PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

It's been an excellent term as it continued to be the most uninterrupted since 2019. 'August Attendance Awareness Month' was very successful and lifted attendance from 83% to 88%. Ultimately, we would like to get this over 90%. The results of this have been very pleasing to date which aligns nicely with the drive on achievement.

Winter sports have wound up. U15 rugby, Development Rugby, Premier League and Premier Netball attended Winter Sports week tournaments.

The development rugby and League teams were runners up in their respective tournaments.

There has been a wide range of activities taking place including the annual House Speech competitions, Spoken Word, and external music competitions (Band and Individual). Tongan and Maaori Language weeks were recently huge celebrations for our students.

Achievement and Attendance

We are delighted with the achievement and attendance figures so far this term and appreciate the community-wide effort on maximising our students' on-site presence. The higher attendance rate and work completion will hopefully ensure success for many students.

However, these are only indicators, much work must be done. I know our teaching staff are giving their all, we need all our students to do the same.

• NCEA Level 1: Currently 86% of students on target to achieve Level 1

This means there are 10 students in Year 11 not on target. Check in with your child, are they someone not on target? If not on target, why not?

- NCEA Level 2: Currently 84% of students on target (10 students not on target)
- NCEA Level 3: Currently 88% of students on target (8 students not on target)

Attendance - Currently 88%, (up from 83% Term 1 and 2)

Target 95%. Again, do you know your child's attendance rate?

Our attendance drive cannot stop until we reach the target of 95% of students in school 90% of the time!

Student Led Conferences

Make sure you book a time to met your child's Learning Coach to discuss their progress and what needs to be done before NCEA and juniors exams.

Night School

The establishment of 'Night School' includes hiring 16 tutors who work largely with 'At Risk' students and small groups of Yr. 9 and 10 for now. The potential for the Night School model to be a game changer in terms of Academic Achievement is an exciting prospect and something that will be modified and refined as time goes on.

Personal Digital Devices

The school is currently investigating banning phones and personal digital devices. This has occurred across New Zealand at many schools already and we think it is timely to introduce this measure to Wesley College.

A personal digital device is any privately owned digital device such as a phone, ipad/screen, laptop, chromebook that falls outside of our own BYOD programme.

Wesley College wants to be an environment where students **do not** bring personal digital devices to school. These are not necessary to have during the day.

Consultation with the community is open and feedback will be considered.

Ultimately this will be driven by a Board Policy.

Holistic Safeguarding of the physical environment

There is a scoping process underway around the holistic safeguarding of the campus. This includes lighting, cameras, alarms and general security.

The outcome is aimed at making the site as safe and welcoming for all staff and students.

It includes the investigation of demolition of old buildings, creating new modern spaces for staff and students and renovation of dorms.

There are also plans to appoint a 'Safeguarding Officer' across the campus, who's role it will be to develop and implement all aspects of health and safety.

GATEWAY UPDATE - INCOMPARABLE PROGRAMME - WORK READY COURSE



18 students took part in the Incomparable Programme, Work Ready course over weeks 7 and 8.

The aim of the course is to help prepare the students for life after school through being immersed in work ready activities such as interviews, mastering forms, team work and developing organisational skills.

Students began with 3 days in the classroom learning and assessing knowledge. The second week saw students taking part in work experience at 3 sites.

One group went to placemakers in Manukau and worked alongside a team that made trusses for homes. This involved lots of practical maths activities such as measuring and trigonometry to get the angles right. Another group interested in healthcare visited Metilife care in Papakura looking after the elderly. Another group went to the offices of LM4 group getting experience at administrative jobs and experiencing office life. The students did amazingly well and we received great feedback from the employers.

The College will continue to offer the Incomparable Programme for students in 2024.

LIGGINS INSTITUTE - UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND

BYOD [Bring Your Own Device]



It is expected that all Year 9, 10 and 11 students at Wesley College to bring their own learning device to school every day.

Here's some information to help families start planning:

All students will have access to our robust, monitored and secure Wi-Fi

network to support and enhance their learning. Students will be able to demonstrate their learning, access course material and resources through google applications also known as the G-suite. Students are also able to

access their timetable, results and other details through our student portal. Students use cloud storage within the Google Apps environment as well as Dropbox and OneDrive to store their documents.

Parents with a "Parent Portal" that allows parents to become more involved with their child's progress at school. By going online, parents are able to view student timetables, up to date attendance data, course details and student results. Any device can be used for BYOD, however we insist that it is not of a tablet type and has a screen of no less than 11 inches.

New students are able to purchase the preferred subsidised device which is an ACER Chromebook. TO PURCHASE THE BUNDLE OUTRIGHT: \$325.00 incl GST.

This includes a Wesley College 50% subsidy.
