Gaines introduced the Astronomy Club.

Thanks are extended to the Friends of Wesley whose annual donations assisted with uniforms for two College sports teams and library books this year, not to mention the noble endeavours of our Interact Club who raised money to fund a small business for an impoverished family in South India.

1999

The College began its year on a cultural note with the Blake Recital and supper, aptly titled An Evening of Romance, where twelve students participated in an event organised by the 7th Form English Teachers. Thanks to a dedicated team of seven budding journalists our student paper the Wesley Bullet was also Revived, with 3 editions produced over the course of the year. Possibly the most exciting development – at least for his unsuspecting parents Mr. and Mrs. Bean - Callum Wesley Bean arrived on site this year and is now the proud bearer of a middle name that marks his origins.

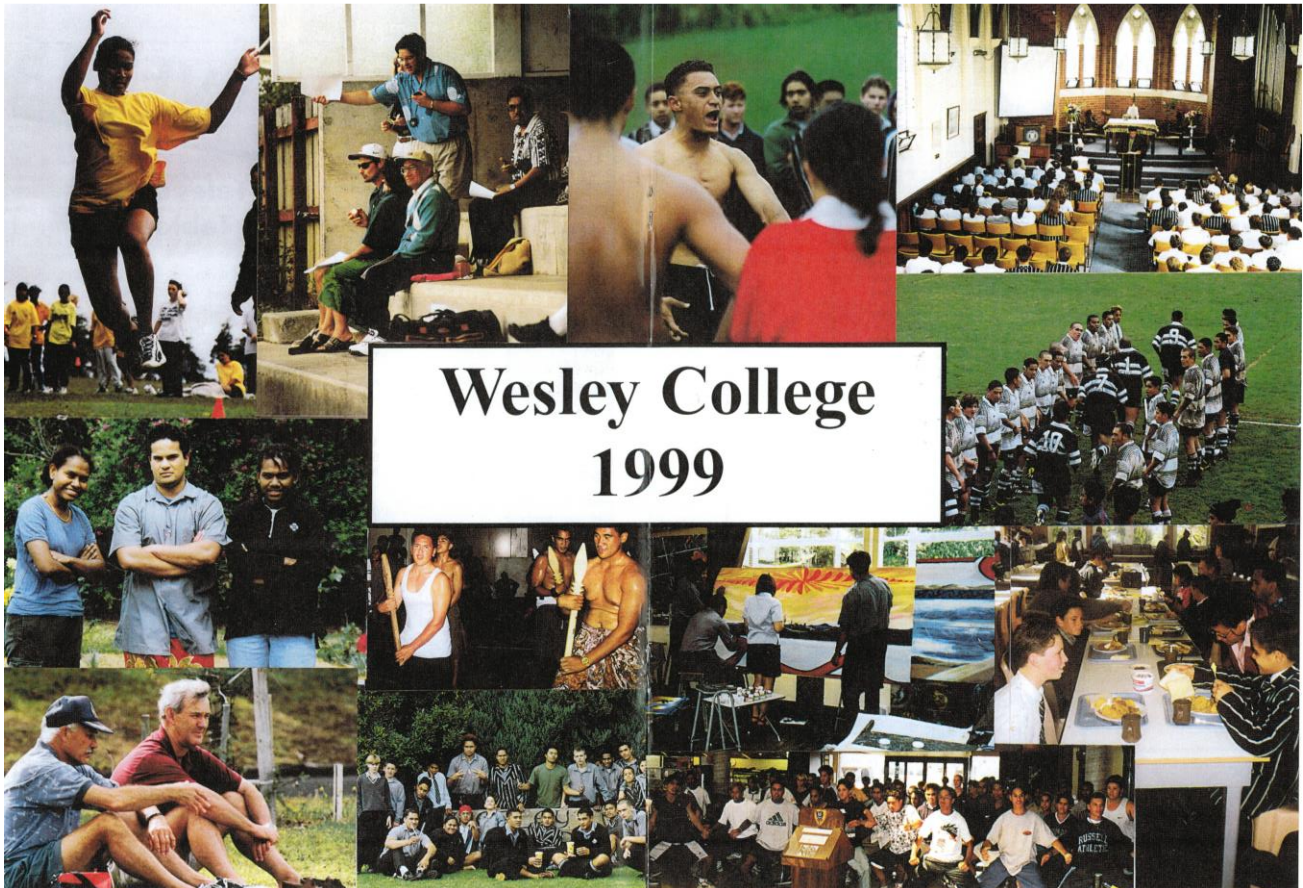
New staff appointments included Mrs. Jo Sanson (English), Mr. J Keane (PE), former Head Girl, Mrs. M Johansson (English), Mrs. Samusamuvodre (Maori and Social Studies), and believed to be a first in New Zealand we now have a Development Officer, Mr. M Tod, who was previously a Police Youth Aid Officer.

Former Senior Prefect, Rev. Tema, also had his temporary role as College Chaplain confirmed as a permanent position.

Our temporary staff comprised of GAP students Patrick Stone, William Page, Rhys Beynon and Hefin Evans who provided prep supervision for the boys’ hostel.



The College roll decreased ever so slightly from last year with 402 enrolled, including 64 international students and 47 girls. A waiting list for the junior dorms that stemmed the year however, and the arrival of Karla Maria Stalling Portillo from Guatemala - the first ever female AFS student to grace the College - were counted as positives. In addition, our imports from Woodhouse Grove in England Michael Allewell and Kris Claxton were well received, along with the anticipation of Wesley boys Casey Laulala and Hapafila Liu who will go there in Term 4, whilst Rikki Mc Mahon is off to the Isle of Man.



Staff decided to elect a larger number of prefects in 1999 with Head Prefect Nick Kairua selected to lead the 30 strong team and Head Girl A Tu'ionetoa, plus Head Boys Sione Kepu and Braden Te Ao were in support. This may have been in response to the record number of boarders and the Day Students Facility being in full swing.

