ACTING PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia ora koutou Wesley Whānau

As in the previous three years, our return to school sees more disruption to learning thanks to some very unpredictable weather events. Clearly, there is no such thing as normal anymore but what is important for all of us is to adapt and keep moving forward with high aspirations for the college.

The year started with the outcomes of the Royal Commission inquiry firmly in our minds and we have made many changes to ensure a safe learning space for all students. We have made significant progress over the past 5 years, however it is important to keep the shifts towards a positive culture progressing.

We've invested in leadership with two exciting appointments in senior leadership overseeing the hostel and wellbeing. As a result, our hostels have much greater supervision overnight and students are enjoying having roaming staff to talk with. In school, the message to students is that we all need to look after each other's wellbeing and it is everyone's responsibility to do so. Any students feeling like theirs or another student's wellbeing is affected, they should use the stymie reporting system.

It is great to see new and exciting programmes getting underway. For example we continue with academic mentoring where every student has a learning coach who they will see twice a week. The learning coach is a significant adult with whom they can set goals and help navigate their school experience so they leave school with the qualifications they need and are prepared for a life beyond Wesley.

We have some new courses such as hospitality, classics and ESOL. These will broaden the various avenues of study our students can take. In terms of student leadership, we have trained a group of Year 13 students in the skill of coaching other students and have become our kaiwhakaako group.

This will give them the tools to be able to hold productive, developmental conversations and help support the personal growth of our younger students. In addition, students have the opportunity to join one of our other Tauira Rangatahi groups; the whare Karakia (chapel) group; the Kairangi (Hauora) group and the Te Arataki (extra-curricula) group.

Congratulations to our prefect team who were announced at the service of beginnings. We recognise the whole group as an outstanding group of young men and women who are already magnificent role models and leaders. We look forward to the positive influence they will have on the rest of our students.

Most learning can be accessed online and it is important that students come to school with their own chromebook, fully charged.

BYOD [Bring Your Own Device]



We would like all students to have access to a e-learning device. It is expected that all Year 9, 10 and 11 students at Wesley College to bring their own learning device to school every day. Here's some information to help families start planning:

All students will have access to our robust, monitored and secure Wi-Fi network to support and enhance their learning. Students will be able to demonstrate their learning, access course material and resources through google applications also known as the G-suite. Students are also able to access their timetable, results and other details through our student portal.

Students use cloud storage within the Google Apps environment as well as Dropbox and OneDrive to store their documents.

Parents with a "Parent Portal" that allows parents to become more involved with their child's progress at school. By going online, parents are able to view student timetables, up to date attendance data, course details and student results. Any device can be used for BYOD, however we insist that it is not of a tablet type and has a screen of no less than 11 inches.

New students are able to purchase the preferred subsidised device which is an ACER Chromebook.
