

A new public transport network for growing communities

We're improving public transport in this growing part of Auckland, with new train stations and bus services that make it easier to get around.

From Sunday 2 August, AT's Southern Line trains will serve Paerātā and Drury stations, connecting you to Auckland's rail network. You'll be able to travel by train to shops and services in Pukekohe and Papakura, Auckland Airport via Puhinui, Middlemore Hospital, the city centre and beyond.

Two new bus services will provide a convenient way to get to and from the new stations. The frequent **42** will run between Paerātā Rise and Paerātā Station, while the **384** will run between Ramarama and Drury Station.

We're also improving three existing services – the **376**, **394** and **395**.

The **42** and **384** bus services are funded by Auckland Council's Climate Action Transport Targeted Rate.

New train stations and bus services for Paerātā and Drury

New bus services

Two new bus services will give people in Paerātā Rise, Ramarama and Drury quick, convenient connections to the new train stations.

We've also installed new bus stops. Use the Journey Planner on our website or the AT Mobile app to find your nearest stop.

42 Paerātā Station – Paerātā Rise

Buses run in a loop from Paerātā Station

Monday – Friday 4:55am – 11:45pm	Every 15mins from 6am until 7pm Every 30mins at all other times
Weekends & public holidays 5am – 11:15pm	Every 15mins from 7am until 7pm Every 30mins at all other times

384 Ramarama – Drury Station

Buses from Ramarama will run

Monday – Friday 5:20am – 11:17pm	Every 15mins from 6:15am until 8:45am Every 30mins at all other times
Weekends & public holidays 5:50am – 11:02pm	Every 30mins

Buses from Drury Station will run

Monday – Friday 5:55am – 11:10pm	Every 15mins from 5pm until 7:12pm Every 30mins at all other times
Weekends & public holidays 5:58am – 11:10pm	Every 30mins

Changes for existing bus services

376 buses travelling between Auranga and Papakura Station will use new bus stops on Great South Road, outside Drury Station.

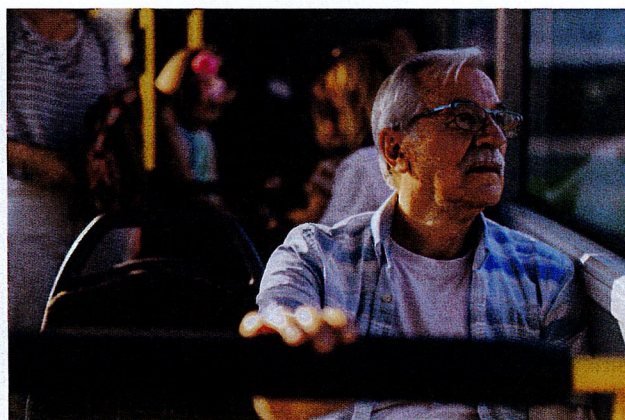
394 buses will run between Pukekohe and Paerātā stations every 30 minutes. 394 buses will no longer serve Paerātā Rise.

395 buses will connect Waiuku, Glenbrook and Paerātā Station at peak commuting times on weekdays. 395 buses will no longer serve Kingseat, Te Hihi or Karaka.

Train users won't pay extra to take a bus to Drury or Paerātā stations

Simply transfer within 30 minutes, tag on and off each service using the same card or device and complete your journey within four hours. For more information about bus and train fares, visit at.govt.nz/fares



New train stations

Paerātā and Drury stations will be served by Southern Line trains, from early morning until late evening, 7 days a week, with late night trains on Friday and Saturday nights.

- On weekdays, trains run every 10–20 minutes at peak times, every 20 minutes during the day, and every 30 minutes in the evening.*
- On weekends and public holidays, trains run every 20 minutes during the day and every 30 minutes in the evening.*

* Note, these frequencies are approximate.

Bus services will provide a quick and convenient way to get to and from the new stations. Each station also has 350 Park and Ride spaces, pick-up and drop-off areas, and bicycle and motorcycle parking. Vehicle access to Drury Station is from Waihoehoe Road, while access to Paerātā Station is from the new roundabout on Paerātā Road.

City Rail Link

When City Rail Link opens, the Southern Line will be replaced by the South City Line. South City Line trains will stop at the new Karanga-a-Hape and Te Waihorotiu stations, making it easier to access more of the city centre. There will be more trains at peak times and during the day. New to public transport?

It's easy to get started.

Plan your journey and check your fare

Use the Journey Planner on the AT website or the AT Mobile app. The app shows Live Departures so you can track your bus, train or ferry, and notifications keep you up to date with important information.

Ways to pay

You can use your AT HOP card, contactless debit or credit card, smartphone or smartwatch.

Tag on at the start of your trip and tag off at the end. Just hold your card or device against a reader. You'll find readers by the doors on buses, and at entrances and exits at train stations and ferry terminals.

Always tag on and off with the same card or device to pay the right fare.

Let's go!

Wave to the driver as the bus approaches your stop.

On most buses, recorded announcements tell you the next stop. When you hear your stop, press one of the 'STOP' buttons on the bus to let the driver know you want to get off.

Trains and ferries stop at every station or terminal automatically. Digital screens show which platform or pier to wait at for your train or ferry.

Discounts and fare cap

Your debit or credit card is the most convenient way to pay for occasional trips. If you use public transport more often, an AT HOP card can help you save with discounts and our 7-day fare cap.

Discounts

AT has a range of discounts you could be eligible for, including Child, Secondary, Tertiary, SuperGold, Accessible, and Community Connect concessions.

To get discounted fares, you need a registered AT HOP card with your concession added.

Free child fares

Children under 5 travel free at any time when with a paying customer.

Children aged 5 to 15 travel free on buses, trains and most ferries on weekends and public holidays if they have a Child concession on their AT HOP card.

7-day fare cap

When you use your AT HOP card on buses, trains and inner harbour ferries, you automatically qualify for our 7-day fare cap and won't pay more than \$50 in any 7-day period.