The College was pleased to report that 20 candidates from last year's senior student body gained University Entrance in 1999, including two A bursaries and, ten B bursaries. Other academic achievements ranged from national to international efforts, beginning with the introduction of the Scripture Union Exams (Life and Faith) in which 13 Wesley students passed and Nina Bulina was named 3rd in NZ for her mark of 88%.

Our two teams entered into the NZSE Stockmarket Challenge placed 1st and 2nd overall, which afforded the winning group a generous option to be gifted shares, or an equivalent contribution made towards their tertiary fees. In the AMP Australian Economics Competition Futua Singrok, Hosea James, Lachlan Bruce and Gread Tiitii were placed in the top 10% of several hundred competitors and in the Australian Schools Science Competition offered by the University of NSW, 12 students received Achievement Certificates and another 3, Credit Certificates for their hard work.

Local sports competitions hosted College teams in a variety of codes including basketball, cricket, hockey, netball, rugby, soccer, touch rugby, tennis, swimming, and volleyball. The newly formed Girls' outrigging squad [from last year] added a Boys' team to their ranks, and senior students entered the worlds of wrestling and body building for the first time.



From a team perspective the College weren't able to achieve the same volume of sporting success stories as their predecessors this year, still those victories we did manage were no less deserved. Both the Wesley 1st XV and 2nd XV won their section in the Lenco Sports Super Eight Rugby Competition, the Wesley Under 14 and Under 15 Rugby Teams also won their sections, and the 1st soccer XI received the John Adshhead Trophy for winning their competition. Individual accolades went to an outstanding number of College athletes including those who embarked on entirely new pursuits, not offered here before. Michael Konga is a great example with his 2nd placing at the NZ Body Building Championships which he then improved on at the Asia Pacific Body Building Championships by taking out 1st place. Matthew Roxburgh is another who went from strength to strength winning the 83kg class of the Senior Boys section in the Auckland Secondary Schools Wrestling Championships, this was followed by a Silver Medal in the Senior Division of the NA Secondary Schools Wrestling Championships, a 2nd in the Senior Division and a 1st in the Junior Division of the Oceania Games, only to be topped off by a 3rd in the Senior Division at the Asia/Oceania Games. Several other students also excelled in wrestling with Tex Waddell and Jason Nelson both winning their sections of the Auckland Intermediate Schools Wrestling competition; whilst Kurt Jacobs won a Gold medal and Jnr Talatou a Silver Medal in the Junior Division of the Jnr Division of the NZ Secondary Schools Wrestling Championships, as well as their teammates Tevita Sisifa and Nicholas Clarke taking home medals.

In other areas we celebrated Tevita Waqasokolala and Beau Dench being selected for the Counties Under 17 Cricket Team; Teresa Leota was named in the Counties Manukau Under 19 Representative Netball Team and their Under 20 Basketball Team; with Billie Wallbridge-Paea competing at the North Island Secondary Schools Athletics Championships. Of course our rugby accomplishments stacked up again with Sione Kepu's unprecedented list of achievements leading the way – he was selected for the Chiefs Under 21 Rugby Squad, the NZ Schools Rugby Team to tour Samoa, the Nike Youth Rugby Team to tour British Columbia, France and Scotland, the Northern Region Schools A Team (alongside Mark Price), and he was named as a finalist for the NZ Sport Monthly Jnr Sportsman of the Year. Mark Price was also selected for the NZ Schools Rugby Team to play Scotland Schools in Wales, Noa Soqeta was invited to play with the NZ National Rugby 7s Team and Gread Tiiti joined the Northern Region Schools Rugby B Team.

In the spirit of Wesley students participated in a wide range of extra-curricular activities throughout the course of the year which the College believes contributes to the strong sense of family and self-identity nurtured in all who attend here. In Term One this was demonstrated in the choice to enter a consolidated Polynesian Group into the Maori and Pacific Islands Secondary Schools Festival again and their efforts in the non-competitive sections of the Maori, Samoan and Tongan stages were rewarded with the trophy for Best Dressed and Best Behaved School. We had a group of Fijian students invited to greet World Leaders at the International APEC Conference held in Auckland, including the Presidents of China, South Korea and the United States of America; in mid-October a group of students participated in the opening ceremony of the America's Cup; our seniors lit up the Sky City Convention Centre with their Fire and Ice themed School Ball and the Fourth Form thoroughly enjoyed their experiences at Camp Turangi. Chapel continued to be an important part of College life, with the Students' Fellowship group and weekend services all well attended.

Last but not least we acknowledge those four Te Paea girls who were accepted for AFS exchanges in 2000 and another who will participate in GAP – these are firsts for the College – not to mention the ongoing generosity of the Friends of Wesley who raised funds to donate uniforms to four of our sports teams and books for the library.

Out of an original 100 schools only 14 carried the task through to completion so this showed considerable dedication and skill from all members of our team.

In sport many excellent achievements were obtained:

Rugby:

The Boys' team placed fifth in the Auckland Competition.

Athletics:

Tomasi Soqeta and Noa Lomu were selected for the Counties Manukau Athletics team to participate in the North Island Championships. Tomasi for Senior Shot Put and Javelin; and Noa for Intermediate Shot and Discus. Tomasi gained 1st place and qualified for the Nationals.

Netball:

Lawn Bowls:

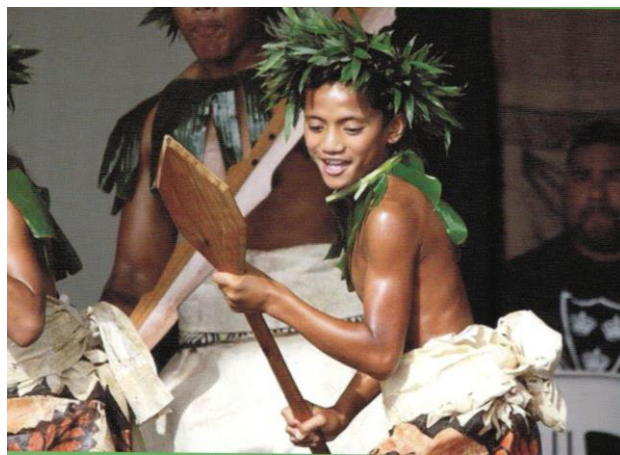
Ben Thompson won the Boys' singles and two Papua New Guinea Students, Yokond Goiye and Hosea James won the Pairs tournament.

