PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Its been a very settled and busy term to date.

Student behaviour and engagement has been excellent. Our focus is very much on academic endeavour and also enjoying winter sports and the activities outside of the classroom that make school life enjoyable and memorable.

This year we have 6 rugby teams (5 boys, 1 girls), 5 netball teams (junior Girls, Senior a girl, Prem Girls, 2 mixed teams) and 3 Basketball teams. This is a real credit to our staff and volunteers that we continue with these sorts of high numbers representing the school. Alongside of this is the school band, spoken word competitions, orienteering and other opportunities for representation such as 'mooting' competitions.

We would like to thank all our whanau for coming together for kai over this term at our evening get togethers. Over 100 parents/care givers came in to enjoy the company of our school community and Chef Henrik and his team's terrific feasts. We look forward to running these dinners again next term.

Attendance v Achievement

The impact of the ongoing teacher's strike is undoubtedly affecting students, not just in terms of time missed for instruction, but general engagement with school life. As an example, it is calculated Year 12 will have missed close to 20 days by the end of Term 2, 6 days being the weather events in Term 1, followed by regular teacher strikes each week. That's 4 weeks of learning.

This is why now more than ever every hour at school is vital.

The following data was recently presented to students at Chapel. It highlights the importance of being at school, every day. The message is clear, the students with the most credits to their name at each NCEA Level, also have very high attendance rates. At the other end, students with lower numbers of credits tend to be here at school less. Put simply, students at Wesley have every likelihood of achieving if they are at school every day.

If we used the same measure in the junior school for reading plus numbers, asttle results and other forms of assessment, we would find the same patterns.

Principal continued:

The tables below highlight the importance of attendance.

The first columns show the students who have earned the highest number of credits at each NCEA level up to May 18th. The column beside that shows the students who have the least number of credits and their attendance. It is never too late for these students, but they need to make a real effort over the coming weeks.

DIGITAL SAFETY

Whilst the internet is a wonderful tool, I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and caregivers of the potential harm posed by digital communications, and social media in particular.

It has been brought to our attention that some students may be using a website called 'Discord' as a communication platform. Discord allows users to form smaller communities and can be public or private. We are concerned that many young people are choosing to share intimate images of themselves or others via Discord and other social media apps such as TikTok and Instagram.



It is important to remember that once digital content is shared, you no longer have control of that content. A picture or video shared with a friend can be copied and shared again and again. It can be found as part of your digital footprint for years to come, including by potential employers.

Furthermore, the Harmful Digital Communications Act 2015 makes it a criminal offence to share a digital communication that causes harm.

A person or organisation convicted of causing harm by posting a digital communication or posting an intimate visual recording could be imprisoned for up to 2 years or fined up to \$50,000. Young people aged 14-16 will be dealt with through the Youth Justice system.