Grateful thanks is due to the Trust Board for enabling this progress to be made.



Plans for New Dormitories are being drawn up and renovations of both Denton and Harding Halls are being planned for next year.

Whare Wananga:

On Sunday 13 February the new whare was opened. The ribbon was cut by Alexis Wihongi and Anthony Patolo with Rev. David Bush and Ms Nicola Grundy presiding as the President and Vice President of Te Haahi Weteriana o Aotearoa (Methodist Church of New Zealand) respectively.

The two Boards of the school have been particularly supportive and tribute is paid to the former chairman of the Board of Governors Mr. Eric Beavis and to the new Chairman, Mr. Eric Laurenson. Rev. John Murray continues as Chairman of the Trust Board. Generous funding from the Trust Board has enabled the building programme and also the enhancement of funding assistance for students.

Old Students weekend.. the second Sunday in October... Jack Coutts, who was enrolled in 1926 attended and with others was able to enjoy viewing the new facilities. The sports results favoured the existing students in both rugby and netball. The Friends of Wesley continues under Doris and Owen Reeve's management and has given significant donations to the school this year: \$5000 for furnishings in the Whare Wananga, \$940 for new library books, \$440 for native trees, \$500 for netball, \$600 for Girls' Volleyball trip to nationals and \$180 for a blazer for our Japanese AFS student, Osamu Uehara. Monograms were also purchased for the wrestling team.

GAP Students this year were Gareth Jones from Wales and Oli Wills from England. Both enjoyed the cultural welcome and the mix of ethnicities within the school.

Participation in Chapel services has been higher this year and it has become a focus point for many students. Te Paea girls provided flower arrangements during the year and the Fellowship group became the RED team! R for RELATIONSHIP E for EVANGELISM and D for DISCIPLESHIP and made particular focus hardships facing Fijian and Solomon Island students. The group was ably led by Jimmy Obed and Timoly Sibisopere with essential contributions from Nelma, Yoon, Richard Nomisasa, Yokand, Hosea, Ma and Alena. Ariteti and Tonga assisted with choir and Daniel enabled effective communication through drama.

Boys' Hostel life was enhanced by the appointment of Syd Pitman as an assistant House Master because of the increased roll at this time. Some students were assigned to the senior games room and the Prefects' lounge for sleeping quarters. In Term1 Denton Hall students were involved in the GAIN programme to enhance their relationship and communication skills. Various weekend activities were introduced and were greatly appreciated by the boys.

The girls' Hostel, Te Paea Hall had a change of management as Matron Roxburgh took leave for an overseas trip. Matron O'Leary took over and was ably assisted by Matron Wasa and Matron Joy. Mrs. Cowley also stepped in to help when needed during the Winter term.

The Form 1 and 2 Camp this year was held on Kawau Island where activities such as rowing, sailing, kayaking, and bivouac building were enjoyed by all.

The 4th Form camp ventured out to Slipper Island off the Coromandel Peninsula. This turned out to be an adventure affected by the weather right from the start... the boat taking half the group to the island couldn't get back for the rest so they had to camp on the mainland at Tairua for the night. United the next day the group enjoyed the activities but highlights were the 'flying kiwi' and the Burma Trail in the dark.

Te Whare Turuwhenua

Te Whare Turuwhenua and his family first joined Wesley College in 1974, at the invitation of Hiwi Tauroa. The Turuwhenuas took up residence in a staff house where he and his wife quickly became our resident Whaea and Koro; Te Whare being our kaumatua, not by choice (he would deny this title) as he is not Tainui, but through his great mana.

Te Whare brought to us a hauora; a sense of well-being. He came with a very deep traditional living knowledge of tikanga and certainly gave a wairua to the College and the people of the College.

The respect Te Whare had could be felt by anyone who became a member of the Wesley College family. For many of us younger Maori and Polynesian members of the community, Te Whare personified the spirit of Maoritanga and encapsulated a major part of the waiora of our community. Te Whare had a great capacity to love the students. He and his wife, Claire, would help, cajole, uplift, give hope and return confidence to many a student in need. Te Whare was admired and loved.

Te Whare supported and led the College on its bicultural journey. The preparation of students at powhiri, at being proper tangata whenua for our manuhiri was always excellent. The entire school was empowered with performance haka, waiata tautoko and korero for our cultural exchanges. The impact that Te Whare has had on the school life is long lasting, and many of our present Wesley traditions can be attributed to the strength of Te Whare's leadership. Te Whare was untiring with his whaikorero at school functions. He would uphold and carry us on innumerable occasions and keep the school safely in his hands as he steered us through our obligations and directed us to the proper protocols of the Maori. He accompanied our culture and sports groups whenever and wherever he was needed as our speaker.

As our Maori cultural director, he would support our community through tragic tangi, festive events, the annual celebrations of the coronation of Te Ata i Rangikaahu with waka and outrigger paddling teams and performance groups at Turangawaewae.

Te Whare's discipline was impressive. Students would seek to follow, obey and respect him in awe as Polynesians do to a chief or leader. His word was light for many of us. When I arrived at Wesley College, he was revered.

2001

The X-Factor year for the College

The College Prefects for this year were Vaega Matamu, Michael Spence, Hikitia Tuoro and Tame Tupou as deputies — and Senior Prefect Thorndyke Law (first time in the College's history that a girl has been appointed to this position).

Some significant achievements of our students this year were:

Joseph Murray — was successful in securing a full scholarship place at the International Travel College .

In the 2001 Stockmarket Challenge run by the New Zealand Stock Exchange, Wesley College celebrated a double victory with the student and teachers' teams winning their sections. It is the third year in a row that the school has topped the nationwide Challenge, with our four student syndicates finishing in the top four places.

Rimoni Leota, competed in the National final of the New Zealand Lions Young Speechmaker" contest in Wellington having earlier been runner-up in the Auckland Districts competition; Duncan Bennett of Form Four gained a National award in the BrightSparks electronics competition Nathan Duckmanton participated in the Greater Auckland Secondary Schools Bowls championships where he won the title of Boys' Singles Champion. - Malina Opo, (Form 6) and Rimoni Leota (Form 7) were each awarded an Outward Bound Scholarship to attend Anikiwa; Akanisi Nabalarua was awarded High Distinction (Top 5% in Australasia) in the AMP (Form Six) Economics competition held under the auspices of the University of New South Wales. Tammy Potini was selected for the Counties Manukau NPC Women's rugby team as a Fullback / Winger to play Bay of Plenty - Stephen Donald and



Sitiveni Sivivatu took the field for the Counties Manukau Steelers. - Seven Wesley students were selected for the Northern Region B rugby representative team. Stephen Donald was selected for the New Zealand Secondary Schools team to tour Britain and France.

Tammy Potini was selected for the Northern Region Maori Women's rugby team (the only schoolgirl to be selected) - Tame Tupou was named in the tournament team at the Auckland Secondary Schools Volleyball championships. - The Wesley College Sevens team achieved the rare feat of successfully defending their National Sevens title in Rotorua.

Sitiveni Sivivatu, Tomasi Soqeta and Vince Fatu were each selected for the New Zealand Sevens side and Vince Fatu was selected as Player of the Tournament.

The College 1st XV had a particularly successful season, being undefeated in the first round of the local Under 21 rugby competition, winning the Lenco Cup competition and finally winning the National Top Four secondary schools rugby competition when they defeated Rotorua Boys' High School by 53-32 in the final at the North Harbour Stadium. Wesley College is the only school to have achieved the unique double of winning the National Top Four and Sevens competition in the same year, and thus match their previous achievement in 1993.

The Wesley girls' netball team came second in the Lenco Cup Netball tournament - The Wesley mixed touch rugby team came second in the Auckland competition. Two of the mixed team were selected for the North tournament team and they were Mesa Naitaunialo and Tammy Potini.

Wesley teams participated in the Auckland Secondary Schools Girls' Outrigger competition with the Wesley #1 team gaining 3rd place and the Wesley #2 team gaining 2nd place in the Plate competition. - Wesley College Badminton players claimed four titles at the Counties Manukau Badminton championships at Papakura. The Badminton Association praised the boys for their abilities both on and off the court. –

Five Wesley students were sponsored to spend a term at Woodhouse Grove School in Leeds were Siliva Ahio, Mavaega Iosefa, Desiree Vickers (first Wesley girl student to be sent overseas on this programme), Wade Trower and Paula Kaho.

Wesley College offered experiences to Tom Gough and Jonathan Sykes from Woodhouse Grove School and Oliver Fairhurst and Adam Nugent from King William's College on the Isle of Man.

In the Counties Manukau swimming championships, College records were set by Ashlee Maihi in both the 50m backstroke and 50m breaststroke and by Fenton Zainey in the 50m freestyle.

In the Counties Manukau secondary schools' athletics championships, Wesley students set three College records and one Counties Manukau secondary schools record. Viliame Veikoso was once again the top Wesley athlete with two wins (including a Counties Manukau secondary schools record) and two second placings while Tammy Potini gained two firsts and one second placing and Tomasi Soqeta won two events. Other students who gained first placings included Paul Tongatoutai, Siale Piutau, Nancy Chow and Sitiveni Sivivatu.

In the 2001 ASB Bank Auckland Secondary Schools Maori and Pacific Island Cultural Festival, Wesley entered teams in the Maori and Tongan competitive sections. The College Maori group gave a very polished performance while the Tongan group were quite outstanding and gained first place in the Me'etu'upaki, first place in the Mako, were judged the Best Boys' School Performance.

As a result the Wesley College Tongan group were asked to perform at the 2001 35th anniversary of the Coronation in the reign of Te Arikini Dame Te Atairangikaahu.

During the year plans were developed for the new dormitories for boys along the back drive.

This year we farewelled a number of staff including Mr. Paul Irving (HOD Intermediate Department); Mr. Gary Collins (HOD Science); Mrs. Jo Sanson; Ms Gail Townsend (HOD Science from Term 2); Rev. Bill Chessum and Mrs. Margaret Roxburgh (Te Paea Matron)

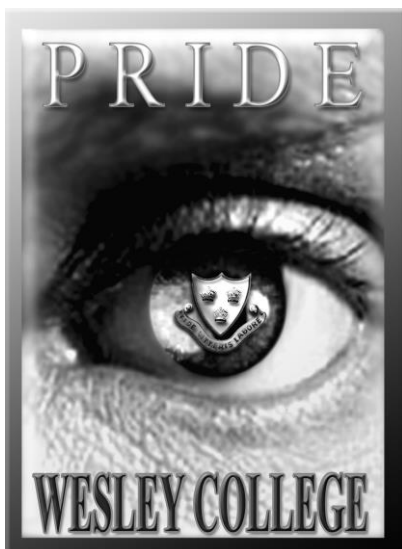
Mr. D. Ranger Snr was appointed this year to manage the Recreation Centre after hours.

Tutengaehe being recipients this year. James Starkey and Adam Weaving came to us from the UK school. Linda Melvin was selected to do a GAP year in Camberley, West Sussex, UK.

Under Mr. Palmer's guidance the 'Yellow Ribbon' campaign was launched this year with a willing group of students coming forward to be 'listening ears' to any in need. The signature caption of this group is 'It's OK to ask for Help'. A talent quest and sausage sizzle launched the programme.

This was also the first year for the College to put up a mooted team. Amana Tuibua, Greg Seumanutafa, and Semisi Pohiva made it into the semi-finals against Rotorua Boys at Hamilton District Court.

For the first time, the School Ball was held as a starlight cruise on the Waitemata Harbour. Two new hostels were officially opened in February this year by the President of the Methodist Church (Te Haahi Weteriana) Rev. Norman West. The designs of these new buildings provide accommodation for a couple and family to act as hostel parents and be readily available to the students. A strategic property committee was set up to look at future needs of the College as its roll grows and more girls are included. Lower Harding Hall has been identified as a future I.T. Centre... much to the pleasure of Mr. Smythe.

2004

The 160th year of Wesley College. Celebrations were held in October to bring together all those who hold Wesley precious. All who attended admitted they had been shaped and changed by their experience. Wesley has gone through a great deal of change and renewal having gained a glowing ERO report, a successful sports season and gained awards in polyfest. A new hostel was opened, a new music department established and the first ever Arts Festival was held.

New staff members this year were Mrs. Natalie Faitala (English), Ms Molly Wills and Mr. Will Payne (Music Department), Mrs. Amy Halai (relief teacher Intermediate Dept), Mrs. Miva Vunituraga (Junior Social Science and Reading), Mr. Steven White (Mathematics). Mr. Jean-Paul Eason was welcomed back to his old school to teach senior History. The hostel was fortunate to gain the services of Mr. Murray and Mrs. Cheryl Cudby as parents in one of the new dormitories. Next year Rev. Stephen Tema moves into a new role in the school as we look forward to the appointment of Rev. Sylvia Akauola-Tongotongo as Chaplain by the Methodist Church of New Zealand, designating Rev. Akauola-Tongotongo as Superintending Chaplain and Wesley College as a standalone Parish. Gary Raynel undertook a ten day voyage on the Spirit of New Zealand.

The year began with the news that last year's students performed well in NCEA. 64.2% gained Level 1 which compared most favourably with the national average of 52.8%. The Tongan group gained first place in the Taufakania while the year 12 Drama group gained first place in the South Auckland section of the Sheilah Wynn Shakespeare in Schools Festival. John Salanoa, Vau Atonio, Lauie Sila and Rees Foaeva made up the team.

The 1st XV chose an appropriate year to win the National Secondary Schools' Competition for the 5th time. An amazing achievement from a school with less than 300 senior male students.

2005

From its outset, 2005 was destined to be a challenging year. Wesley College had big shoes to fill. From a nationally undefeated 1st XV side to an NCEA achievement rate at an all-time high it seemed inevitable that at some point we would be disappointed.

It has been a year of many firsts. We have seen the resurrection of a Scout troop for the first time in decades; this year saw us field the first girls' 10-aside rugby team; we saw the first Wesley College Cook Island group perform at Polynesian Festival and for the first time we have had eight old students on the teaching staff.

Student exchanges with Kamehameha School in Hawaii continued and our Shakespeare company successfully took out the Best Individual Performer award and Best Student-directed scene. Lauie Sila and Billy Revell were selected out of 46 nationally to travel to the Globe Theatre in London as part of the New Zealand Young Shakespeare Company.

We have for the first time a female Chaplain; and for the first time the President of the Old Students' Association is



a woman.



In September, we staged the first musical production in eleven years (Joseph and His Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat) and for perhaps the first time a 1st XV member is also our school Dux (Vau Atonio).

We engaged in sporting and cultural exchanges with Hawaii, Fiji, Wellington, Christchurch and Tokoroa; we began the year with two AFS students and will end it with none; and we farewell the last of the students to have eaten in the old dining room.

This was also a year to reflect on the lives of Mr. Eteuati Maiava and Mr. John McDougall. The former being the first Pacific Island Teacher appointed to the school in 1980 and the latter having been Principal from 1974 to 1988.

MJ observed that human beings like to congregate at "boundary conditions" - on the cusp of change - and it is here that the Class of 2005 have had to forge their part of Wesley's history. On the boundary between success and failure, between old traditions and new values, between Past and Future. Within the student body of this year lies a fusion of all that is good and honourable about this fine school of ours. Within them the burdens and blessings of a Wesley College long past but with it, they have borne the impetus of Change. They have embraced it, faced the challenges it brought and (let's face it) it wouldn't have happened without them.

2006

In this year tribute was paid to Te Ariki Dame Te Atairangikaahu the Maori Queen and to King Taufa'ahau Tupou IV on their deaths this year. Each was a revered head of their respective peoples.

Turongo Paki wrote a tribute to his Nana and Richard Smythe recounted his involvement with the Tongan King. It is appropriate to mention at this time the departure from the College of John Cheeseman and his wife Carol who both gave amazing service to the Wesley community. 'Gentleman John' has been part of this place since the mid 1950's as a student, then as a teacher with a couple of breaks for training College and country service. Carol also worked as a Trust Board employee in the laundry.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the signing of the Integration Agreement which changed the governance structure of the school Wesley College became a State School with a 'Special Character' which set in place the challenge to continue to strive to meet those sacred obligations.

This was also the year when the last two students who had attended since year 7 were about to leave in year 13. Wiremu Kawiti and Gary Raynell.

Wiremu made a name for himself through his amazing artwork. He won an award from Konica/Minolta as the young Maori artist of the year and his pre-eminent work is displayed in tiled form on the wall of the dining room for all to appreciate and enjoy.

House parents became the norm for hostel supervision and management from this year forward. Changes inherent in this were not readily accepted by some who longed for the old days and the old ways. Change was and is however inevitable.

2007

This year as with any other year as had its share of triumphs, successes and losses - mostly triumphs and successes, depending on the way you look at them. Anyone new to the College this year would have experienced a whirlwind plethora of activities. The successful bid to host the 2008 ASB Auckland Secondary Schools' Maori and Pacific Island Festival (Polyfest as we know it) shone in our favour and soon a theme was decided on - one that would have our



imaginations flourish with possibilities for the upcoming event; ABC : Achievement, Belief, and Commitment.

With belief and commitment we can achieve anything.

The dare to Dream concept of the South Pacific Games and Wesley's broadened success through hard work in new school ventures such as the Rangatahi Business Competition, Bring it On and Wesley students' (past and present) Art Exhibition with CPAG (the Child Poverty Action Group) to name a few, have made dreams a reality for many.

Emphasis on the 'Special Character' of the College which is enshrined in the 1976 integration agreement has been a major focus this year. The Principal helped to interpret the 1970's context in 21st century society and gave the school a strong foundation on which to develop.

The drive for success through a vision shared by staff and students in the many varied areas are testament to the commitment and hard work that has preceded. We have mourned those whom we have lost since the publication of the last collegian.

Loved ones, family members and Wesleyans have been honoured and remembered with tributes for the contribution each one has made to the school. These and the many that have gone before us are our building blocks for what we hope and strive to achieve in the years ahead.

2008

The student body was kept busy with a vast number of extra-curricular activities including hosting the ASB Polyfest which was a mammoth job for such a small school but one that Wesley pulled off with little trouble. A group of 43 students and adults touring Samoa in April, the group visited both of our sister schools in Samoa - Wesley College in Upolu and Uesiliana in Savaii. Links between Uesiliana and Wesley College, Paerata, were strengthened when the Village Council of Satupaetea conferred the Matai title 'Leviatana' on the Principal.

The Netball team visited Hukarere Girls College for a sporting exchange. The performing arts departments of Music and Drama devised an excellent version of the "Aladdin" production. The College also came 2nd place in the "Bring it on" Hip Hop competition. The drama group retained the Sheilah Winn regional championship and attended the national finals in Wellington. Also notably, in August of this year Mr. and Mrs. Smythe attended the coronation of King George Tupou V.

The College was fortunate to have the exceptional leadership of Senior Prefect, Lindsay Kawiti, Head Boy, Michael Lea and Head Girl, Frances Kalisoqo

New staff appointments included Mr. Seremaia Tagicakibau in the Technology department and Rev. Bertie Meyer as the Careers Advisor.

Wesley also welcomed back old students Mr. Stephen Autagavaia who joined the Social Science and English Departments and Mr. Lauie Sila who was employed as a teacher aide for the Drama and Music Departments. This year's GAP Students were Gesche Knoop and Sven Ludert from Germany and Julian Smith from England.

2008 Academic results saw 61.3% of Year 11 students achieve Level 1 NCEA, 67.6% Level 2 and 50.7% Level 3 ranking the College with schools in decile 7 communities.

The College bid farewell to Mrs. Harata Samusamuvodre the HOD Maori who retired at the end of the school year.

2009



The Trust Board responded to a Review report which recommended strengthening the management structure of Wesley College hostels by appointing a Deputy Principal with responsibility for boarding. Rev. Stephen Tema was appointed to this position and this had the positive effect of creating clear links between boarders, hostel parents and the school.

The College was ably led by Senior Prefect Charles Piuatau; Head Boy Glen Fisi'iahi (terms 1 and 2) and then Tyrone Te Ruruku; and Head Girl, Janelle Pownceby, who was also Dux for 2009.

Mr. S. Livingstone joined the teaching staff as HOD Maori.

Wesley was the host school for the ASB Polyfest for a second year. It was a task that required the participation of all staff and students and displayed aptly how well Wesley can pull together as a community.

The school community was also asked to reflect on the importance of 'Our Special Character' in terms of what makes Wesley College different from other schools, this theme was the focus for the Chaplaincy team for the year.

A tour to Tonga, led by Mr. A. Palavi allowed Wesley College to participate and support Honourable Sitiveni Alaivahamama'o Tuku'aho in his inauguration to the Princely title – Prince Tungi. Senior drama students produced Aristophanes' The Frogs and continued their dominance in the Sheilah Winn Regional Shakespeare competition by being selected to represent South Auckland in the Wellington final. The Music Department facilitated the development of a brass band, a reggae band (Roots of Jah) and a Choir all which performed for the school on a regular basis.

Senior Prefect Charles Piuatau was selected for the New Zealand Secondary Schools Rugby team. Glen Fisiiahi and Timote Navabale were also selected for the New Zealand Secondary Schools Sevens Rugby side.

This year's GAP Students were Stephanie Post and Lukas from Germany and Gruffudd Sion Jones from Wales.

2010

The Special Character statement was revised from the original 1976 document to include a more up to date and contemporary view of Methodist Church of New Zealand. This was approved by the Minister of Education in May.

The College was led by Senior Prefect Karl Tuinukuafe; Head Boy Antonio Lavemai; Head Girl Lehai Lopeti; and Deputy Head Girl Sonia Pope.

New teaching staff included Mr. Vunidilo, Miss. Taylor and Mrs. Autagavaia who were employed in long term relief roles. This year's GAP Students were Jonas Koing and Florian Lamp both from Germany.

The College bid many fond farewells across the College, two of our teaching staff Matua Sonny Livingstone HOD Maori (who was unable to continue teaching due to poor health) and Mr. Penisimani Tapueluelu HOD Music. Mr. M. Tod, the Sports' Manager also moved on part way through the year. Mr. and Mrs. Reeve who have an association with the school that spans many years retired from running the tuck shop and the associated charity "Friends of Wesley" which was formed in 1977. This group has funded resources and activities for the school community to the tune of \$106,000 over the years. Rev. John Murray stepped down from the Wesley College Trust Board after 15 years' service and Mr. Roger Biddle who served in the capacity of Deputy Principal from 1996 also retired.



2011

The College leaders were William Poesse, Senior Prefect; Epelehame Faiva, Head Boy; and Stacey Cope, Head Girl.

The school was excited to witness 10 Wesley old-boys in different teams for the Rugby World Cup which was hosted by New Zealand. Sekope Kepu visited the school with the Australian Rugby world Cup team. The drama department joined with the combined Papakura churches to recreate the Easter story for 2000 Primary schools children in the Easter Alive Project. In addition, the drama department also hosted the Sheilah Winn South Auckland inter-school Shakespeare festival and won the regional final for the sixth year running.

The 1st XV lost the Counties-Manukau Secondary Schools Competition for the first time in some 17 plus years but they also progressed through the Chiefs Qualifiers to the National Top 4 Secondary Rugby Finals for the first time since 2005. Unfortunately, Kelston Boys High School won the final game by 24-14 leaving Wesley in 2nd place.

New staff to the school included Mr. Michael Cox as HOD Music, Whaea Hana Wijohn as HOD Maori and Michelle Haare in the Guidance Teacher role. This year's GAP Students were Marcus Fetzer and Simon Junker from Germany.



Mrs. Michelle Johansson left her position as HOD English and Drama to pursue study for a doctorate degree in creative arts. Teaching staff Mr. George Kiwara and Mr. Kali Vunidilo also moved on. Jessie Wakeling went off to the UK as a GAP student to assist at a student camp.

2012

The College was led by Senior Prefect Melino Samate; Head Boy Fereti Neemai; and Head Girl Nola Naera. The Dux award was won by our AFS international exchange student from Korea, Joshua Chong.

Students continued to enjoy a wide range of co-curricular activities, the Year 13 leadership camp was held at Camp Adair in Hunua. A group of nine students accompanied by teachers and parents toured Samoa.

A Wesley senior drama group led by former teacher Michelle Johansson participated in the Methodist church's 10 year project "Let the Children Live" through performing a drama about youth issues to the Methodist Conference in Wellington. The College entered a Niuean group in the ASB Polyfest for the first time. The Music department established a Chamber Choir for both adults and students in the Wesley community. A number of students attended spoken word poetry workshops and had their work exhibited at the Auckland Museum.

The girls Netball attended the North Island Championship during tournament week and finished mid-table. Rugby league was introduced as a sport when the Counties Manukau League organisation approached the school with the concept of running a league competition based at Wesley College.

The 1st XV took a 10 day rugby tour of Japan where they were hosted by Ryutsu Keizai University (RKU). Three of the 1st XV (Tau Koloamatangi, Luteru Laulala and Seluini Molia) were selected for the NZ Secondary Schools Camp

This year's GAP Students were Jan-Henrik Horn and Jakob Fischer both from Germany.

We bid farewell to Matron Joy Johnstone who has served in the College dispensary for 32 years. Matron Joy joined her husband Ray in retirement. Matron Joy regularly attended school camps and trips and will be missed immensely not only for her outstanding organisation of the dispensary but also for the care she showed for all members of the Wesley College community.

2013

The College was led by Senior Prefect Daniel Sinclair; Head Boy John Tutuila; and Head Girl Ilaise Sekona.

There were many sporting successes with 7 of our sporting teams (including Rugby, Rugby League, Basketball and Touch Rugby) earning Counties Manukau Championship titles. Jack Neal Pratt and Jovarn Broughton represented Wesley at the Swimming Nationals, this was the first time Wesley has had swimmers at this level. In Women's Rugby Foekina Veainu was named in the Black Ferns training squad and Malia Palusa was named in the NZ Schools training squad. Kieran Withers represented NZ in Papua New Guinea as an official FIFA referee.

Bayley Johansson won the Cape Catley Poetry Prize and was also the Dux for 2013.

New to the teaching staff were Mr. Hugh Laurenson in the English and Social Sciences Department and Mrs. Ana Tangi who taught across the Junior School. The hostel welcomed new staff Paul So'oula and Tony Alatini. This year's GAP Students were Simon Hoeffler and Fabian Hamm both from Germany.

Mr. Amanaki Palavi left his position as the HOD Agriculture to spend time with his wife Hera who has been ill. Ms. Whetuu Nathan was also bid farewell in term 4 for a year's leave to take up a position with the policy division at the Ministry of Education.

2014

Two new members of the teaching staff were welcomed this year; Ms. Lavinia Manoa to the English Department and Mr. Avinesh Prakash as HOD Agriculture. The College leaders are Senior Prefect, Sione Vahakolo; Head Boy, Robbie Tutuila; and Head Girl, Leota Inoke.

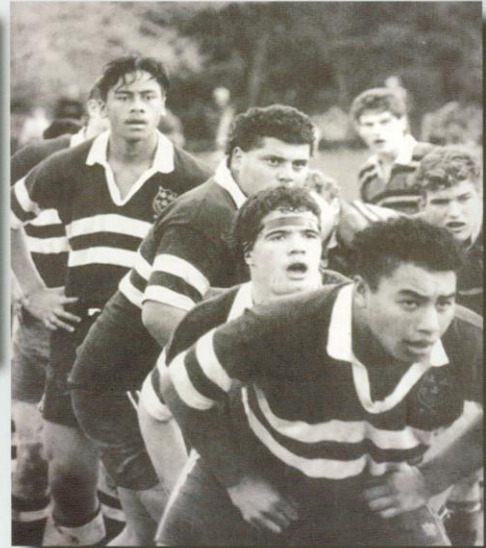
The College has suffered a number of losses this year and none was more keenly felt than the death of Mrs. Hera Dixon (the wife of Mr. Amanaki Palavi) who was still living at her home on site at Wesley at the time of her passing in February. Mr. Bill Leach also lost his daughter to cancer.

Wesley College entered a group into the Secondary School Barbershop competition for the first time and qualified to attend the national final in Wellington, where they were placed 5th out of the 8 schools participating.

A TRIBUTE TO JONAH LOMU



Jonah arrived at Wesley in 1989 as a year 9 student rather reluctant to leave his suburban life in Mangere. He quickly adapted to life at the College. After school; if he didn't wish to remain bored; he had the option to train at either Rugby or Rugby. Occasionally, athletics and swimming would be on the agenda. As his dormitory supervisor he asked me if he could bring training equipment and place it alongside his bed in the adjacent vacant cubicle. This he duly did. He set himself a very rigorous training programme which he adhered to every day. Jonah was, at times, a loner and would not permit himself to be swayed from his set goals to self-train.

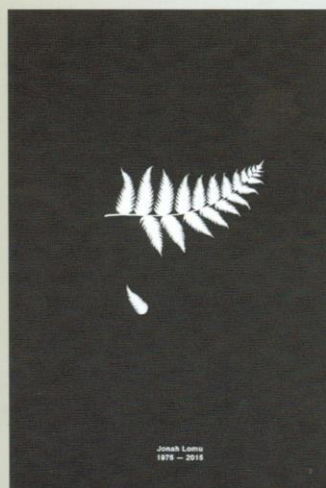
Mr. Chris Grinter; the DP and 1st XV coach at the time saw promise in Jonah and promoted him to this team whilst still a junior. This put Jonah in a difficult situation. He was seen as an upstart by the seniors and was now no longer mixing with his junior peers. Jonah struggled with this social schism; as indeed did the rest of the College. However, Mr. Grinter saw Jonah's exceptional prowess as an athlete and a rugby player and managed Jonah in all aspects with expert precision.



Jonah was our top athlete, holding many records for many years; many of which still stand. He became our local Counties superstar. Having said this; off the field we saw a very different person. Where other seniors failed to show heart to some of our smaller juniors; Jonah was always there to put his enormous arm around distressed Juniors and to offer comfort. He befriended many juniors and all felt they could, and did, approach him. He was always kind; never shouted and had words to turn away wrath. This we could all see in Jonah's later compassion as an adult with his many charities.

Jonah lived the example to be caring, compassionate yet steadfast and resolute to achieve his goals. As he always used to say, "If you want something bad enough, only you can stop it". Rest in peace Jonah and may God comfort your family and also a few of us now long in the tooth teachers who had the honour to share a part of your life.

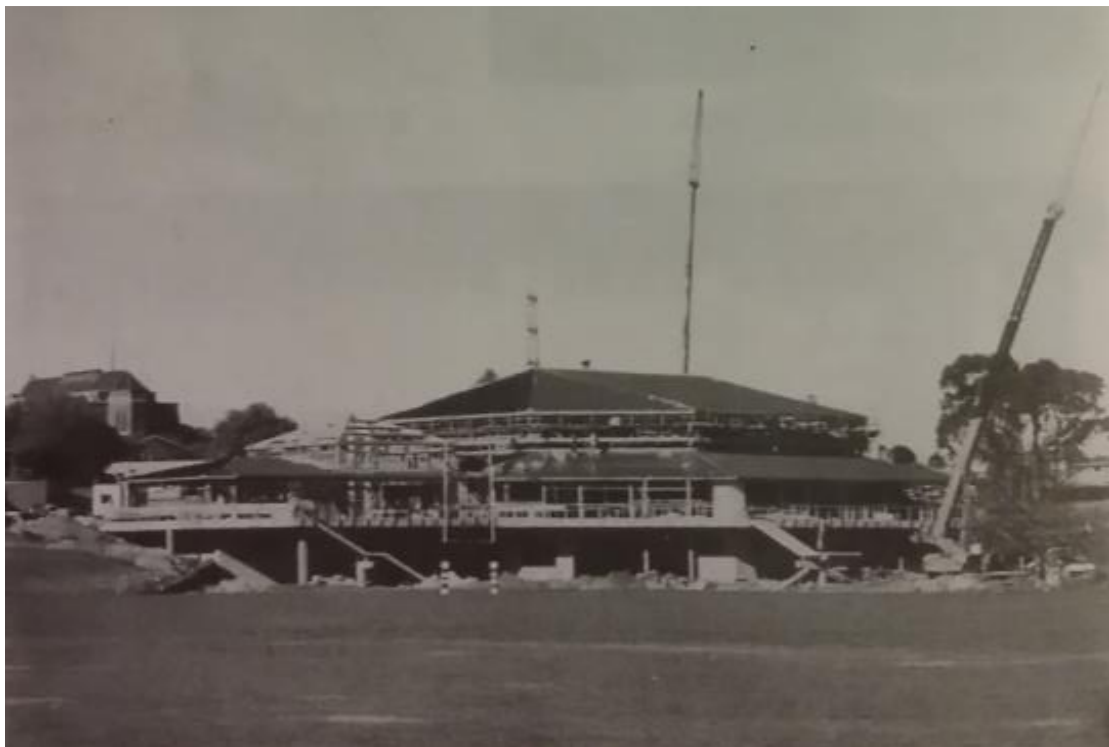

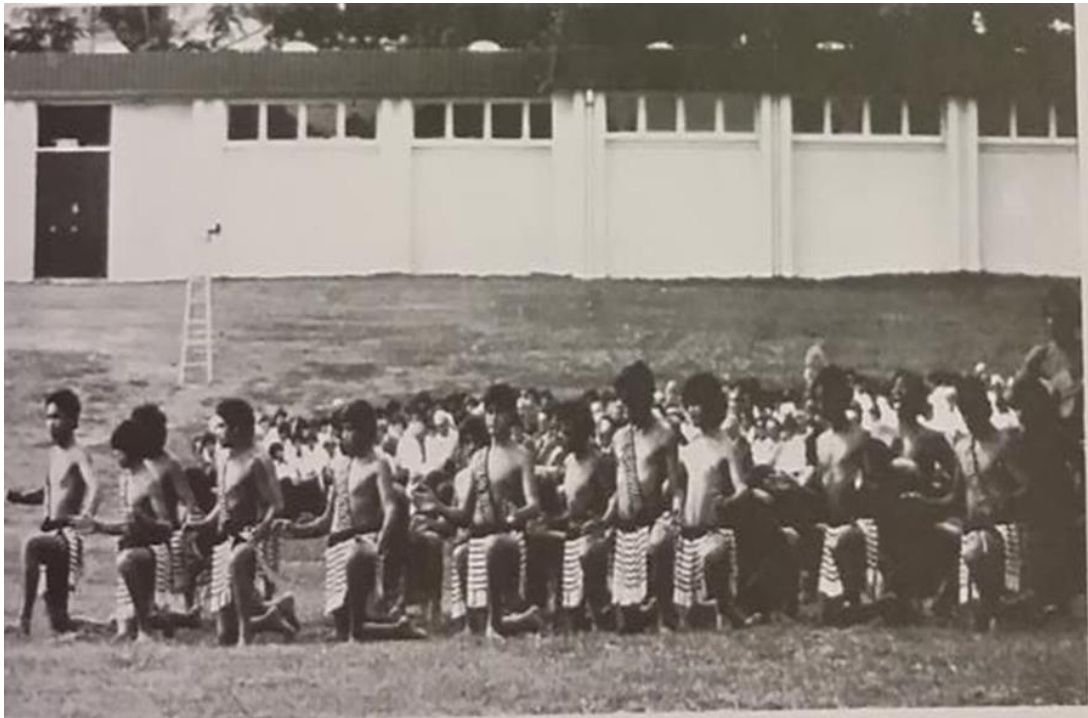
